


In these days, computer applications in various fields are rapidly increasing. In every field, computer is becoming not only necessary but also essential. The education field also computer to satisfy their requirements.




IDENTIFICATION OF NEED

In addition, the city derives unique importance from being the headquarters for the Hindu nationalist organisation RSS and an important location for the Dalit Buddhist movement.

Nagpur is also known for Deekshabhoomi, the largest hollow stupa among all the Buddhist stupas in the world.</P>

Nagpur lies in central India with Zero mile marker, (indicating the geographical center of India) located here.

City was founded by Gond people but later became part of Maratha Empire under the Bhonsles.

British East India Company took over the city in 19th century and made it the capital of Central Provinces and Berar.

After first state reorganization, it lost the capital status but was made second capital of Maharashtra.

Nagpur is an important location for Dalit Buddhist movement and Hindu nationalist organizations like RSS and VHP.

Nagpur is strategically important as it is situated at the cross-roads of India's North-South and East-West routes by road,

rail and air Nagpur is famous for growing oranges from which it derives it's nickname Orange city.

Nagpur's Economy Nagpur has been the center of commerce in the Vidarbha region since early days and is an important trading location.

However Nagpur's economic importance had gradually declined relative to Mumbai and Pune after the merging of Vidarbha into the Maharashtra because of a prolonged period of neglect by the state government.

Nagpur's economy is now recovering from past slowdown and city has attracted Rupees 5,000 crore in investment in 2004.

During the slowdown, state and central government offices were a major source of employment in the city.

Nagpur regional office of Reserve Bank of India was opened on September 10, 1956.

The estate's largest unit is of Indo Rama Synthetics, which manufactures synthetic polyester yarn.

Other units in Butibori include the power transmission company KEC, Hyundai Unitech, ACC Nihon Castings Ltd. Koradi & Khaparkheda are 2 thermal power stations located near Nagpur and operated by MSPGCL.

The Hingna industrial estate located on the western fringes of the city is made up of around 900 small and medium industrial units.

The major ones among them are tractor manufacturing plant of Mahindra and Mahindra, castingunits of NECO Ltd. (the country's largest casting group),

units of International Combustions, Bajaj Auto group, Candico (the SECOND largest confectionery manufacturing plant in India),

Ajanta toothbrushes and Sanvijay Group (largest steel rolling group of companies for long products in Central India).

Nagpur is home to ice-cream manufacturer Dinshaws, Indian dry food manufacturer Haldiram's and Ayurvedic product company Vicco..

Currently, Nagpur is witnessing an economic boom as "Multi-modal International Cargo Hub and Airport at Nagpur(MIHAN)" is being developed.

MIHAN will be used for handling heavy cargo coming from south east Asia and Middle east Asia.

Project will also include Rupees10,000 crore Special Economic Zone (SEZ) for Information Technology (IT) companies.

It is expected that the area around the MIHAN industrial project will become Mihanpur, a self- sufficient city when the project takes off.

Mihanpur will metamorphise itself from being a satellite city to become a twin city to Nagpur just like the well known Hyderabad-Secunderabad twins.

Gond prince of Deogad kingdom, Bhakt Buland, founded Nagpur in the early 18th century in the Chhindwara district. He tried to change the life of Nagpur as his new capital after seeing the advantage of civilized life of Delhi.

His successor Chand Sultan too continued the work of Bhakt Buland. Disputes regarding succession arose with the death of Chand Sultan in 1739.

Maratha governor of Berar, Raghuji Bhonsle, tried to restore his elder son to the throne, and the control of Nagpur slowly passed on from the Gonds to the Marathas. Later Nagpur became the capital of the Bhonsles.

Bhonsles lost to the British and Nagpur came under British influence in 1817. Raghuji III died without leaving any heir in 1853. As a result, the city came under the full control of British under Lord Dalhousie's Doctrine of Lapse.

Nagpur has been the most important city in central India and ws incorporated in the British territory in 1853.

The city became the capital of central provinces in
1861.

