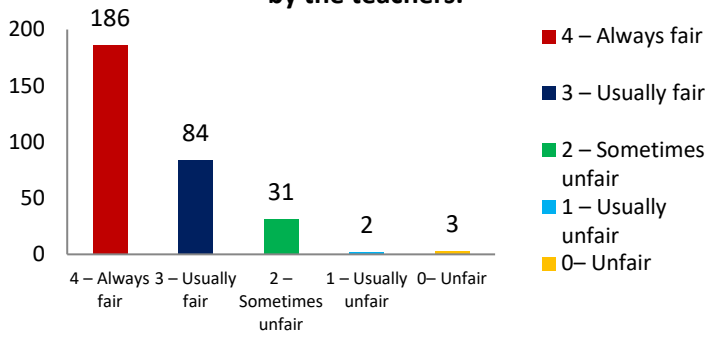

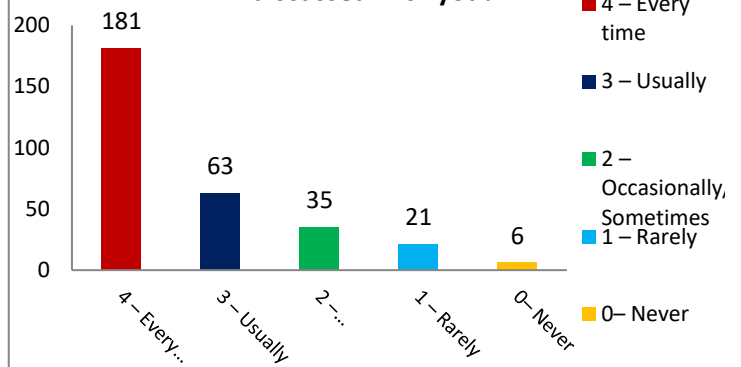
The analysis of question wise responses for first 20 questions is represented in the column chart.



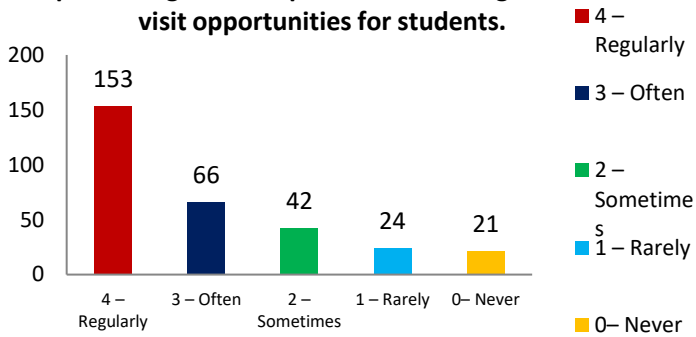
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.



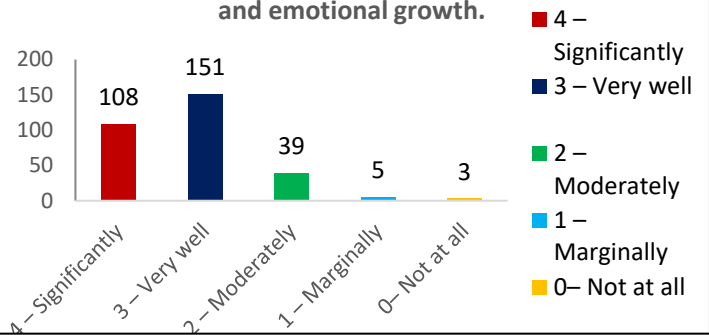
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?



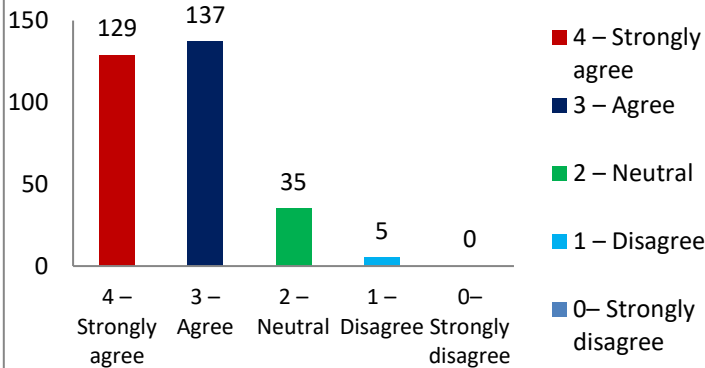
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.



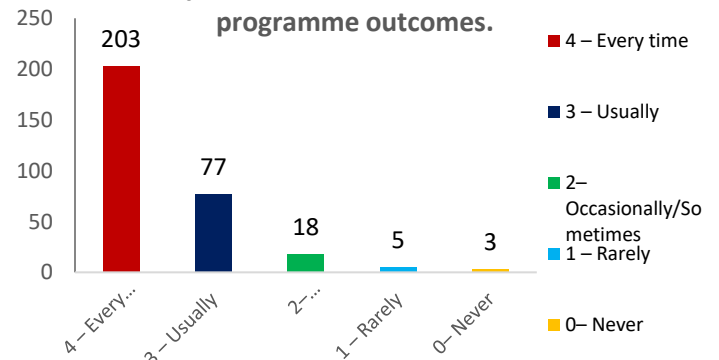
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.



