- 1) To approve the final Academic Regulations of two new courses of B.Com. (Honours) and B.Com. (Finance and Accounting).
- 2) To approve the revised Academic Regulations of existing courses i.e. B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.C.A, M.Com. and M.B.A.
 - Note: The original academic regulations have been revised in terms of internal assessment mechanism, grievance mechanism, moderation & revaluation, program/ course outcomes etc. Revised portion have been showed in red in revised regulations.
- 2) To approve the Directions regarding admission criteria, attendance criteria, examination reforms, program /course outcomes and conduct of examinations and declaration of results in view of COVID-
- 4) To approve the modified syllabus/units as per recommendations of various Board of Studies.
- 5) AOB

The following business took place in the meeting:

- 1. Dr. V. N. Thangan, Secretary, requested Dr P.M. Paradkar to chair the meeting.
- 2. Dr. P. M. Paradkar, Chairman, welcomed all the members and invited Dr. V. N. Thangan to read out the agenda.
- 3. Dr V.N. Thangan read out the agenda and informed that all the draft regulations and draft directions were sent to all members on their respective email ids. He requested Principal Dr N.Y. Khandait to elaborate on the agenda.
- 4. Dr N.Y.Khandait gave the details of various items on the agenda and requested the members to approve the same.
- 5. Dr Khandait also requested the members to consider Dr S. D. Morey's suggestions on the admission criteria to be incorporated in the Direction on admission criteria. He invited Dr S.D. Morey to put forth her suggestions.
- 6. Dr S. D. Morey, who is the Coordinator of M.Com. program and also the admission officer in ongoing UG admissions said that as per the suggestions received from the Admission Committee certain policies needed to be chalked out with respect to applicant-students with gap. She pointed out every year students with gap ranging from 1 year to 5-7 years apply for various UG/PG courses but we have no fixed policy for them. She suggested that
 - A. Students with a gap of maximum two years may be allowed to participate in admission procedure of both UG and PG programs except MBA.
 - B. While considering such students for admission their percentage of qualifying exam shall be reduced by 5% for each year of gap for UG admissions and by 3% for each year of gap for PG admissions except MBA in order to ensure that freshers are not put to any disadvantage.
 - C. The maximum age limit of admission in first semester of UG program should be maximum 20 years and for first semester of PG program except MBA, it should be maximum 25 years at the time of application/registration.
 - D. While preparing the merit list if there is a tie between the percentage of students the tie may be resolved as per the following rules:
 - i. In case of any tie of marks/percentage between a fresher and a student with gap after deducting the latter's marks, the preference in merit order shall be given to a fresher.

