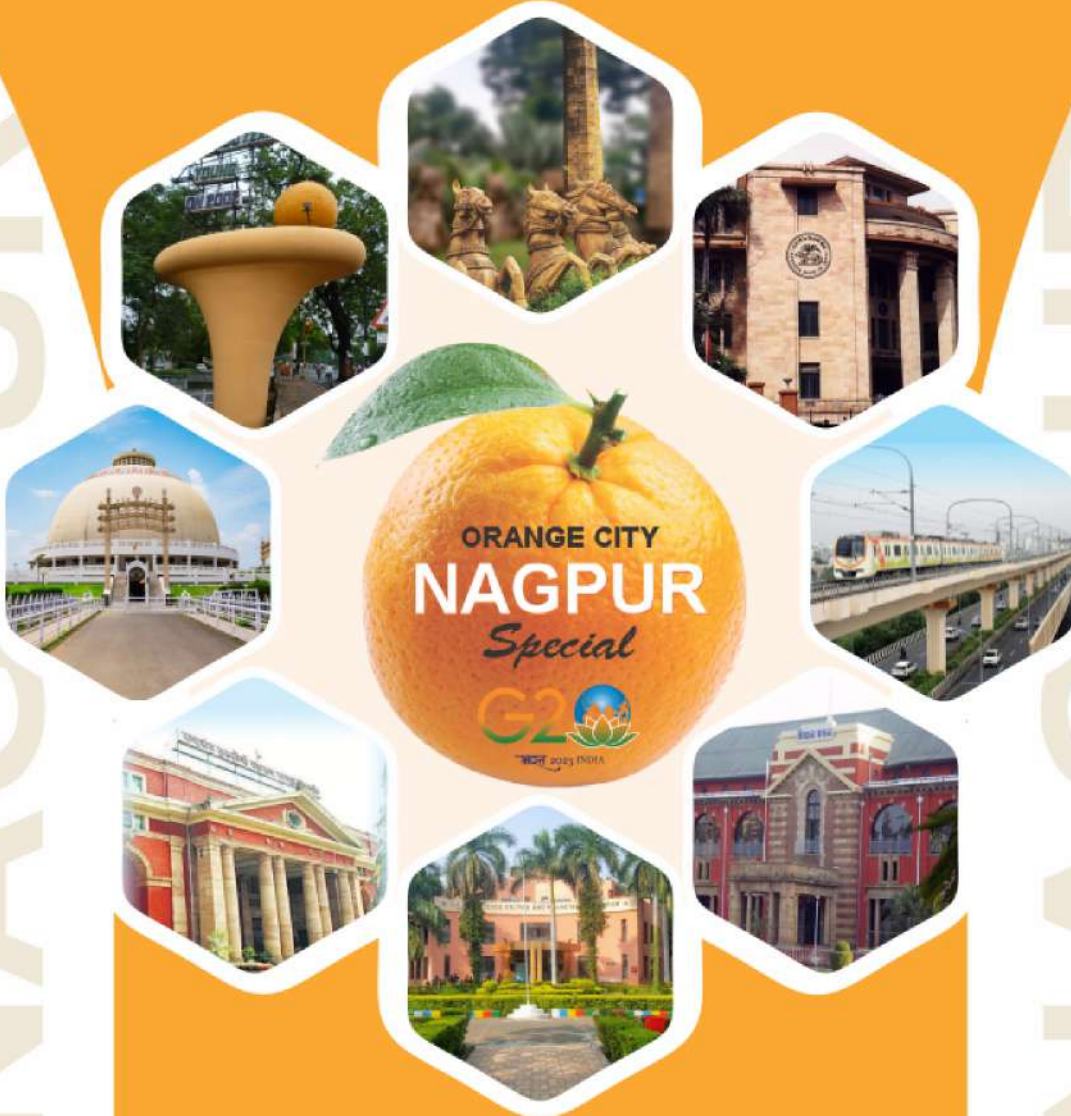

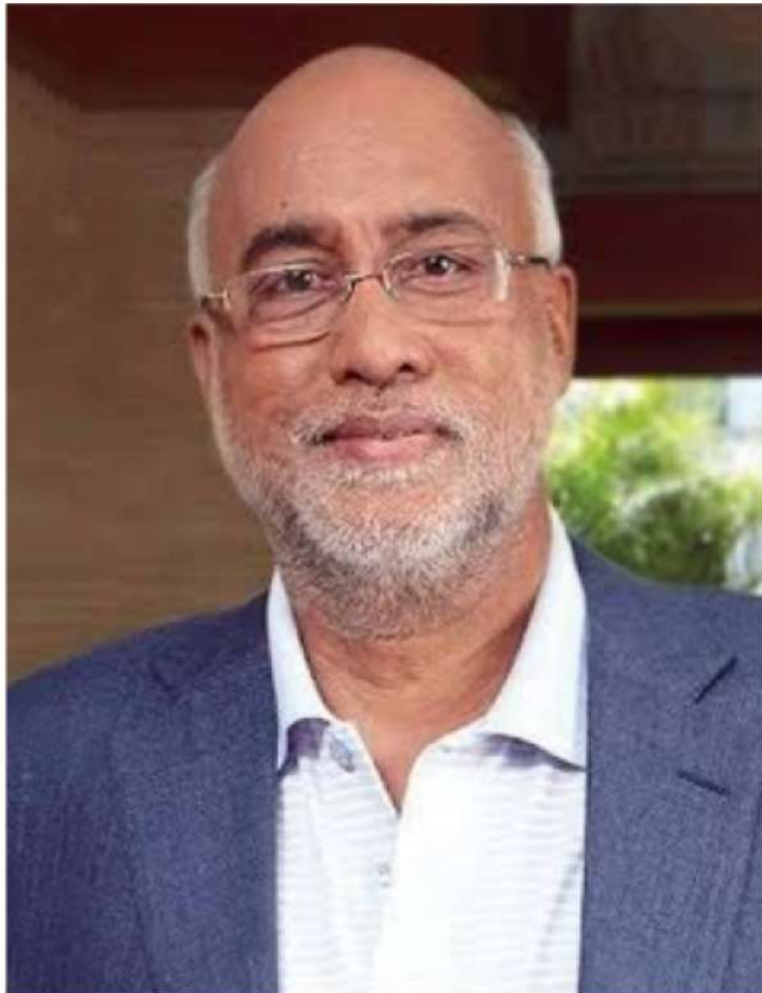

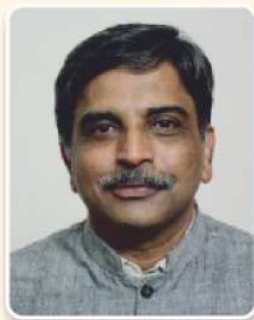

A Talk with Atharva Shivankar about the evergreen heritage of Nagpur

Introducing Atharva Shivankar

Acity's heritage stays a live through its people. It's one thing to say it and another to really mean it. Atharva Shivankar is one who lives and breathes Nagpur in a true sense. He has spent years in curating a space on Instagram revolving around many told and untold stories about Nagpur. Also, being a culinary enthusiast, He has finely introduced Nagpur's cuisine through his detailed Instagram stories. Recently, our magazine team had the opportunity to conduct an inter view with him on his journey of discovering Nagpur's history so far and here's show it went:

What does Atharva have to say about Nagpur?

1. What inspired Atharva to make content on Nagpur's heritage in the first place?

Atharva has a keen interest in reading and having conversations about Nagpur's history. But the same is not the case with everyone living in this city. Initially, he shared some detailed in formation on social media and found that the details needed some regulation and cutting downs o that people can read in a short span and show interest in knowing more. His delivery of the history is quite engaging with a personal touch. He believed in unlearning the way in which history has been taught to us and learning a new approach so that the Nagpurians feel more connected with the heritage. The city has a rich history that is very less spoken about, be it tracing back the roots to Ramtek or Sitabuldi Fort. So, to make people more aware about this, Atharva came up with the idea for his Instagram page (hh_atharva).

2. How did he decide upon which specific part of history will be more important for people to know about?

Atharva follows the timeline of the Nagpurian history while sharing the stories. Starting from the pre-historic era, dynasty politics of the Bhonsles, the gonds and the British era, he has covered bits and parts of all of them and still in the process of doing so. He focuses on the contributions made by the kings to the city which makes Nagpur the way it stands today. However personally, his inclination is more towards Maratha History.