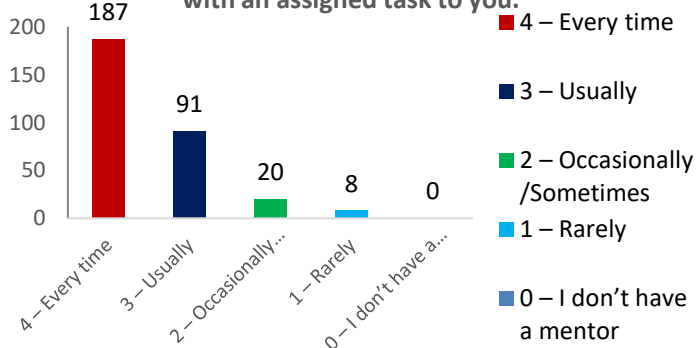

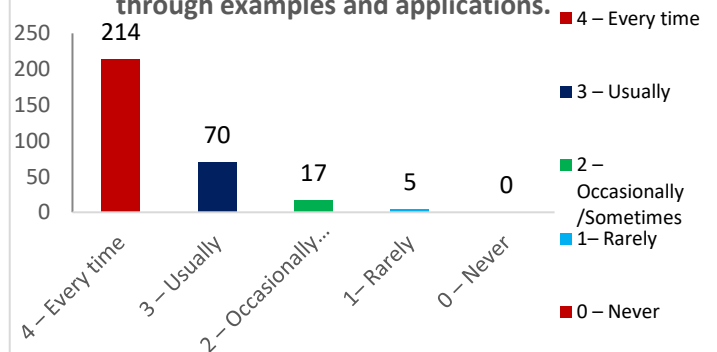
10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



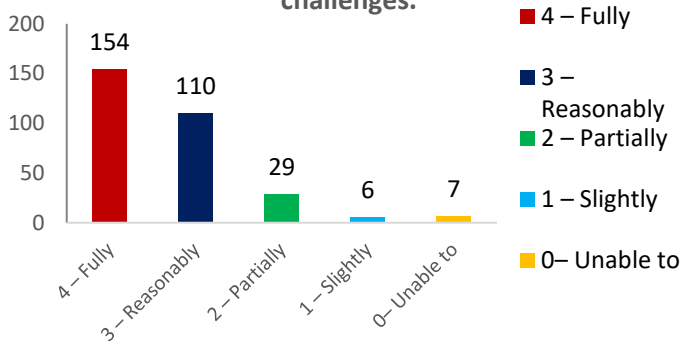
11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.



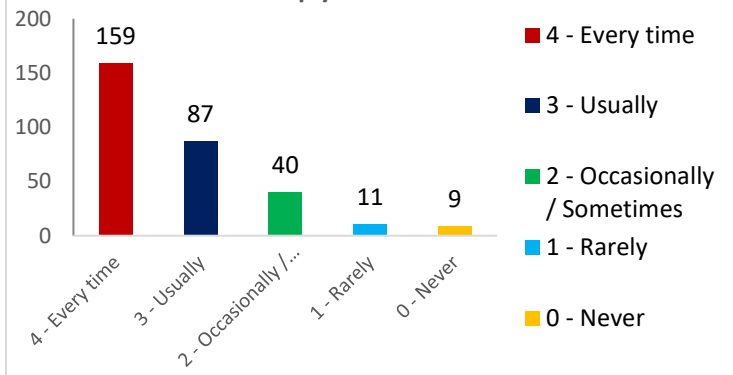
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.



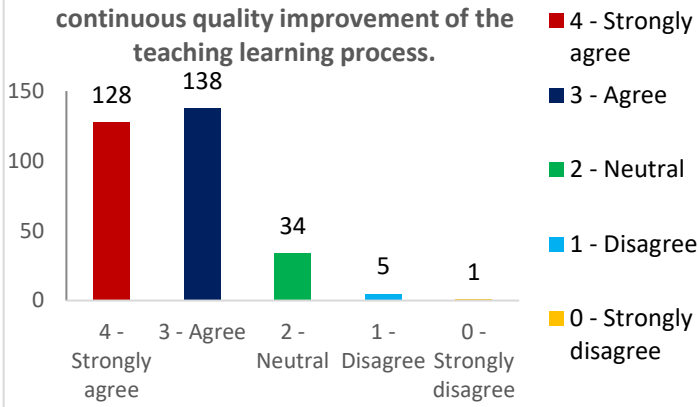
13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