The Hitvada, leading English dalily was launched in
1911.

The foundation stone of Vidhan Bhawan was laid in 1912.

The Nagpur University was founded in 1923.

The all India Radio (AIR) was started in 1947.

Nagpur was made capital of the state of Madhya Pradesh in year 1950.

DR.Ambedkar converted thousands of Dalits to Buddhisum at Deeksha Bhoomi.

Nagpur was parred on to the Maharastra state.

Zero Mile in Nagpur Nagpur lies precisely at the center of the country with the Zero Mile Marker indicating the geographical center of India.

The Zero Mile Stone was erected by the British who used this point to measure all the distances.

The Zero Mile Stone consists of four horses and a pillar made up of sandstone.

It is located on the south east of Vidhan Bhavan, Nagpur.

123 Zero Mile Stone is a monument built by British during Great Trigonometrical Survey of India in 1907 in Nagpur, Maharashtra.

The Zero Mile Stone consists of a pillar made up of sandstone and another small stone representing the GTS Standard Bench Mark, and four stucco horses that were added later.

The height of the top of the pillar is 1020.171 feet above mean sea level.

In 2008, The Times of India undertook to maintain the monument for the next 5 years.

Contrary to the popular belief, there is no verifiable evidence that it is a monument locating the geographical centre of colonial India in the city of Nagpur, Maharashtra, or that the Zero Mile Stone was erected by the British to use this point to measure all the distances.

The idea of constructing a temple like Shirdi Mandir on a larger scale originated from Shri Sai Mandir Dhantoli.

One body for this purpose was formed in 1971.

For legal fulfillment one trust was formed in 1972 which was registered at same time.

The present sight was purchased from Shri Banerjee in 1974 and Bhoomipujan was performed in 1976.

The required funds were raised by way of donations, cultural programs.

The main designer and Architect of the Mandir is Shri Shivdanmal who took pains in entire construction of Mandir.

The attractive idol is donated by Shri Babulalji Warti.

This idol is identical to Shirdi mandir and the sculpture is provided by Shri Talim of Mumbai. The entire construction got completed in 1979.

The religious ceremony of Consecration of the idol was performed during period 1st December 1979 to 4th December 1979 which

was celebrated by the gracious hands of Chief venerable Godavari Mata from Sakori (a place near Shirdi).

It is believed that Shri Saibaba is having his blessings on this Temple. The endeavor is made to propagate the teachings of Saibaba through programs and cultural activities.

Approximately 2000 devotees visit the temple everyday, but on Thursdays this figure raises to more than 25000. This is a very old record ,I assume it to be atleast 5-8 times more than the figure mentioned here.

Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU), formerly Nagpur University, is a public state university located in Nagpur, Maharashtra.

It is one of India's oldest universities, the second oldest in Maharashtra.

It is named after Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj, a renowned spiritual leader, orator and musician from Vidarbha. The university is a member of the Association of Indian Universities and the Association of Commonwealth Universities.

Nagpur is a major Education Hub in Central India. </P>

Nagpur has 27 Engineering Colleges and 13 Medical Colleges.

Nagpur has both "municipal schools";(run by the NMC) and Private schools of State Board and CBSE Pattern (run by Trusts or Individuals), which in Some cases receive financial aid from the government.

Nagpur University is one of the oldest in the country and has geographical jurisdiction overthe five districts of Nagpur division in addition to giving affiliation to hundreds of colleges.

Nagpur also has Maharashtra Animal and Sciences University(MAFSU) for animal sciences. Nagpur has engineering colleges which provide education in various specialty courses.

The University was established as Nagpur University on 4 August 1923 with six affiliated colleges and 927 students.

By 1947, the number of students had increased to about 9,000, offering significantly more subjects.

The library and sports facilities expanded during these years.

In 1958, departments in arts and social science opened and in 1963, several additional science teaching departments were added. </P>

These departments were moved to buildings on the main campus in 1972 and 1973.