3. In the process of discovering Nagpur, which part of history has stricken him the most that he found relatable?

Atharva is more into the cultural and artistic aspects of the city rather than the military or the political one. Here, he shares that many books are available that narrate the city's

history. But it concerns him how inaccessible they are. However, history reveals itself to people who search for it. He rightly says that the history didn't occur in a very relatable format, so one cannot directly relate to a king or a peshwa who lived hundreds of years ago. It is the way in which it is narrated that makes people connect to the stories. One of the many stories that struck him was a story of Sawai Madhav Rao Peshwa's Wedding and the famous Betel leaves of Ramtek. Nagpur has to offer a lot of interesting stories from the past, it just needs to be identified and talked about more often.

4. Which heritage place in Nagpur is the closest to Atharva's heart?

There are two heritage places which have a special place in his heart. One being the Kalyaneshwar Shiv Mandir, Telangkhedi. It is because of the peaceful ambiance that it provides. His page very clearly depicts his love for the temple. The other being Kashibai Rajghat. Atharva says that standing here, one can trace back the entire Bhonsle dynasty. The architecture here tells stories that dates to the 18th century. He claims that he will be able to narrate incidences that took place in that era while strolling in this site.

5. What is Atharva's research procedure?

He shares that he has been through a lot of written records from ages ago which tell about the city's history in an authentic way. He shares that the 'Peshwa Daftar' is a major source of history. He digs into the accounts made at the time which narrate the city's history in some way or another. He reaches out to the heirs of people who created history. He also takes the help of maps and other tools which help in backing up with the story that he shares. The architecture of the city is quite verbal in its own way, so that helps him too. Other than all these sources, he doesn't particularly follow any research procedure and rather chooses to go with the flow.

6. What is the response he gets from the people in his volunteer work or restoration for heritage places in Nagpur?

In the start, Atharva didn't really receive a good response from the people. He had quite some rough experience resulting from the ignorance of the people who didn't want to cooperate in uncovering more stories as they didn't feel connected to the city's history. However, there have been instances when people have come up to support him. He has worked hard in dealing with the issue of defacement of Buty Darwaja. This would not have been possible if his Instagram story didn't catch the eyes of hundreds of people, who then reshared it which helped in getting rid of the hoardings, restoring the beauty of the place. Another instance is of the cleaning of the surrounding that encompasses Rukmini Mandir. Around 25 people voluntarily came forward to make it happen and now, there is not even a sight of a dried leaf in the temple's surroundings. There aren't

many conservation projects that are taking place in Nagpur presently, thus he emphasizes more on creating awareness among people to retain the beauty of the heritage places to conserve them for the future generation.

7. What makes a person a Nagpurian?

This was a tough question for him to answer, given how the differences aren't something that he paid attention to. According to him, the acceptance of mixed cultures is what gives people of Nagpur a profound pride in calling themselves Nagpurians.

8. Does he have a team which works with him, or does he manage his Instagram page single-handedly?

He shared that as of now, he works on his content independently. His driving force is the many interesting conversations that he has just started having with his fellow keen explorers of Nagpur. He gets DMs (Direct Messages) from people all over the city telling him about how a heritage site which he shared a piece about, was visited by them. He wishes to make a close-knit community in the future to bring these people closer to make people more aware about Nagpur.

9. What are his plans regarding content creation in the future?

Atharva plans on sticking to Nagpur for now. He still believes that there are many unrevealed stories of the city which need to come out. Unless and until all those stories reach the people, he will not be focusing on other cities. He also plans on sharing stories of many inaccessible places in the city and making people aware of it. His main aim is to make Nagpur so well known that people can come up with the city's fascinating stories in their daily conversations.

10. How can we as today's youth accompany him in saving Nagpur's Heritage?

Curiosity kills the cat but not in this case. Atharva wishes the young generation to show interest in the evergreen stories of Nagpur. There is a need to maintain the cultural heritage of this city. This can be achieved through the collective participation of the youngsters. He respectfully remembered Shobha Panchikar, someone who ignited the desire of learning more about Nagpur in him, "The heritage is just like our grandparents. They don't ask for anything but to be kept alive through love and care." Lakes:

And then comes Futala Talav, its three sides are covered by green trees, and the fourth side is bounded by a beautifully planted chowpatty. Recently, the Futala lake was redeveloped by adding musical fountain and lightshows.

As Futala got developed, Nagpur is developing in many other ways too. In recent years, Nagpur has seen substantial improvements in both infrastructure and living conditions. Nagpur is becoming a tier-2 city with a potential growth in future. A fleet

of 200 electric vehicles, including cabs, buses, e-rickshaws and cars, were first made available in Nagpur .

HISTORIC IMPORTANCE OF DIKSHABHOOMI

Dikshabhoomi is a sacred monument of Buddhism at the place where Babasaheb Ambedkar converted to Buddhism along with his 38,000 followers on October 14, 1956. Ambedkar's conversion to Buddhism is still guidance for the masses in India.

Dikshabhoomi is situated in Nagpur, Maharashtra, a location regarded as a pilgrimage centre of Buddhism in India. Diksha literally means 'action of campaign' and Bhoomi means 'land'. So, literally Dikshabhoomi means where people were ordained as Buddhists. It is also known as Dhamma Chakra Stupa. This stupa was inaugurated on 18th December 2001 by the President of India K.R Narayan. Dr. Ambedkar in the conversion to Buddhism, chose Nagpur as it were 'Nag' people who supported Buddhism in its early age. The day he chose was the day of Ashoka Vijaya Dashmi, the day emperor Ashoka had converted to Buddhism.

Dikshabhoomi is one of the major Buddhist pilgrim centres in India. Its construction started in 1968 over four acres with quarters for monks. The stupa was built in 1978 and designed by famous architect Jheo Dan Mal and has been revered as a major Buddhist site since then. It is the largest stupa in Asia and the largest hollow stupa in world. The construction of the stupa is remarkable as it consists of a hemispherical two-storied building with its architectural splendour and its historical significance makes Dikshabhoomi a prominent pilgrim centre.

At last, we can say that Dikshabhoomi hosts a memorial to Dr. Ambedkar and has been graded an A-class tourism and pilgrimage site. Also, Dikshabhoomi is famous for its architectural beauty and one of the main centres of tourism in India.

Historical and Political importance of Nagpur

Nagpur the heart of India is famous for its historical, political, spiritual, religious and cultural significance. Nagpur got its name from the river Nag. The word Nag means snake in Marathi, which is etymology of Nagpur.

Nagpur's foundation was laid by the Gond king of Deogad 'Bhakt Buland Shah' in the year 1703. The successor to Bhakt Buland Shah, Chand Sultan constructed 3 mile long wall around the city. Nagpur enjoys strong ties with lord Rama and his journey during the period of exile. It is believed that he built a small hut to rest at a place that's very close to modern Nagpur.

Human settlement in this city can be traced back to more than 3000 years, as many 8th century BCE structures were discovered in 2008. In 12th century, Yadavas found a strong foothold in the area and they were great patrons of art and literature. It was during this time that the Hemadpanti architecture came into vogue. A lot of temples from this era were unearthed later.

After Chand sultan passed away, Nagpur came under the Maratha rule. Many wars were fought on this soli until it came under the control of British Central Government. It was the Britishers who constructed many buildings in the city that can be considered as landmarks today. After independence, Nagpur was made the capital of Madhya Pradesh. Today, the city has grown exponentially and at a matching pace with modern times.

In addition the city also derives importance from being the headquarter for the RSS and important location for the Buddhist movement. Nagpur is also called the 'Tiger Capital of India' as it connects many tiger reserves in India to the world. It is among the important IT sector in Maharashtra after Pune.

Nagpur is precisely at the center of the country with the zero mile marker indicating geographical center of India. The Non-cooperation movement was launched in the Nagpur session of 1920. Nagpur is the seat of annual winter session of the Maharashtra assembly. It is a major commercial and political center of the vidharbha region. According to a survey, Nagpur was identified as the best city in India topping in greenery, public transport and health care.

There are various facts that make Nagpur a vital city and the root of India's growth and an unbreakable shield. So next time when you hear about Nagpur, remember its more than tarri poha and oranges.

Initially central office of Reserve Bank of India was established in Kolkata but was permanently moved to Mumbai in 1937. Shaktikanta Das (born 26th February, 1957) is serving as the current & 25th Governor of the Reserve Bank of India. Nagpur office of Reserve Bank of India is the 2nd office in the state of Maharashtra. Nagpur has two branches of Reserve Bank of India, which houses India's entire Gold Assets.

