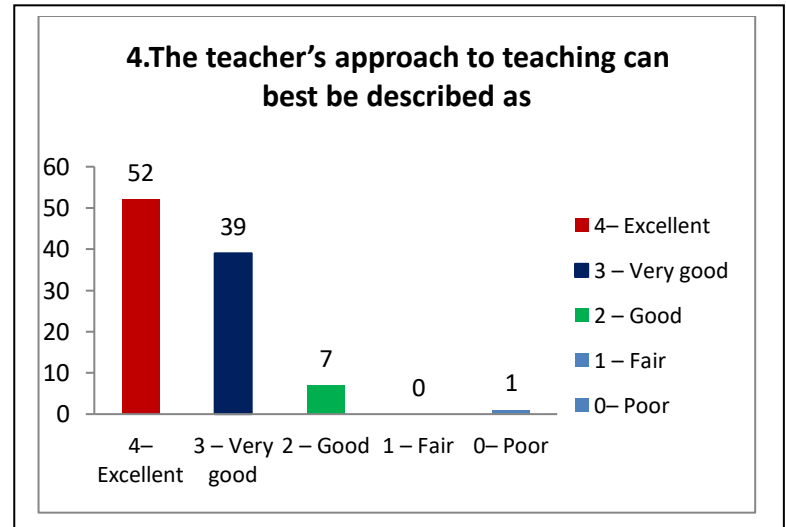
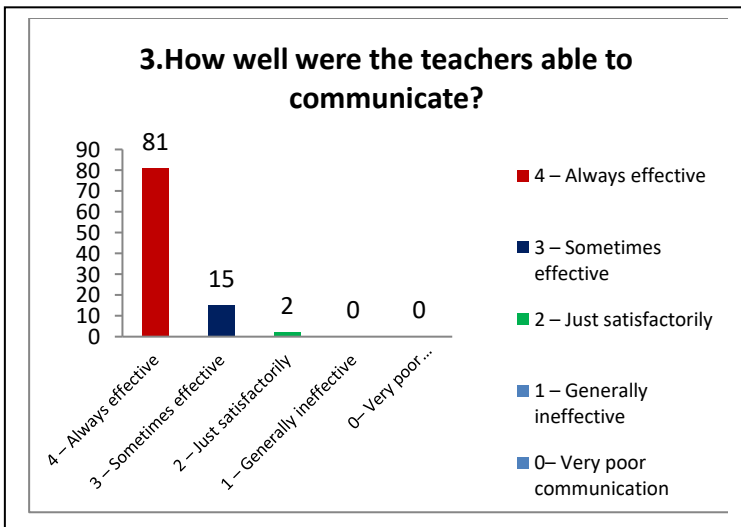
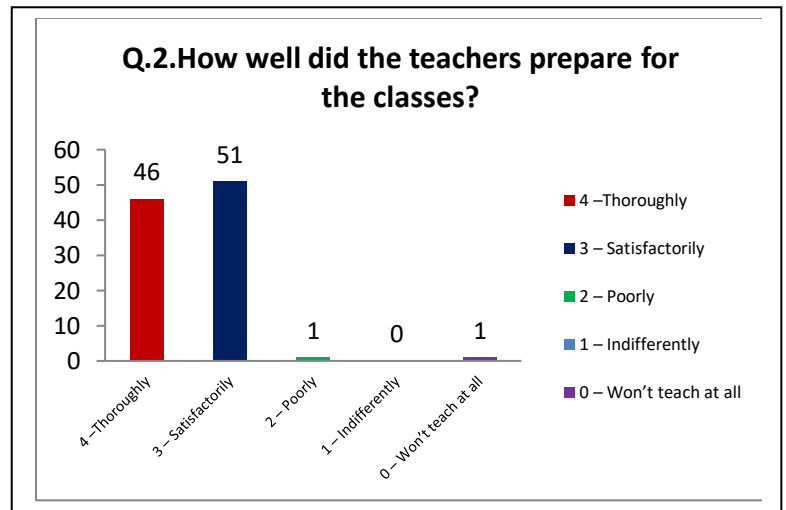
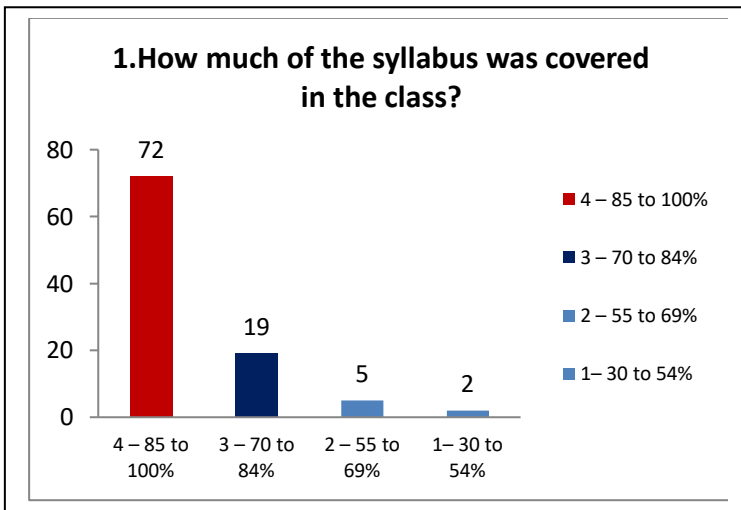


