ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

India is a land of distinctive villages and the future of India lies with rural development. The rural-urban distribution of population is 68.84% and 31.16% respectively (Census 2011). India is an agrarian country. Agriculture employed 50% of the Indian work force and contributed 17-18% to country's GDP as per the Economic Survey 2017-18. The economic contribution of agriculture to India's GDP is steadily declining with the country's broad-based economic growth. There were 6,40,867 villages in India as per 2011 Census and around 833.1 million people live in villages. As of 2018, there are 5,97,464 villages in India who depend directly or indirectly upon agriculture. Agriculture is demographically the broadest economic sector and plays a significant role in the overall socio-economic fabric of India. India ranks first globally with highest net cropped area followed by the US and China. India exported \$38 billion worth of agricultural products to more than 120 countries in 2013, making it the seventh largest agricultural exporter worldwide.

Sustainable inclusive growth of 'Gramin Bharat' has always remained priority of the Government of India. Many efforts have taken place in this regard but still much needs to be done. So far, many policies have been initiated and implemented with different approaches to rural development which in itself faces a plethora of challenges. A sea change can be seen in the village environment and needs of villagers since Independence. All text must be of double line spacing with one inch margin on all sides. Use 12 point Times New Roman Font with Harvard Style Referencing for papers in English. For papers in Hindi and Marathi use "Kruti Dev" 12 point font. Papers in PDF format will not be considered. Self Declaration form by author/authors is a must for the paper publication.
- 3) Last Date of sending full paper along with abstract of 200 words: September 7, 2019.
- Delegates are also requested to send the soft copies of their power point presentation (maximum 4) 10 slides) to ranjanatsahu@rediffmail.com
- The selection of papers will be done by a panel of experts and the authors will be informed in 5) advance about the same. Acceptance of paper implies the registration by all authors (main and coauthors). Only accepted papers will be published in the Conference Proceedings with ISBN number.
- Cash prizes of Rs. 5000/- and 3000/- respectively will be given to the two best papers in each 6) technical session. The ratings of the papers will be done by the Resource Person / Chairman of the technical session.