The RBI is responsible for regulating, securing monetary stability, maintaining currency system. RBI is the back bone, not only for Nagpur but also for the entire country. RBI also plays a central role in transmission of monetary policy. It helps to balance the inflows and outflows of money in the economy. It also has supervising and examining member banks, providing key functional services to them. RBI is also entrusted with the management of foreign exchange.

RBI is the regulator and supervisor of the financial system in Nagpur as well. Because RBI is the banker to the Government and custodian of the cash reserve of commercial banks Nagpur is growing little faster than previous years. Problem of unemployment, poverty, has been reduced somewhere. RBI is also known as **the Bankers Bank**. It helps to provide financial stability to the city. RBI is contributing a big role in the economy of India but in Nagpur it is also playing a crucial role. Nagpur is industrializing and is in the process of being an Industrial zone., RBI is contributing as much as possible it can. Nagpur is a developing city but because of RBI and finalized decisions by them it is helping the people and encouraging them to Invest, Circulating their funds, Depositing money and getting interest with those Investment, which may lead other income generation source for them.

The RBI manages the revenue and expenditure of the Government so that It can focus on Social welfare and Economic prosperity of Country. It operates currency and credit system of the country to its advantage. It keeps reserves with a view to securing monetary stability not only in city but also into the Country.

Commercial importance of Nagpur

Nagpur is 3rd largest city and winter capital of the Indian State of Maharashtra. Being near to the border of MP, Chhattisgarh and Telangana, it is culturally diverse where people of various castes, communities, languages live in harmony. Nagpur metro plays an important part of the transport system of the city.

Nagpur is surrounded by various forests like Pench, Tadoba, etc which add to the beauty of the city and which are natural habitats of Tigers giving Nagpur the name Tiger Capital of India. By virtue of the varieties of the oranges grown here, Nagpur is also known by the epithet Orange City. Another factor which makes Nagpur more prominent is the railway station which is a gateway between north & south and east & west. Further Nagpur International airport has got connectivity to all major cities in India and few foreign cities.

For the young, Nagpur has got a number of shopping malls with various foreign brands as well making it is easier for people who come from outside India and reside here for their shopping needs. The city is also home to major national level organizations like National Environmental Engineering Research Institute, the National Cotton Research Institute, and the National Institute of Soil Survey and Land Use Planning. Nagpur district has got vast mineral resources especially bituminous coal.

Politically Nagpur is one of the most active places in Maharashtra with current Deputy Chief Minister Mr. Devendra Fadnavis and Mr. Nitin Gadkari, Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, hailing from here. These two have contributed greatly to the development of Vidarbha in general and Nagpur in specific. High Court of Bombay has a bench at Nagpur which makes it easier for administration.

The main attraction of Nagpur for me is the highest standards of hygiene, cleanliness and sanitation maintained here, perhaps call of Swachh Bharat given by PM Modi has been taken in all seriousness by the people here.

THE GREENEST METRO RAIL : NAGPUR

The Nagpur metro rail project was conceived during the year 2012 when cities having population of more than 20 lakh were made eligible for having metro rail. This decision by the Government had made 12 cities in India eligible for having a metro rail including Nagpur. Nagpur is the second capital of the State of Maharashtra and also the third largest city in the State and the 13th largest urban Conglomeration in India with the area of 217 sq. km. also being the geographical centre of Nation along with being the 'Orange City' and 'Tiger capital of India'. Nagpur Metro became 13th metro system in India to be operational. It was expected that 12.21% of Nagpur's estimated population of 2.9 lakh in 2021 i.e., around 363000 commuters would use the metro by 2021. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated operations of Nagpur Metro on 8 March 2019, via video conferencing along with Chief Minister of Maharashtra Devendra Fadanvis and Union Chief Minister Nitin Gadkari.

Nagpur Metro is the greenest metro rail in India as Sixty-five per cent of the energy requirement of Nagpur Metro is met from solar panels on the roofs of the metro rail, stations, depot boundary walls, depot shed etc. This was done from the inception stage itself. In the first phase, 14 MW solar power capacity has been installed. The energy generated is added to the National grid and the power required is drawn from local sources. Also, procurement of materials and the project management was done on the 5D BIM (Five Dimensional Building Information Modelling) platform.

On 21 August 2021, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray inaugurated a 1.6 km expansion between Sitabuldi and Kasturchand Park. This featured the Zero Mile Freedom Park station which has a 60,000-sq ft park and a 20-storey building, designed by a French architect. On 11 December 2022 Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated phase 1 of Nagpur Metro completely and start of phase 2 of Nagpur Metro.

The project aims to extend the two existing lines built in Phase 1 to Kanhan in the north, Butibori MIDC in the south, Transport Nagar (Kapsi) in the east and Hingna in the west. It comprises of a 1.2 km at-grade section with 2 stations and 42.6 km elevated sections with 30 stations. An additional 5th corridor is proposed to branch out...

HISTORIC AND POLITICAL IMPORTANCE OF NAGPUR

HISTORY OF NAGPUR

Nagpur is known for Oranges and Tarri Poha but the history of Nagpur lies beyond this. Nagpur has always been 'a treasure city' for those who have ruled her, may it be Gonds or the Britishers. Every ruler made Nagpur its capital but what were the factors which influenced every ruler and made Nagpur their dearest?

The city was founded by the Gonds but later became part of the Maratha Empire under the Bhonsles. The British East India Company took over Nagpur in the 19th century and made it the capital of the Central Provinces and Berar. After the first reorganization of states, the city lost its capital status but according to the "Nagpur Pact" between political leaders it was made the second capital of Maharashtra. Nagpur is also called, "Tiger capital of India" as it connects many Tiger Reserves in India .

The Nag River, a tributary of the Kanhan River, flows in a serpentine path and is therefore named "Nag", the Marathi word for snake. And hence, the river and city is named as Nagpur. While others say that the river flows through the old city of Nagpur and hence the city is named after this river. "Pur" is a common suffix given to cities, villages and towns across India, and is often simply translated "city". The seal of Nagpur Municipal Corporation depicts a cobra in the water of a river.

From 1853 to 1861, the Nagpur Province became part of the Central Provinces and Berar and came under the administration of a commissioner under the British central government, with Nagpur as its capital. Tata group started the country's first textile mill at Nagpur, formally known as Central India Spinning and Weaving Company Ltd.

Nagpur is a city with great capabilities to grow and prosper in the coming days. It is very important for State and Central Governments to contribute to the growth, development and prosperity of Nagpur.

POLITICAL IMPORTANCE OF NAGPUR

Nagpur is the winter capital of the state of Maharashtra, a fast growing metropolis and third largest city in Maharashtra after Mumbai and Pune. It has also recently been ranked as the cleanest city and the second greenest city of India. In addition to being the seat of Annual Winter Session of Maharashtra State Assembly "Vidhan Sabha", Nagpur is also a major commercial and political center of the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra, and is also famous throughout the country as "Orange City" for being a major trade center of oranges that are cultivated in the region.

Political importance of Nagpur is the main reason behind Nagpur's fame within Maharashtra and broadly speaking in India. In fact, the entire political community of Maharashtra moves to Nagpur for the Winter Session of the Legislative Assembly. Every year during the month of December, the political scenario of Maharashtra shifts to Nagpur for two weeks. The Winter Session of the Legislative Assembly of Maharashtra draws the attention of the political community towards Nagpur.

Furthermore, Bombay High Court is situated in the city of Nagpur. The Bombay High Court adds to the political importance of Nagpur. Nagpur is among the three cities that houses the branch of the Bombay High Court. The Bombay High Court extends jurisdiction over the entire territory of Maharashtra, as well as on Daman and Diu.

Thus, it is evident that the presence of the Bombay High Court and the Winter Session of the Legislative Assembly largely contributes towards the political importance of Nagpur.

At a formal public ceremony on 14 October 1956 in Nagpur B. R. Ambedkar along with his supporters converted to Buddhism starting Dalit Buddhist movement which is still active. In addition, the city also derives political importance from being the headquarters for the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh.

Following are the major politicians from Nagpur :

- (1) **Devendra Gangadharrao Fadnavis:** He is an Indian politician serving as the 9th and current Deputy Chief Minister of Maharashtra since 30 June 2022.
- (2) **Shri. Nitin Jayram Gadkari:** He is a Member of Parliament and the current

Minister for Road Transport and Highways and Shipping. He won from Nagpur, Maharashtra, India. Gadkari earlier served as the President of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) from 2010-2013.