Report of Student Satisfaction Survey

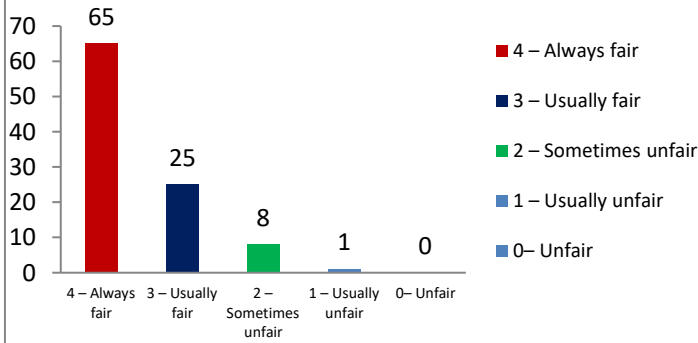

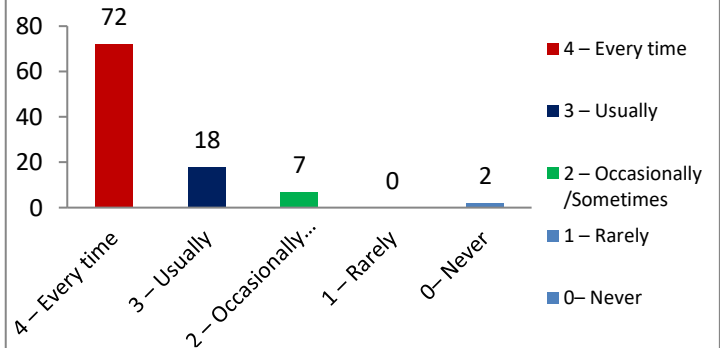
The analysis of question-wise responses for first 20 questions is represented in the column chart.



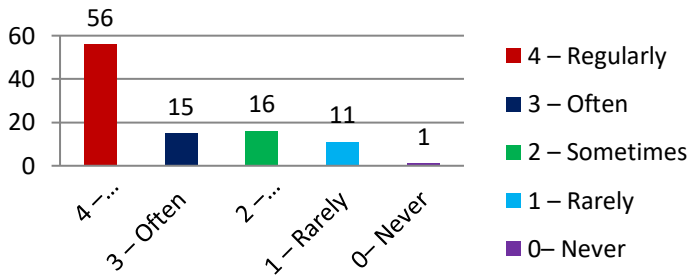
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.



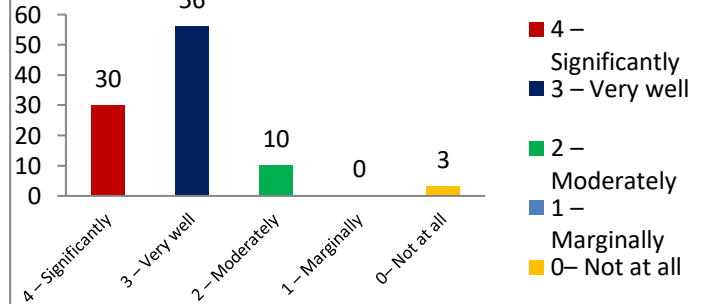
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?



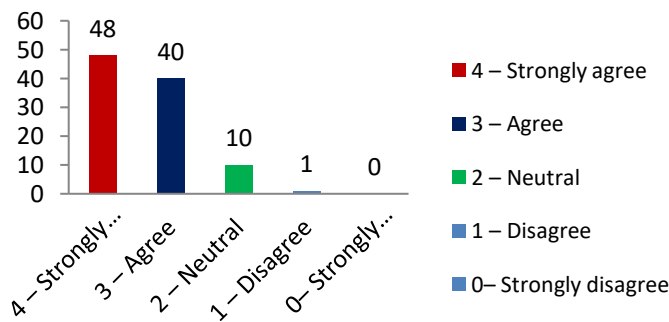
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.