In May 1983, the university was divided to form Amravati University. In 2005, the university was renamed Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, and in September 2011 the university was again divided to create Gondwana University.

College of Agriculture in Nagpur provides impetus in agricultural research. City's Raman Science Centre promotes scientific attitude and has 133 seat planetarium.

Bhosle Dumb and Deaf School, Bharat Muk Vidyalaya and Residential Blind Boys Institution provide education to physically challenged.

Matru Sewa Sangh's Nandanwan school is for physically handicapped and mentally retarded children.

The National Institutes of Technology (NITs) are autonomous public technical university of higher education, located in India.

They are governed by the National Institutes of Technology Act, 2007, which declared them as institutions of national importance alongside Indian Institutes of Technology.

These institutes of national importance receive special recognition from the Government of India.

The NIT Council is the supreme governing body of India's National Institutes of Technology (NIT) system and all 31 NITs are funded by the Government of India.

These institutes are among the top-ranked engineering colleges in India and have one of the lowest acceptance rates for engineering institutes, of around 2 to 3 percent, second only to the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) in India.

All NITs are autonomous which enables them to set up their own curriculum. The language of instruction is English at all these institutes.

As of 2019, the total number of seats for undergraduate programs was 21,133 and for postgraduate programs 10,550 in all the 31 NITs put together.

Nagpur is an industrial and commercial city situated in the centre of India.

Formerly, it was the capital of the former State of Madhya Pradesh and now it is the sub-capital of the State of Maharashtra.

A full fledged High Court was established at Nagpur on 9-1-1936. Sir Gilbert Stone, a Judge of the Madras High Court was appointed as first Chief Justice.

The foundation stone of the new building (present High Court building) was laid by late Sir Hyde Gowan on 9-1-1937.

The building was designed by Mr.H.A.N. Medd, Resident Architect.

It was constructed at a cost of Rs.7,37,746/-.

The building consisted of two stories with a garden courtyard in the centre.

The outside dimensions are 400 ft x 230ft.

The original design provided for a main central dome rising 109 feet above ground land, the remainder of thebuilding being approximately 52 feet in height.

The building has been constructed with sandstone.

The building is declared open on 6th January, 1940.

On the opening ceremony the Viceroy of India described this building as a poem in stone.

The High Court has a fairly well planned garden on the eastern as well as western sides.

Vidhan Bhavan, Nagpur is the building in the Civil lines locality of Nagpur, the second capital of Maharashtra state of India, where Winter Session of the Maharashtra Legislature is held.

The foundation stone of the building was laid in 1912. It was constructed by the then British command to house the administration of the Central Provinces and Berar, of which Nagpur was the capital.

Later, in 1952, the CP & Berar was divided into the large central Indian state of Madhya Pradesh which included the current Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha regions.

Nagpur was the capital of this state. In 1960, this state was further divided, with the Vidarbha region going to Maharashtra state with much resistance from the natives. Thus, Nagpur lost its capital status.

But, a Nagpur Pact was signed by the Maharashtra state govt. headed by Yashwantrao Chavan to protect the interests and equal development of the Vidarbha region.

Accordingly, Nagpur was made the second capital of the Maharashtra and the winter session of the state legislature and the state legislative council was to be held at Nagpur.

Of the three Raj Bhavans in Maharashtra, – one each in Mumbai, Pune and Nagpur – the majestic Raj Bhavan at Nagpur has a history of its own.

Built in the year 1891 on the crest of the plateau of the Seminary Hills, the 'Government House' has been a silent witness to the transformation of a historic region.

The grand edifice built as the residence of Chief Commissioner of Central Provinces has seen the strong currents of freedom movement leading to the Independence of India and later witnessed the formation and reformation of territorial boundaries of the province.

Importantly, the Raj Bhavan Nagpur, known locally as 'Governor Kothi' has witnessed the transformation of a small town of Nagpur into a major city of India.

The centre is named after famous Nobel Prize winner Indian physicist Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman. The Raman Science

Centre was inaugurated on 7 March 1992 and the planetarium was started on 5 January 1997.