- (3) **Anil Deshmukh:** He represented Katol, Nagpur district, first on behalf of the Congress party, and then the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP). Anil Deshmukh, in his initial years served as Chairman of Nagpur Zilla Parishad of his political career.

CULTURE OF NAGPUR

The culture of Nagpur is an amalgamation of the various cultures prevalent within India. Its culture is a cosmopolitan culture that projects the faiths and beliefs of different communities.

The South-Central Zone Cultural Centre sponsors cultural events in Nagpur city such as the Orange City Craft Mela and Folk Dance Festival, Vidarbha is noted for its numerous folk-dances such as the Human tiger.

Some of the main festivals/events which are celebrated in Nagpur are:

Kalidas Festival:

Kalidas Festival is celebrated annually at Ramtek and Nagpur for two days in the month of November. Organized by MTDC in association with the District Collectorate Office of Nagpur, This festival of Music, Dance and Drama is held to honour Kalidasa.

Marbat Festival:

Marbat Festival held especially in the Nagpur city, is an important festival in this region which is celebrated to protect the city from evil spirits. During the festival, people of Nagpur venerate their God to save them from the evil spirits and they make statues of evil forces. These statues are taken to a vast ground as a procession, from all the areas of the city. They are burnt together on a belief that the city would be free from all types of evils.

Special Economic Zone Mihan India

Back in the year 2005 the Indian parliament passed the Special Economic Zones Act 2005. China was the first-ever country to bring up the idea of Special Economic Zones.

The Mihan India Special Economic Zone (SEZ) is a multi-project initiative with a planned investment of Rs. 1,000 Crore for aviation MRO and other related projects. Kalpana Saroj's Saroj Global was awarded the contract for developing this SEZ at Nagpur's Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar International Airport.

Multi-model International passenger and cargo Hub Airport at Nagpur (MIHAN).

Mihan SEZ is a special economic zone, established by the local authorities and state governments of India. It is a delineated area, outside the special economic zone, where basic infrastructure facilities are provided. The Mihan project is focused on providing statutory functions to trading establishments in order to promote exports and generate employment opportunities. The infrastructure provided includes roads, power plants, water supply systems and communication networks which are essential for businesses within the SEZ. It also provides incentives such as tax exemptions for both domestic and international companies operating in this region. This has helped attract foreign investments into the area which will further improve its economy.

Special Economic Zone Mihan India is an ambitious multimodal international hub located at Nagpur, India. It comprises of a world class hub airport, a new rail terminal and necessary urban amenities. The SEZ has the largest air maintenance repair and overhaul facility in the country which can accommodate all types of aircrafts making it attractive for logistics businesses to invest here. It also includes a food park with potential development opportunities in nearby MIDC area. The infrastructure of SEZ Mihan India has been designed to ensure excellent connectivity through roads, railway and airways making it an ideal multi-modal international hub for both domestic as well as foreign investments. With its strategic location, strong transport network and various investment opportunities, SEZ Mihan India promises great potential for economic growth in the near future.



Located near Nagpur in Maharashtra, Mihan India is a Special Economic Zone (SEZ) established by the Maharashtra Airport Development Company (MADC). The state government has provided a large area of odd hectares to MADC for the purpose of developing an aviation infrastructure. Mihan India is a special purpose entity setup by MADC and it focuses on developing airport infrastructure as well as providing regional air connectivity. The aim of this project is to provide world-class aviation services, attracting investments from across the globe and ultimately contributing towards economic growth in the region.

Special Economic Zone (SEZ) Mihan India is one of the biggest multi-product SEZs in the country. This project was initiated amidst allegations of several cases involving Development Commissioners, but managed to gain sudden approval from Minister Nitin Gadkari. The project has managed to attract investors and many companies like DHL Express and Volkswagen have set up their offices here. As per local media reports, the government has invested over Rs 600 crores for setting up infrastructure facilities at Mihan SEZ. In addition to this, it also provides incentives for businesses willing to invest here as well as other benefits like tax exemptions and operational freedom to its investors. All these factors make it an attractive destination for international companies looking for opportunities in India.

Special Economic Zone Mihan India (SEZ Mihan) is an ambitious project, spread over 2,500 hectares of land with an estimated total land pool of over 10,000 hectares. This vast land has been divided into two zones- a residential zone and a non-residential zone. The latter is the Special Economic Zone component that offers tax sops and other benefits to companies investing in it. Various developments such as educational institutes, malls, industrial units and more are planned for the SEZ component.

These words are not just for uttering but for Investigating, going deep into their meaning, to meditate upon them. Buddha means the one who takes us from Darkness toward Light, Wisdom Towards higher Consciousness towards Mindfulness. Deeksha Bhoomi is constructed on the core values of **Buddham, Dhammam & Sangam** of Buddhism.

Deeksha Bhoomi is a sacred Monument of Buddhism, a place where Dr. BR Ambedkar converted to Buddhism along with his 380,000 followers on October 14, 1956. It is a significant moment for the Dalit community. Ambedkar had already declared in 1935 that although he was born as a Hindu he would not die as one

"Though I was born a Hindu, I solemnly assure you that I will not die as Hindu"

After his declaration, he extensively studied the doctrines of various religions and chose Buddhism for himself and his followers. He chose Nagpur for his conversion, as he explained in his speech because

Nagpur was the homeland of **the Nag** people who embraced Buddhism and supported it with great efforts in its early period, and propagated it throughout India.

Deeksha Bhoomi is spread over four acres of land. The Stupa of the sacred Deeksha Bhoomi Sheo Dan Mal. Construction of the Stupa started in July 1978, but it took a long time to finish. The design of the Stupa at Deeksha Bhoomi is based upon the architecture of the world-famous stupa of Sanchi. But in contrast to the stupa at Sanchi, Deeksha Bhoomi's stupa is completely Hollow from the inside. It is the largest hollow stupa among all Buddhist stupas in the world. On the ground floor, there is a 211 X 211 feet large square hall. At the Centre of the hall, an idol of Buddha is placed. Buddha's idol was donated to Deeksha Bhoomi by Thai students learning at the

University Of Nagpur. There is also a library and a photo exhibition of the events in the lives of Gautam Buddha and Dr. Ambedkar. The stupa also has doors in 4 Directions. The doors open in large arcs, which are decorated with Ashok Chakras, and statues of Horses, Lion, and Elephants, which gives an ancient look. Statues of Dr. Ambedkar and idols of Gautam Buddha are situated in front of the stupa. Around the stupa, there is a garden, which is maintained by Nagpur Improvement Trust. Deeksha Bhoomi is a prominent place of tourism for home and foreign tourists. Every year, thousands of tourists visit Deeksha Bhoomi, especially on **Dhamma Chakra Parivartan Din**. So, next time you are in Nagpur, make sure to visit this historical monument.

A Hub of Education

Education:- Education is the key to success.

Nagpur was known as one of the education hubs in Maharashtra but then fell way behind Mumbai and Pune as far as quality education institutions were concerned. With the change of guard at both centre and state, things began to change. No one ever thought that the city would get a prestigious institution like IIM and NIPER, leaving other top cities behind. It is believed that it came due to highways and surface transport Minister Nitin Gadkari.

However, just political willpower was not enough to see these premier institutions through, it also needed ground support like a place for starting temporary campus, making arrangements for erecting infrastructure like furniture, equipment, classrooms, computers and library among others. Facilitating this is Joint Director of Technical Education in city Gulab Thakre. He has been involved right from identifying the temporary campus to successfully setting up of institutions like IIM, IIIT and Government College of Engineering (GCOE). In a chat with TOI, Thakre spoke at length about the intense struggle and hard work he and his team had to undergo, before getting those institutions

Excerpts from the interview...

Q. How was the situation before October 2014 when new government was sworn in?

A. Though IIM and NIPER were allotted after the new government, projects like IIIT and GCOE were very old. But, for various reasons, these couldn't take off for all these years. Former Guardian Minister Nitin Raut made strenuous efforts for GCOE, and even got it sanctioned in his constituency at Mouza Wanjra. But, again, differences cropped up and it remained on paper. IIIT was also sanctioned by the previous government at Pune and Nagpur simultaneously. It too was marred by problems and remained on paper. It was only after the new government took over that leaders like Fadnavis and Gadkari took personal interest that led to flood of such national level institutions in the city.