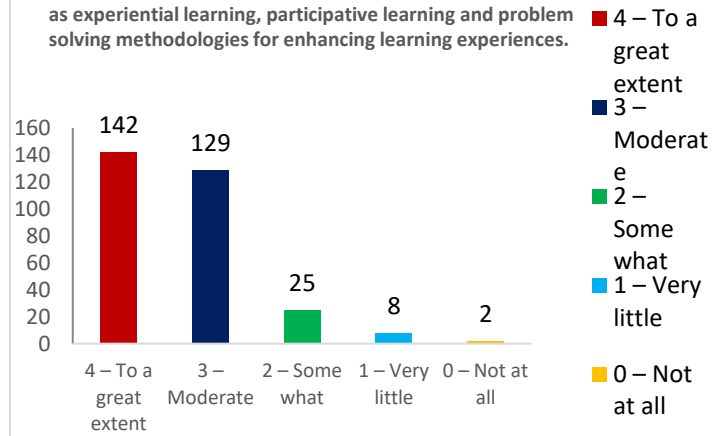
14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



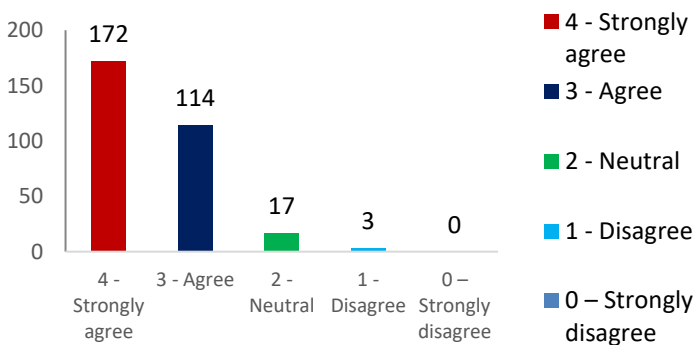
15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



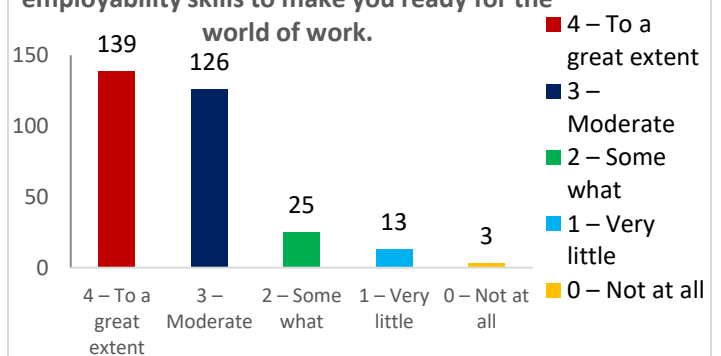
16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.



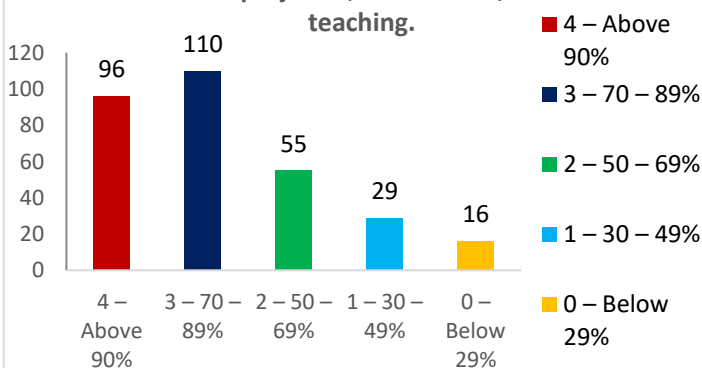
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities



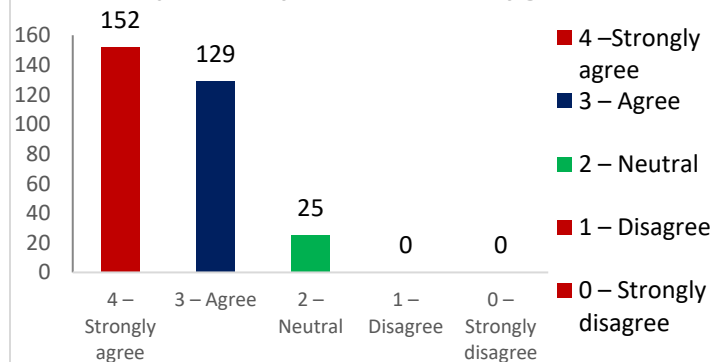
18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.

Suggestions:

- More encouragement may be given to students for participation in interactive sessions in the classroom.

- The number of digital classrooms and use of ICT should be increased. Syllabus of some subjects needs up-dation.
- More opportunities should be given for campus recruitment and field visits.
- Some students feel that teacher should not do any kind of favoritism over particular student; every student should be treated equally.
- Some counseling sessions of every specialization course should be taken so that it becomes easy for students to understand the practical aspects of the field which they have chosen for their career.
- Industrial Visits should be conducted for imparting practical knowledge.