The centre is located opposite Gandhi Sagar Lake in the heart of Nagpur.

Between 1 April 2014 and 31 March 2015 the Centre recorded a visitor count of 582,962.

The centre is part of the National Council of Science Museums (NCSM), India which is also the largest network of science centres/museums under a single administrative umbrella in the world.

NCSM rates the centre as regional level and it has a total floor area of 4333 sq meters.

Nagpur is an important location for Dalit Buddhist movement and Hindu nationalist organizations like RSS and VHP. Nagpur is strategically important as it is situated at the cross-roads of India's North-South and East-West routes by road, rail and air Nagpur is famous for growing oranges from which it derives it's nickname Orange city.

NAGPUR ECONOMY

Nagpur's Economy Nagpur has been the center of commerce in the Vidarbha region since early days and is an important trading location. However Nagpur's economic importance had gradually declined relative to Mumbai and Pune after the merging of Vidarbha into the Maharashtra because of a prolonged period of neglect by the state government. Nagpur's economy is now recovering from past slowdown and city has attracted Rupees 5,000 crore in investment in 2004. During the slowdown, state and central government offices were a major source of employment in the city. Nagpur regional office of Reserve Bank of India was opened on September 10, 1956. The estate's largest unit is of Indo Rama Synthetics, which manufactures synthetic polyester yarn. Other units in Butibori include the power transmission company KEC, Hyundai Unitech, ACC Nihon Castings Ltd. Koradi & Khaparkheda are 2 thermal power stations located near Nagpur and operated by MSPGCL.

The Hingna industrial estate located on the western fringes of the city is made up of around 900 small and medium industrial units. The major ones among them are tractor manufacturing plant of Mahindra and Mahindra, castingunits of NECO Ltd. (the country's largest casting group), units of International Combustions, Bajaj Auto group, Candico (the SECOND largest confectionery manufacturing plant in India), Ajanta toothbrushes and Sanvijay Group (largest steel rolling group of companies for long products in Central India). Nagpur is home to ice-cream manufacturer Dinshaws, Indian dry food manufacturer Haldiram's and Ayurvedic product company Vicco..

Currently, Nagpur is witnessing an economic boom as "Multi-modal International Cargo Hub and Airport at Nagpur(MIHAN)" is being developed. MIHAN will be used for handling heavy cargo coming from south east Asia and Middle east Asia. Project will also include Rupees 10,000 crore Special Economic Zone (SEZ) for Information Technology (IT) companies. It is expected that the area around the MIHAN industrial project will become Mihanpur, a self- sufficient city when the project takes off. Mihanpur will metamorphise itself from being a satellite city to become a twin city to Nagpur just like the well known Hyderabad- Secunderabad twins.

Gond prince of Deogad kingdom, Bhakt Buland, founded Nagpur in the early 18th century in the Chhindwara district. He tried to change the fife of Nagour as his new capital after seeing the advantage of civilized life of Delhi. His successor Chand Sultan too continued the work of Bhakt Buland. Disputes regarding succession arose with the death of Chand Sultan in 1739. Maratha governor of Berar, Raghuji Bhonsle, tried to restore his elder son to the throne, and the control of Nagpur slowly passed on from the Gonds to the Marathas. Later Nagpur became the capital of the Bhonsles. Bhonsles lost to the British and Nagpur came under British influence in 1817. Raghuji III died without leaving any heir in 1853. As a result, the city came under the full control of British under Lord Dalhousie's Doctrine of Lapse. Nagpur has been the most important city in central India and ws incorporated in the British territory in 1853.

All major highways NH-7 (Varanasi - Kanyakumari) & NH-6 (Mumbai - Sambalpur - Calcutta) amd major railways trunk route (Mumbai, Chennai, Howrah * Delhi) pass through the city. Important Central & State Government offices and institutions are located in Nagpur. Northwest of the civil lines is the Goreward reservoir with a dam 2,350 ft long. There are several fine old reservoirs (tanks) notably Shukrawari (Jumma) Talao, Ambazari and Telankhedi, and many parks in and around the city.