Q. IIM Nagpur created a record of sorts in the country.

A. That is true, as it actually started operation within eight months of its announcement. Normally, it takes four to five years to get clearances and start operations for such top B schools. IIIT, MNLU and GCOE are perfect examples of it. It's

thanks to initiative taken by CM himself, who instantly offered land at Mihan for setting up permanent campus. It wasn't easy task to find temporary campus. Being a premier institution, it required all top level facilities like Wi-Fi, library, hostels, classrooms, and canteen among others. It was quite a difficult job. We first visited Nagpur University & LIT, but facilities were not up to mark.

Q. How did you zeroed in on VNIT for starting IIM?

A. After failing to get a suitable land, I called on Vishram Jamdar, Chairman of Board of Governors (BOG) of VNIT. He showed us two newly constructed buildings built for their faculty on college premises. On our request, VNIT team decided to extend the helping hand despite, they needing the building to accommodate their own staff. It was perfect location as VNIT had all state-of-the-art facilities like Wi-Fi, library and other facilities. The MHRD team also liked facilities provided to the students and instantly sanctioned it.

Q. You also played an active role in setting up IIIT.

A. We had to struggle to find out the land required for prestigious institution. It was then identified at Waranga on Wardha Road. Earlier, we had identified, another land near Kaladongri, but it was rejected by the visiting MHRD team due to lack of accessibility. We also faced problem while selecting temporary campus for IIIT. We initially liked VMIT for setting it up. As they were charging hefty amount, we decided to shift to BSNL regional training centre.

गोरापंत शिवानी : स्त्री विमर्श

गौरा पंत 'शिवानी' का जन्म १७ अक्टूबर १९२३ को विजयादशमी के दिन गुजरात के पास राजकोट शहर में हुआ था। वे हिन्दी की सुप्रसिद्ध उपन्यासकार थीं। शिवानी आधुनिक विचारों की समर्थक थीं। गौरा पंत, जिन्होंने 'शिवानी' नाम से हिंदी में लिखा था, १९६० और १९७० के दशक की एक लोकप्रिय लेखिका थीं और महिला-केंद्रित कथा लेखन में अग्रणी थीं। उनके पिता कुमाऊँ अल्मोड़ा के ब्राम्हण थे। उनकी माँ लखनऊ महिला विद्यालय की पहली छात्राओं में से थीं और संस्कृत की विद्वान बनीं। **शिवानी के पिता श्री अश्विनीकुमार पाण्डे राजकोट में स्थित राजकुमार कॉलेज के प्रिंसिपल थे, जो कालांतर में रामपुर आदि रियासतों में दीवान भी रहे। शिवानी के माता और पिता दोनों ही विद्वान, संगीत प्रेमी और कई भाषाओं के ज्ञाता थे। शिवानी ने पश्चिम बंगाल के शांति निकेतन से बी.ए. किया। साहित्य और संगीत के प्रति गहरा रुझान 'शिवानी' को अपने माता और पिता से ही मिला।**



हिंदी साहित्य जगत में शिवानी एक ऐसी शख्सियत रहीं, जिनकी हिंदी, संस्कृत, गुजराती, बंगाली, उर्दू तथा अंग्रेजी पर अच्छी पकड़ थी और जो अपनी कृतियों में उत्तर भारत के कुमायूँ क्षेत्र के आसपास की लोक संस्कृति की झलक दिखलाने और किरदारों के बेमिसाल चरित्र चित्रण करने के लिए जानी गईं। १९३५ में महज १२ वर्ष की उम्र में पहली कहानी प्रकाशित होने से लेकर उनके निधन तक उनका लेखन निरंतर जारी रहा। उनकी अधिकतर कहानियाँ और उपन्यास नारी प्रधान रहे। इसमें उन्होंने नायिका के सौंदर्य और उसके चरित्र का वर्णन बड़े दिलचस्प अंदाज़ में किया। उन्हें और उनके भाई और बहन को विश्व भारती में पढ़ने के लिए शांति निकेतन भेजा गया। उन्होंने बंगाली में अपने अनुभवों के बारे में एक किताब भी लिखी, जिसका नाम आमदार शांतिनिकेतन है। रवींद्रनाथ टैगोर खुद कई बार उनके अल्मोड़ा स्थित घर आए। शिवानी ने १९४३ में विश्व भारती से स्नातक की उपाधि प्राप्त की, और लेखन को गंभीरता से लेने का फैसला किया। १९५१ में उनकी पहली वयस्क लघुकथा धर्मयुग में 'शिवानी' नाम से प्रकाशित हुई और पढ़ने वालों के बीच उनका दृढ़ नाम जाना जाने लगा। उन्होंने जल्द ही नियमित रूप से उपन्यास लिखना शुरू कर दिया, जिसमें लगभग चालीस कृतियों का निर्माण किया गया, जिनमें से कई उसके मूल कुमाऊँ में स्थापित थीं। उन्होंने नॉन-फिक्शन भी लिखा, दो यात्रा वृत्तांत और अपराधिनी नामक एक पुस्तक का निर्माण किया, आजीवन कारावास की सजा काट रही महिलाओं के साक्षात्कारों का संग्रह। नारी जीवन को लेखन के माध्यम से नवीन आयाम देने वाली रचनाकार शिवानी के शताब्दी वर्ष पर उन्हें शत-शत नमन।

रांगेय राघव : जन्म शताब्दी वर्ष

रांगेय राघव जी का जन्म १७ जनवरी १९२३ में उत्तर प्रदेश के आगरा जिले में हुआ था। इनका मूल नाम ततिरुमल्लै नम्बकम वीरराघव आचार्य था। इनके पिता का नाम रंगाचार्य, उनकी माता का नाम कंकावल्ली था तथा उनकी पत्नी का नाम सुलोचना था। रांगेयराघव जी ने अपनी शिक्षा १९४४ में संत जोन्स कॉलेज से की थी तथा उन्होंने १९४८ में आगरा यूनिवर्सिटी से गुरु गोरखनाथ पर पीएचडी की। राघव जी की मूल भाषा तमिल थी। वे हिंदी, अंग्रेजी, ब्रज और संस्कृत के भी ज्ञाता थे। रांगेय राघव ने अपने ३९ वर्ष के जीवन काल में कहानी, नाटक, कविताएं, साहित्य,



रिपोर्ट्स सहित आलोचना तथा संस्कृति और सभ्यता पर १५० से अधिक पुस्तकों की रचना की। उनके बारे में कहा जाता था कि जितने समय में कोई व्यक्ति एक किताब पढ़ता, उतने समय में वे एक किताब लिख देते थे। रांगेय राघव जी को कई पुरस्कारों से सम्मान दिया गया। उन्हें हिंदुस्तान अकादमी पुरस्कार (१९४७), डालमिया पुरस्कार (१९५४), उत्तर प्रदेश शासन पुरस्कार (१९५७ तथा १९५९), राजस्थान साहित्य अकादमी पुरस्कार (१९६१), महात्मा गांधी पुरस्कार (१९६६) यह पुरस्कार दिए गए। शेक्सपियर की किताबों के बेहतरीन अनुवाद करने के लिये उन्हें हिंदी का शेक्सपियर भी कहते हैं। रांगेयराघव जी की प्रथम रचना १९४६ में "घरौंदा" शीर्षक से प्रकाशित हुई। यह विश्वविद्यालय पर लिखा गया पहला उपन्यास था। घरौंदा उपन्यास से वे प्रगतिशील कथाकार के रूप में चर्चित हुए। १९४२ में अकालग्रस्त बंगाल की यात्रा के बाद उन्होंने रिपोर्ट्स "तूफान के बीच" लिखा। जिसे खूब प्रसिद्धि मिली। साहित्य के अलावा उन्हें चित्रकला और पुरातत्व में भी रुचि थी।

