(MBC 3.3) Summer Internship Project/ Report writing & Assessment

Teaching Hours: 4	Total Credits: 4	Total Marks: 80	Group: Core
Objectives: 1. To provide industry exposure to the students 2. To enable the students to apply their knowledge of management concepts in real-life business situations.			
Learning Outcomes: Students will develop awareness, understanding and capacity in the specific roles and responsibilities of a business and industry in their subject specializations and, as far as possible, to effectively participate in these roles and responsibilities.			
Unit	Content		
I	At the end of second semester examination, every student of MBA will undergo on- the job practical training in an organization. The training will be of 8 to 10 weeks duration.		
II	During the training, the student is expected to learn about the organization and analyze and suggest solutions of a live problem. The objective is to equip the student with the knowledge of actual functioning of the organization and problems faced by them for exploring feasible solutions and suggestions.		
III	During the course of training, the organization (where the student is undergoing training) will assign a problem/project to the student.		
IV	The student, after the completion of training will submit a report to the College/Institute, which will form part of third semester examination. However, the report must be submitted by the end of August during third semester so that it is evaluated well in time.		
V	The report (based on training and the problem/project studied) prepared by the student will be known as Summer Project Report (SPR). The report should ordinarily be based on primary data. It should reflect in depth study of micro problem, ordinarily assigned by the organization where student undergoestraining. Relevant tables and bibliography should support it. One comprehensivechapter must be included about the organization where the student has undergone training. This should deal with brief history of the organization, its structure, performance		

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	products/services and problems faced. This chapter will form part I of the Report. Part II of the Report will contain the study of micro research problem. The average size of Report ordinarily will be 50 to 75 typed pages in standard font size (12) and double spacing. Three neatly typed and soft bound (paperback) copies of the report will be submitted to the College/Institute. The report will be typed in A-4 size paper.
VI	The Report will have two certificates; one by the Head of the Institute/College and another by the Reporting Officer of the organization where the student has undergone training. These two certificates should be attached in the beginning of the report.
VII	The SIP will be evaluated by two examiners (1 External Evaluator & 1 Internal Evaluator) appointed by the Director. It will carry total 100 marks divided into Internship – 40 Marks, Project Report – 40 Marks and Presentation 20 Marks. Person having minimum 3 years of experience of teaching MBA OR a person from industry having 3 years' experience at managerial level shall be appointed as examiner.
VIII	It is mandatory that the student will make presentation in the presence of teachers and students. The student is expected to answer to the queries and questions raised in such a presentation.
IX	If the student fails to submit his / her Project, he / she shall not be allowed to appear for the Project Viva Examination and no Marks shall be allotted to the student.

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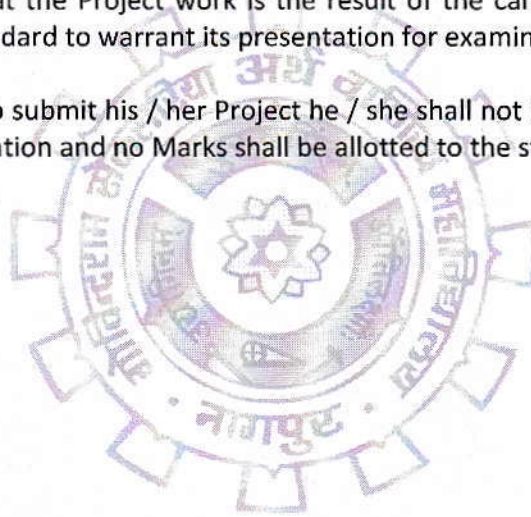

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- (ii) For Project work a batch of Twenty students per guide /supervisor has to be allotted by the Institute.
- (iii) A copy of Project work (Printed or Type Written) shall be submitted to college, at Fifteen Days prior to the date of commencement of Semester-IV Examination, which will be retained by the college/Department for internal evaluation purpose.
- (iv) A Candidate shall submit with his/her project work, a certificate from the Supervisor to the effect- That the candidate has satisfactorily completed the Project work for not less than one session and That the Project work is the result of the candidates own work and is of sufficiently high standard to warrant its presentation for examination.
- (v) If the student fails to submit his / her Project he / she shall not be allowed to appear for the Project Viva Examination and no Marks shall be allotted to the student.




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