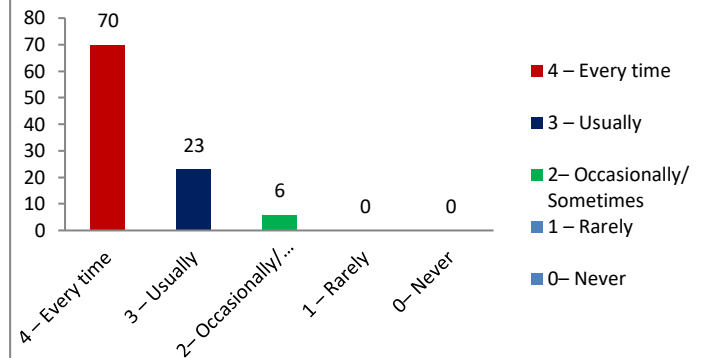
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.



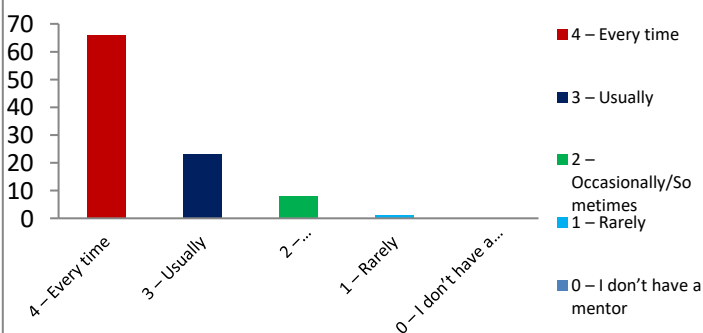
9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.



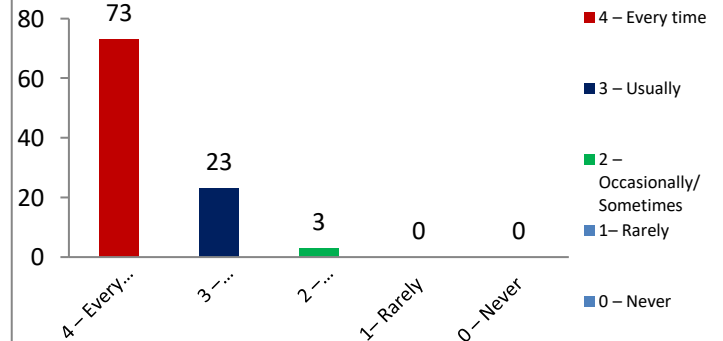
10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



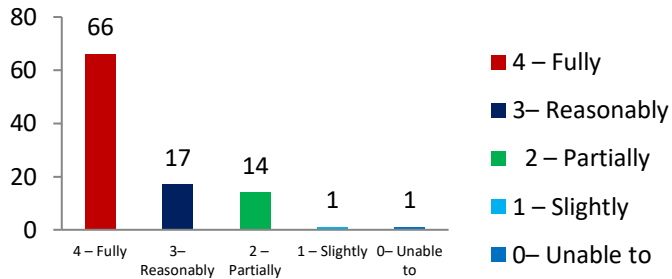
11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.



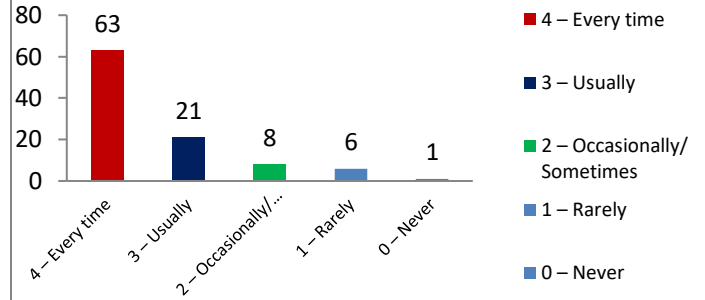
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.