राघवजी ने अपने ऐतिहासिक उपन्यास उन चरित्रों से जुड़ी महिलाओं पर लिखे गए हैं। जैसे – "भारती का सपूत" जो भारतेंदु हरिश्चंद्र पर आधारित है तथा "देवकी का बेटा" जो कृष्ण के जीवन पर आधारित है। ऐसे और भी उपन्यास हैं जो महिलाओं के चरित्र से जुड़े हुए हैं। इसके अलावा रांगेय राघव जी ने पौराणिक और ऐतिहासिक पत्रों को उस समय एक स्त्री के नजरिए से देखने की कोशिश की, जब हिंदी साहित्य में आधुनिक स्त्री विमर्श का पर्दापण भी ठीक से नहीं हुआ था। उनकी कहानी "गदल" आधुनिक स्त्री विमर्श की कसौटी पर खरी उतरती है। यह कहानी बहुत लोकप्रिय हुई। जिनका अनेक विदेशी भाषाओं में अनुवाद भी हुआ। रांगेय राघव जी की प्रसिद्ध उपन्यास "कब तक पुकारू" पर एक टेलीविजन धारावाहिक भी बना था। १९८४ में उनका दूसरा उपन्यास "मुर्दों का टीला" प्रकाशित हुआ। इसकी कहानी सिंधु घाटी सभ्यता पर आधारित थी। रांगेय राघव का लंबी बीमारी के कारण मात्र ३९ वर्ष की अल्प आयु में १२ सितंबर १९६२ को मुंबई में निधन हो गया। विरले ही ऐसे सतूत हुए हैं, जिन्होंने विधाता की ओर से कम उमर मिलने के बावजूद इस विश्व को इतना कुछ अवदान दे दिया कि आज भी अच्छे-अच्छे लेखक दातों तले उंगलियां दबाने को विवश हो जाते हैं। यदि इनकी इतनी जल्दी मृत्यु न हुई होती तो वे अधिक मापदंड स्थापित करते तथा और भी रचनाएं लिखते। ऐसे विशिष्ट व्यक्तित्व के धनी श्री रांगेय राघव जी को मैं शत-शत नमन करता हूँ।

हेमु कालाणी : शताब्दी वर्ष

हेमु कालाणी भारत के एक क्रांतिकारी एवं स्वतंत्रता संग्राम सेनानी थे। हेमु कालाणी का जन्म २३ मार्च सन् १९२३ को सख्खर में हुआ था। उनके पिताजी का नाम पेसूमल कालाणी एवं उनकी माँ का नाम जेठी बाई था।



जब वे किशोर अवस्था के थे तब उन्होंने अपने साथियों के साथ विदेशी वस्तुओं का बहिष्कार किया और लोगों से स्वदेशी वस्तुओं का उपयोग करने का आग्रह किया। सन् १९४२ में जब महात्मा गांधी ने भारत छोड़ो आंदोलन चलाया तो हेमु इसमें कूद पड़े। १९४२ में उन्हें यह गुप्त जानकारी मिली कि अंग्रेजी सेना की हथियारों से भरी रेलगाड़ी रोहड़ी शहर से होकर गुजरेगी।

हेमु कालाणी अपने साथियों के साथ रेल पटरी को अस्त-व्यस्त करने की योजना बनाई। वे यह सब कार्य अत्यंत गुप्त तरीके से कर रहे थे पर फिर भी वहाँ पर तैनात पुलिस कर्मियों की नजर उन पर पड़ी और उन्होंने हेमु कालाणी को गिरफ्तार कर लिया और उनके साथी फरार हो गए।

हेमु कालाणी को कोर्ट ने फांसी की सजा सुनाई। उस समय के सिंध के गणमान्य लोगों ने एक पेटिशन दायर की और वायसराय से उनको फांसी की सजा ना देने की अपील की। वायसराय ने इस शर्त पर यह स्वीकार किया कि हेमु कालाणी अपने साथियों का नाम और पता बताए पर हेमु कालाणी ने यह शर्त अस्वीकार कर दी।

जनवरी १९४३ को उन्हें फांसी की सजा दी गई। जब फांसी से पहले उनसे आखरी इच्छा पूछी गई तो उन्होंने भारतवर्ष में फिर से जन्म लेने की इच्छा जाहिर की। इन्कलाब जिंदाबाद और भारत माता की जय की घोषणा के साथ उन्होंने फांसी को स्वीकार किया।

भगतसिंह को अपना आदर्श मानने वाले हेमनदास कालाणी भारतीय स्वतंत्रता सेनानी थे। वह स्वराज सेना के नेता था, एक छात्र संगठन जो अखिल भारतीय छात्र संघ से संबंध था। वह देश के स्वतंत्रता संग्राम के लिए शहीद होने वाले सबसे कम उम्र के क्रांतिकारियों में से एक थे, जिन्हें ब्रिटिश औपनिवेशिक अधिकारियों द्वारा उनके २० वें जन्मदिन से दो महीने पहले केवल १९ वर्ष की उम्र में फांसी दी गई थी।

भारतीय कप्तान का पहला टेस्ट कप्तान क्रिकेट - के. नायडू (१८९५-१९५७)

नायडू को सात साल की उम्र में स्कूल टीम में शामिल किया गया था, और उन्होंने १९१६ से बॉन्चे त्रिकोणीय में प्रथम श्रेणी में प्रवेश किया। यूरोपीय लोगों के खिलाफ हिंदुओं के लिए, वह नं. ९ में बल्लेबाजी करने के लिए आए। अपनी टीम के साथ ७९ में ७ नंबर के लिए ७९ रनों को भूमिका निभाई थी। उसने अपने छह अलग अलग दशकों को अवरुद्ध कर दिया। उसने १९५६-५७ में रणजी ट्रॉफी में अपना अंतिम प्रदर्शन किया। ६२ वर्ष की आयु उत्तर प्रदेश के लिए अपनी अंतिम



पारी में ५२ रन बनाए थे। इससे पहले सीजन में उन्होंने राजस्थान के खिलाफ ८४ रन बनाए थे, जिसमें दो छक्के लगाए थे। ८४ रनों के पारी ने नायडू को प्रथम श्रेणी क्रिकेट मैच में अपनी उम्र या उससे अधिक स्कोर करने वाले सबसे उम्रदराज खिलाड़ी के रूप में रिकार्ड बनाया। उनकी अंतिम आउटिंग १९६३-६४ में एक चैरिटी मैच में हुई थी, जब उन्होंने महाराष्ट्र के मुख्यमंत्री के इलेवन के खिलाफ महाराष्ट्र के राज्यपाल के लिए खेला था। इन्होंने अपने टेस्ट कैरियर में कुल ०७ टेस्ट मैच खेले थे, जिसमें २५०० की औसत से मात्र ३५० रन बनाए थे। साथ ही इन्होंने गेंदबाजी करने पर ०९ विकेट भी लिए थे। सी.के. नायडू के नाम किसी एक सीजन में इंग्लैंड में सर्वाधिक छक्के (किसी विदेशी खिलाड़ी द्वारा) लगाने का रिकार्ड है। उन्होंने वर्ष १९३२ में इंग्लैंड में ३२ छक्के लगाए थे। सी.के. नायडू भारतीय क्रिकेट टीम में टेस्ट मैच के पहले कप्तान थे जिन्होंने अपने अंतरराष्ट्रीय क्रिकेट कैरियर की शुरुआत २५ जून १९३२ को इंग्लैंड क्रिकेट टीम के खिलाफ टेस्ट क्रिकेट मैच से की थी।

सी.के. नायडू के पुरस्कार और सम्मान

नायडू को १९३३ में विजडन द्वारा 'क्रिकेटर ऑफ द ईयर' चुना गया। सी.के. नायडू भारत के पहले क्रिकेटर थे जिन्हें सरकार द्वारा 'पद्मभूषण' (१९५६) देकर सम्मानित किया गया। जो भारत का तीसरा बड़ा राष्ट्रीय पुरस्कार है।

सी.के. नायडू - पद्म भूषण से सम्मानित होने वाले पहले भारतीय खिलाड़ी (१९९१)

कोटेरी कनकैया नायडू पूर्व भारतीय क्रिकेट खिलाड़ी थे। इन्होंने अपने क्रिकेट कैरियर की शुरुआत सिर्फ ७ साल की उम्र में कर दी थी। वह भारतीय क्रिकेट के पहले टेस्ट कप्तान रहे थे। सी.के. नायडू का कद ६ फुट से भी ऊंचा था। वह दाहिने हाथ के खिलाड़ी थे। कर्नल कोटारी कैंकैया नायडू को प्यार से सभी लोग सी.के. कह कर पुकारा करते थे। इन्होंने अपने अंतरराष्ट्रीय क्रिकेट कैरियर की शुरुआत २५ जून १९३२ को इंग्लैंड क्रिकेट टीम के खिलाफ टेस्ट क्रिकेट मैच से की थी।