The Nagpur Metro system is an urban Mass Rapid Transit System(MRTS) being built by the Maharashatra Metro Rail Corporation Ltd. (MahaMetro) to serve the city of Nagpur in eastern Maharashtra. Construction for its 38.215 km first phase started in 2015 and is expected to be completed in 2022(estd.0 with a mix of elevated & at-grade level lines.

In November 2017, mahaMetro's board approved a 3 km extension of line-1 with the addition of two new stations at Ecopark and Metro City -extending the first phase of the project to 41.7km. This extension however was not approved by the state goverment.





The idea of constructing a temple like Shirdi Mandir on a larger scale originated from Shri Sai Mandir Dhantoli. One body for this purpose was formed in 1971. For legal fulfillment one trust was formed in 1972 which was registered at same time. The present sight was purchased from Shri Banerjee in 1974 and Bhoomipujan was performed in 1976. The required funds were raised by way of donations, cultural programs. The main designer and Architect of the Mandir is Shri Shivdanmal who took pains in entire construction of Mandir. The attractive idol is donated by Shri Babulalji Warti.

This idol is identical to Shirdi mandir and the sculpture is provided by Shri Talim of Mumbai. The entire construction got completed in 1979. The religious ceremony of Consecration of the idol was performed during period 1st December 1979 to 4th December 1979 which was celebrated by the gracious hands of Chief venerable Godavari Mata from Sakori (a place near Shirdi). It is believed that Shri Saibaba is having his blessings on this Temple. The endeavor is made to propagate the teachings of Saibaba through programs and cultural activities. Approximately 2000 devotees visit the temple everyday, but on Thursdays this figure raises to more than 25000. This is a very old record ,I assume it to be atleast 5-8 times more than the figure mentioned here.







Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU), formerly Nagpur University, is a public state university located in Nagpur, Maharashtra. It is one of India's oldest universities, the second oldest in Maharashtra. It is named after Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj, a renowned spiritual leader, orator and musician from Vidarbha. The university is a member of the Association of Indian Universities and the Association of Commonwealth Universities. Nagpur is a major Education Hub in Central India.

Nagpur has 27 Engineering Colleges and 13 Medical Colleges. Nagpur has both "municipal schools" (run by the NMC) and Private schools of State Board and CBSE Pattern (run by Trusts or Individuals), which in Some cases receive financial aid from the government. Nagpur University is one of the oldest in the country and has geographical jurisdiction overthe five districts of Nagpur division in addition to giving affiliation to hundreds of colleges. Nagpur also has Maharashtra Animal and Sciences University (MARSU) for animal sciences. Nagpur has engineering colleges which provide education in various specialty courses.

The University was established as Nagpur University on 4 August 1923 with six affiliated colleges and 927 students. By 1947, the number of students had increased to about 9,000, offering significantly more subjects. The library and sports facilities expanded during these years. In 1958, departments in arts and social science opened and in 1963, several additional science teaching departments were added.

These departments were moved to buildings on the main campus in 1972 and 1973. In May 1983, the university was divided to form Amravati University. In 2005, the university was renamed Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, and in September 2011 the university was again divided to create Gondwana University. College of Agriculture in Nagpur provides impetus in agricultural research.City's Raman Science Centre promotes scientific attitude and has 133 seat planetarium. Bhosle Dumb and Deaf School, Bharat Muk Vidyalaya and Residential Blind Boys Institution provide education to physically challenged. Matru Sews Sangh's Nandanwan school is for physically handicapped and mentally retarded children.




COMMERCE COLLEGE

Testing is vital to the success of the system, system testing makes logical assumptions that if all the parts of system are correct, and the goal will be successfully achieved."


Another reasons for the testing is that provider the system Designer a chance to check the system and if needed upgrade or improve the system. The best program is worthless is it does not meet user needs.




SYSTEM SECURITY MEASURES


EVALUATION:-