- ii. Further, in case of a tie of marks/percentage between the freshers themselves, and also between the students with gap, students with higher marks in English Language in the HSC/qualifying examination shall be put ahead in the merit list in case of admissions to the First Semester of UG programs. If the tie persists, then the aggregate marks in the SSC or the marks in English Language in the SSC, or the marks in Mathematics is SSC, in that order, shall be taken into account.
- iii. In case of admissions to the PG programs (except MBA), if there is a tie of marks/percentage between a fresher and a student with gap after deducting the latter's marks, the preference in merit order shall be given to a fresher. Further, in case of a tie of marks/percentage between the freshers themselves, and also between the students with gap, students with higher marks in an Accountancy or a Taxation course, in that order, in the final year (Vth or VIth semester) examination shall be put ahead in the merit list. If the tie still persists, the aggregate marks scored by a candidate in the HSC or equivalent examination, or the marks scored in English Language in HSC or equivalent examination or the aggregate marks scored in the SSC examination, in that order, shall be taken into account to decide the order of merit of the candidate.
- 7. Shri Hemant Signal appreciated and congratulated to G. S. College, Nagpur for taking initiatives for starting the two new courses i.e. B.Com. (Honours) and B.Com. (Finance & Accountancy). He said that these two new courses will be beneficial to the students for employment and entrepreneurship. He approved all the Academic Regulations and Directions on admission attendance, examination remark, program/course outcomes, conduct of examination and declaration of results in view of COVID 19. He also consented to incorporate Dr SD Morey's suggestions on the admission criteria.
- 8. Dr. K.C. Deshmukh congratulated the Management of G. S. College, Nagpur and Principal Dr. N. Y. Khandait for starting the two new courses of B.Com. (Honours) and B.Com. (Finance and Accountancy). He said these courses are available in Mumbai and Pune only and not in other part of the state. He believed that these courses will bring about positive changes in Commerce Education in the RTM Nagpur University.
- 9. Dr. K. C. Deshmukh asked Principal Dr. N. Y. Khandait to appoint faculty for the new courses. He also suggested that the future curriculum of the various courses should be compatible with the New Education Policy. He further suggested that the Boards of Studies should every year upgrade the syllabus to the extent of minimum 20% in order to bring the programs on par with the national and international levels. He also suggested that the subjects like Probability Theory, Operation Research, Financial Mathematics and Industrial mathematics should be added as elective subjects for improving the employability skills of students.
- 10. Dr K. C. Deshmukh approved all the academic regulations and directions including Dr Morey's suggestions on admission policy.
- 11. All other members approved the items no. 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the agenda.
- 12. The Academic Council thus unanimously passed the following resolutions.
 - a. The final Academic Regulations of two new courses of B.Com. (Honours) and B.Com. (Finance and Accounting) are approved for implementation w.e.f. 2020-21 session.
 - b. The revised Academic Regulations of existing courses i.e. B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.C.A, M.Com. and M.B.A. are approved for implementation w.e.f. 2020-21 session

The following business took place in the meeting:

- 1. Dr. V. N. Thangan, Secretary, sought permission of the chair to start the proceedings. After permission of the chair Dr. Thangan read out the agenda.
- 2. Officiating Principal Dr. P. M. Paradkar requested Prof. P. J. Yadao, Controller of Examination, to elaborate the nature and contents of the proposed Direction.
- 3. Prof. P. J. Yadao, Controller of Examination explained to the members of Academic Council about the necessity of conducting the full-length semester end examination as per the question pattern stipulated in the Academic Regulations of respective courses. He further stated that owing to the Covid-19 situation, the said examination shall have to be conducted through online mode. He further added that the college has also proposed a full-length preliminary examination through online mode. He informed that the preliminary examination is a part of internal assessment mechanism. Therefore, he requested all the members to approve the said Direction.
- 4. Dr. K. C. Deshmukh appreciated the college's initiatives in conducting full length examination as per the prescribed pattern instead of conducting curtailed examination in MCQ pattern. He further suggested that the college may conduct a preliminary examination of one hour duration through online mode so that the students get used to the new methodology of examination. He said that there should be maximum use of AI (Artificial Intelligence) in conducting online examinations.
- 5. Offg. Principal Dr. P. M. Paradkar informed the house that the college has proposed to conduct a full-length preliminary examination through online mode, both, as the part of internal assessment mechanism and for giving practice to students. It will be based on the entire syllabus as per the original scheme of examination as stipulated in the Academic Regulations of respective courses. He added that if the preliminary examination and semester end examination are conducted for two different durations, then the students may get confused. He further informed the members, that all the teachers have successfully conducted their unit tests and collected their

- home assignments from students through online mode. Therefore, students are already comfortable with the proposed set up.
- 6. Dr. K. C. Deshmukh agreed to this and approved the new methodology of examination along with the all the contents of the proposed Direction.
- 7. Dr. A. G. Pawade appreciated the college for taking efforts in preparing the students before the semester end examination and thinking positively about maintaining the quality of academics and assessment systems as a responsible autonomous college in these difficult times. He approved the proposed Direction in its entirety.
- 8. Shri Ranjit Dani also approved the entire Direction.