सी.के. नायडू का जन्म

सी.के. नायडू का जन्म ३१ अक्टूबर १८९५ को नागपुर, महाराष्ट्र (भारत) में हुआ। इनका पूरा नाम कोटरी कनकैया नायडू था। इनके पिता का नाम कोठारी सूर्य प्रकाश राव नायडू था।

सी.के. नायडू का निधन

सी.के. नायडू की मृत्यु १४ नवंबर १९६७ में ७२ वर्ष की आयु में इंदौर, मध्यप्रदेश में हो गयी थी।

रेल संग्रहालय, नागपुर

नागपुर के कामठी रोड़ पर कड़बी चौक पर स्थित यह नैरो गेज रेल संग्रहालय भारत में अपनी तरह का एकमात्र संग्रहालय है। इसका उद्घाटन १४ दिसंबर २००२ को हुआ था। ४.५ एकड़ के क्षेत्र में फैले इस संग्रहालय में भारतीय रेल्वे की कई पुरानी और विरासत वस्तुओं की एक तरह की प्रदर्शनी है। इसमें मुख्य रूप से लोकोमोटिव और गाड़ी के मॉडल, हैंड लैंप, पुराने टेलीफोन सेट आदि शामिल हैं। नैरो गेज, रेल संग्रहालय नागपुर का एक अनूठा संग्रहालय है। यह एक सूचना पार्क के रूप में कार्य करता है, जो नैरो गेज प्रणाली के कामकाज के बारे में जानकारी प्रदान करता है संग्रहालय भारतीय रेल्वे के घटनापूर्ण इतिहास को संरक्षित करने के लिए समर्पित है। इसमें प्रदर्शन पर ट्रेनों के कामकाजी मॉडल, विभिन्न राज्य रेल्वे के लोगो, वास्तविक संकीर्ण गेज रोलिंग स्टॉक स्टीम इंजन, फोटोग्राफ, विदेशी लोकोमोटिव और बिल्डर प्लेट्स के साथी दीर्घाएं हैं।



यह मुख्य रूप से रेल्वे की विरासत की एक झलक पाने के इच्छुक आगंतुको के लिए है। इसके अलावा, संग्रहालय में बच्चों के लिए एक मनोरंजन पार्क, टॉय ट्रेन और टिकटों का एक दुर्लभ संग्रह भी है।

१. यहाँ विभिन्न आयु वर्ग के बच्चों के खेलने के लिए बहुत सी चीजें हैं। मेरीगो-राऊंड, खींचो, झूले, आरी जैसी चीजें बच्चों का मनोरंजन करती हैं।
२. यार्ड में एक जर्जर शेड में कोलियर वैगन, पेट्रोल वैगन, पलैट वैगन, कवर्ड वैगन जैसे विभिन्न प्रकार के माल वैगन प्रदर्शित किए जाते हैं। इन वैगनों के साथ यात्रियों को ले जाने वाले कोच जैसे; एक प्रथम श्रेणी के कोच, डाक वैन कोच और रेल बस को भी प्रदर्शित किया गया है।
३. मोतीबाग में स्थित नैरो गेज रेल संग्रहालय नागपुर शहर का आकर्षण बन रहा है।
४. यह देश के केवल दो संग्रहालयों में से एक है जिसमें नैरो गेज स्टीम और डीजल इंजन, नैरो-गेज कोच और मालगाड़ी के कोच जैसे ऐतिहासिक स्मारक सार्वजनिक रूप से प्रदर्शित हैं।
५. दक्षिण पूर्व मध्य रेल्वे जोन ने संग्रहालय में जंगली जानवरों की प्रतिकृति भी स्थापित की है जो इसे और अधिक बच्चों को आकर्षित करने के लिए एक प्राकृतिक स्पर्श देता है।
६. लोगों के लिए अपने परिवार और दोस्तों के साथ फोटो लेने के लिए एक सेल्फी बूथ भी है।

अजब बंगला

नागपुर का अजब बंगला केंद्रीय संग्रहालय स्थानीय रूप से अजब बंगला के रूप में जाना जाता है, नागपुर का इस केंद्रीय संग्रहालय में पुरावशेष, सिक्कों, प्राचीन शिलालेखों और पूर्व-ऐतिहासिक कलाकृतियों के दुर्लक्ष संग्रह है, जिसमें से कुछ सिंधु घाटी सभ्यता से संबंधित है, हालाँकि, प्राकृतिक और सांस्कृतिक विरासत का यह भंडार अभी भी आने वाले पर्यटकों के साथ-साथ नागपुर शहर के अधिकांश निवासियों के लिए काफी हद तक अज्ञात है।



हाल ही में, इस केंद्रीय संग्रहालय में प्रमुख नवीनीकरण कार्य हुए हैं जिनमें उद्यान और एक कैफेटेरिया के प्रावधान शामिल हैं। अजब बंगला मूल रूप से अंग्रेजों द्वारा १८६३ में स्थापित किया गया था जब ऑरेज सिटी मध्य प्रांत का हिस्सा था। इतिहास के साथ-साथ, यह संग्रहालय यदि मध्य भारत के वनस्पतियों और जीवों की एक अच्छी किस्म की विशेषता है, जिसमें भरवां जानवरों और पक्षियों का विशाल संग्रह शामिल है। प्रदर्शन सुविधाओं और दीर्घाओं की अपर्याप्तता के कारण कई महत्वपूर्ण कलाकृतियाँ अभी भी आरक्षित संग्रह के भीतर बंद हैं, नागपुर में यह केंद्रीय संग्रहालय अत्यधिक कम है और तेजी से बदलते सामाजिक और सांस्कृतिक वातावरण से निपटने की कोशिश कर रहा है। पुरातत्व और संग्रहालय निदेशालय द्वारा प्रबंधित, अजब बंगला ने रानी विक्टोरिया की मूर्ति सहित प्रसिद्ध कलाकृतियों को बहाल करने और संरक्षित करने के लिए हाल ही में मुंबई से विशेषज्ञों को बुलाया है।

हाल ही में, केंद्रीय संग्रहालय का एक प्रमुख नवीकरण कार्य हुआ है, जिसमें उद्यानों और एक कैफेटेरिया के प्रावधान शामिल हैं।

प्राकृतिक इतिहास संग्रह :- इस गैलरी में डायनासोर के जीवाश्म, खनिज पत्थर, सींग, सरीसृप, मछली और अकशेरुकी जीवों के दुर्लभ संग्रह हैं। डायनासोर के जीवाश्मों में से एक लगभग ६७.५ मिलियन वर्ष पुराना है।

मूर्तिकला संग्रह :- इस दीर्घा में मौर्य काल से लेकर मराठा काल तक बुद्ध, विष्णु और अन्य पौराणिक आकृतियों की पत्थर की मूर्तियों का संग्रह है।

अर्थव्यवस्था

नागपुर भारत का एक उभरता हुआ महानगर है और सबसे तेजी से बढ़ता करोडपति शहर भी है। नागपुर शुरुआती दिनों से विदर्भ क्षेत्र में वाणिज्य का मुख्य केंद्र रहा है और एक महत्वपूर्ण व्यापारिक स्थान है। इंस्टीट्यूट फॉर कॉम्पिटिटिवनेस ने अपनी २०१२ की रिपोर्ट में इस शहर को देश के ११ वे सबसे प्रतिस्पर्धी शहर का दर्जा दिया है। यह शहर बैंकिंग क्षेत्र के लिए महत्वपूर्ण है क्योंकि यह भारतीय रिजर्व बैंक के क्षेत्रीय कार्यालय की मेजबानी करता है, जिसे १० सितंबर १९५६ को खोला गया था। भारतीय रिजर्व बैंक की नागपुर में दो शाखाएँ हैं जिनमें से एक में भारत की संपूर्ण सोने की संपत्ति है।



मध्य नागपुर में सीताबर्डी बाजार, जिसे शहर के दिल के रूप में जाना जाता है, प्रमुख वाणिज्यिक बाजार क्षेत्र इतवारी है, महल क्षेत्र भी बड़ी संख्या में छोटे व्यवसायों की मेजबानी करते हैं और खरीददारी के लिए बहुत प्रसिद्ध है। कलमना एशिया में संतरे और अनाज के सबसे बड़े थोक बाजारों में से एक है।