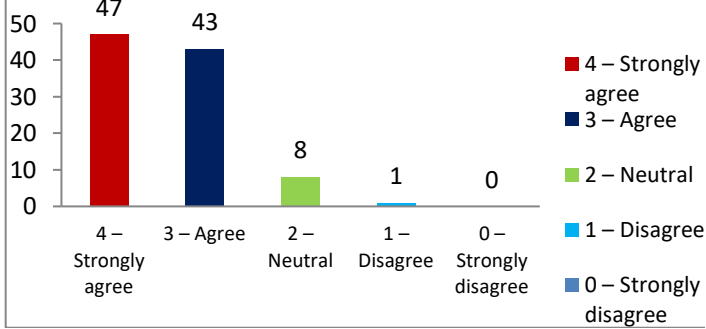
13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



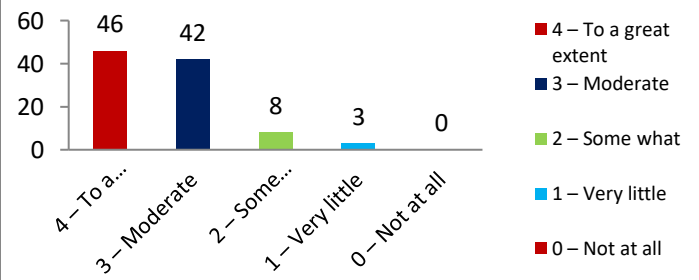
14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



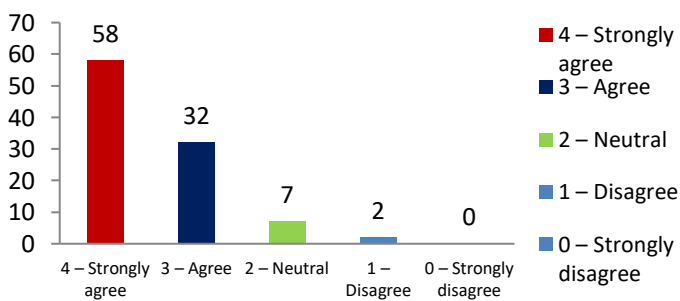
15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



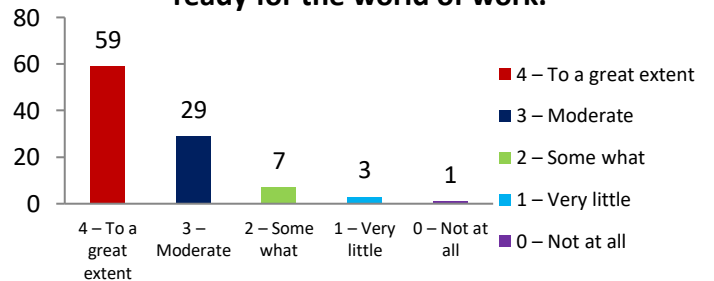
16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.



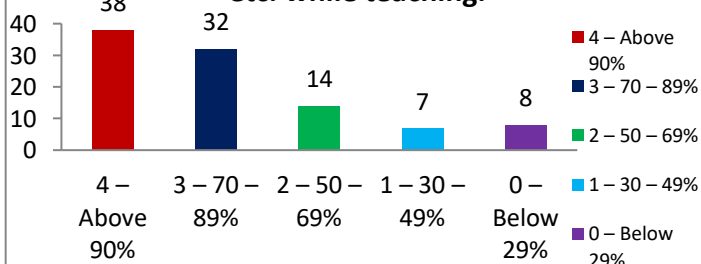
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities



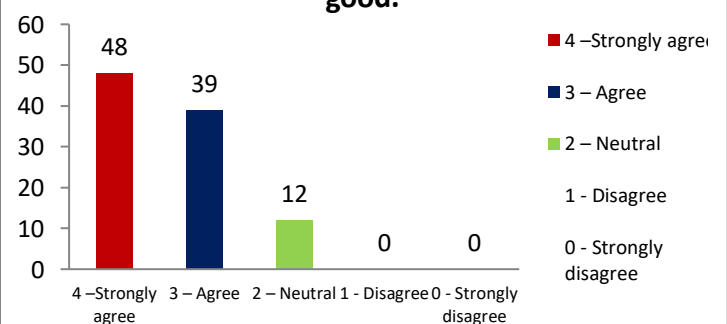
18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.

Summary of observations and suggestions (Received under Qu.no.21)

Observations of Students:

- Encouragement given by the college to participate in sports.

- Students have given good opinion about college initiatives for conducting many student-centric events and for encouraging them for entrepreneurship.
- One student from M.Com. stated that G. S. College is the place where dreams are constructed, visualized and life has taken shape with the help of institution which taught us to follow the dreams.

Suggestions:

- Some students have given opinion that college should conduct more doubt clearing sessions and more emphasis should be put on practical knowledge.
- More opportunities should be given for campus recruitment and field visits.
- Some students feel that some teachers indulge in favoritism for particular students instead of treating every student equally.
- Some counseling sessions of every specialization should be taken so that it becomes easy for students to understand practically about the field which they have chosen for their careers.
- Industrial Visits should be entertained for practical knowledge.
- Digital classroom should be there and precise syllabus should be provided.
- The rule of passing marks should be 50 per subject.