क्षेत्रफल की दृष्टि से बुटीबोरी औद्योगिक क्षेत्र पूरे एशिया में सबसे बड़ा है एस्टेट की सबसे बड़ी इकाई इंडोरामा सिंथेटिक्स की है, जो सिंथेटिक पॉलिएस्टर यार्न बनाती है। बुटीबोरी में अन्य इकाइयों में पावर ट्रांसमिशन कंपनी केईसी, हुंडई यूनिटेक, एसीसी निहोन कार्स्टिंग्स लिमिटेड शामिल है। कोराडी थर्मल पावर स्टेशन और खापरखेड़ा थर्मल पावर स्टेशन है और एमएसपीजीसीएल द्वारा संचालित है। एनटीपीसी में सुपर थर्मल पावर प्लांट है। मौदा से नागपुर से लगभग ४० किमी दूर जिसका पहला संयंत्र चालू हो गया है।

शहर के पश्चिमी छोर पर स्थित हिंगना औद्योगिक संबंध लगभग ९०० छोटे और मध्यम औद्योगिक इकाइयों से बना है। उनमें से प्रमुख है महिंद्रा एंड महिंद्रा का टैक्टर निर्माण संयंत्र, एनईसीओ लिमिटेड की कार्स्टिंग इकाइयां, अंतर्राष्ट्रीय दहन की इकाइयां, बजाज ऑटो समूह, कैडिको और संविजय समूह (मध्य भारत में लंबे उत्पादों के लिए कंपनियों का सबसे बड़ा स्टील रोलिंग समूह)। नागपुर में आइसक्रीम निर्माता दिनशां, भारतीय झाई फूड निर्माता हल्दीराम, इंडियन रेडी टू कुक फूड निर्माता एक्टचावा और आयुर्वेदिक उत्पाद कंपनी विको और बैद्यनाथ का घर है।

रामटेक का साहित्यक इतिहास

इतिहास :-

रामटेक में राम का एक ऐतिहासिक मंदिर है। मान्यता है कि समीप ही ऋषि अगस्त्य का आश्रम था और श्रीराम ने अपने वनवास के दौरान यहाँ कुछ समय बिताया था। वर्तमान मंदिर का निर्माण रघुजी भोंसले ने करवाया था जो 9C वीं शताब्दी में नागपुर के मराठा शासक थे। उन्होंने छिंदवाड़ा में देवगढ़ के दुर्ग पर विजय प्राप्त के बाद यहाँ मंदिर बनवाया।



रामटेक का कवि कालिदास से भी सम्बन्ध है और माना जाता कि उन्होंने अपने मेघदूत महाकाव्य की कृति रामटेक की पहाड़ियों में करी।

महाराष्ट्र के नागपुर में करीबन 80 किलोमीटर दूर स्थित रामटेक मंदिर प्रभु राम का अद्भुत मंदिर है। इस मंदिर को लेकर ऐसी कहानी है कि भगवान राम ने वनवास के दौरान इस स्थान पर चार महीने तक माता सीता और भगवान लक्ष्मण के साथ समय बिताया था। इसके अलावा माता सीता ने यहां पहली रसोई भी बनाई थी, उन्होंने खाना बनाने के बाद स्थानीय ऋषियों को भोजन कराया था। इस बात का वर्णन पद्मपुराण में भी किया गया है।

राम नवमी के विशेष अवसर पर इस मंदिर के आसपास मेला लगता है, जिसमें दूर-दूर से लोग शामिल होने के लिए आते हैं। इसकी विशेषताओं की बात करें तो यह मन्दिर सिर्फ पत्थरों से बना है, जो एक दूसरे के ऊपर रखे हुए हैं। सैकड़ों लोग इसके पीछे शिल्पकला में बेजोड़ है।

एक छोटी पहाड़ी पर बने रामटेक मंदिर को गढ़ मंदिर भी कहा जाता है। इसके अलावा इसे सिंदूर गिरि भी कहते हैं। यह देखने में मंदिर कम किला अधिक लगता है, विशेष बात है कि इसके पूरब की ओर सुरनदी बहती है। रामटेक मंदिर का निर्माण राजा रछु खोलें ने एक किले के रूप में करवाया था। मंदिर के परिसर में एक तालाब भी है, जिसे लेकर ऐसी मान्यताएँ हैं कि इस तालाब में पानी कभी कम या ज्यादा नहीं होगा। हमेशा सामान्य जल स्तर होने की वजह से लोग काफी हैरान होते हैं। यही नहीं ऐसा माना जाता है कि जब भी बिजली चमकती है तो मंदिर के शिखर पर ज्योति प्रकाशित होती है, जिसमें भगवान राम का अक्स दिखाई देता है।

रामटेक ही वह स्थान है, जहाँ भगवान राम और ऋषि अगस्त्य मिल थे। ऋषि अगस्त्य ने ना सिर्फ राम को शास्त्रों का ज्ञान दिया था बल्कि उन्हें ब्रह्मास्त्र भी प्रदान किया। जब श्रीराम ने इस स्थान पर हर जगह हड्डियों का ढेर देखा तो उन्होंने बताया कि यह उन ऋषियों की हड्डियाँ हैं, जो यहां पूजा करते थे। यज्ञ और पूजा करते समय राक्षस विध्न डालते थे, जिसे जानने के बाद श्रीराम ने प्रतिज्ञा ली थी, कि वह उनका विनाश करेंगे। यही नहीं ऋषि अगस्त्य ने रावण के अत्याचारों के बारे में भी भगवान राम को यहीं बताया था। उसके दिए गए ब्रह्मास्त्र के जरिए ही भगवान राम रावण का वध कर पाए थे।

राष्ट्रगान और नागपुर का भारत संबंध

भारत का राष्ट्रगान 'जन गण मन' है, जो मूलतः बांग्ला भाषा में गुरुदेव रवीन्द्रनाथ ठाकुर द्वारा लिखा गया था, जिसे भारत सरकार द्वारा २४ जनवरी १९५० को राष्ट्रगान के रूप में अंगीकृत किया गया। इस राष्ट्रगान की पंक्तियाँ गुरुदेव रवीन्द्रनाथ ठाकुर के गीत भारतो भाग्यो विधाता से ली गई है। जॉर्ज पंचम का भारत में ३० दिसंबर १९११ को आगमन हुआ। लेकिन रविंद्रनाथ द्वारा रचित राष्ट्रगीत उनके आने से पूर्व ही २७ सितंबर १९११ को कलकता में आयोजित कांग्रेस के २६ वे अधिवेशन में पहली बार सार्वजनिक रूप से गाया गया था। आजाद हिंद सेना की बागडोर नेताजी सुभाषचंद्र बोस के हाथों में आने के बाद 'जन गण मन....' गीत राष्ट्रीय गान के रूप में स्वीकार किया गया।

इसमें ५ पद हैं जिसके गाने के लिए ५२ सेकंड का समय लगता है, यह मूलभूत रूप से बांग्ला में लिखा गया है, जिसे नोबेल पुरस्कार विजेता साहित्यकार रविंद्रनाथ टैगोर ने लिखा है, इसी तरह टैगोर की एक और रचना 'सोनारबांग्ला' है, जिसे बांग्लादेश में राष्ट्रगान का दर्जा हासिल है।

नागपुर के गोलीबार चौक से राष्ट्रगान गाया था आज ९० वर्ष के श्यामराव खतने ने उन दिनों की यादों को ताजा करते हुए कहा कि उस समय हम पूरे जोश के साथ राष्ट्रगान गाते थे।

नागपुर में क्रांतिकारियों के आंदोलन को कुचलने के लिए अंग्रेजों ने २१ जनवरी १९२१ को भीड़ पर गोलीबार की थी यह स्थान आज गोलीबार चौक के नाम से जाना जाता है। इसमें नागपुर के ९ सपूत शहीद हुए थे। हरिश्चंद्र, राजा गणेश, बापू माधो, हरबा फकीरा, सखाराम दारबा, बाज्या, हीराजी महादेव बोंबाले (मौदेकर) और बापुण्या मारोति टेंबे शहीद हुए थे। १९७६ में उनके बलिदान के क्षणों की स्मृति में तत्कालीन पार्षद श्यामराव खापरे ने गोलीबार चौक में शहीद स्मारक बनवाया था जिसका २ मई १९७० को उद्घाटन हुआ था।

नागपुर : आर्थिक योगदान

नागपुर भारत के महाराष्ट्र राज्य का तीसरा सबसे बड़ा शहर और शीतकालीन राजधानी है। यह जनसंख्या के हिसाब से भारत का 93 वां सबसे बड़ा शहर है और ऑक्सफोर्ड की अर्थशास्त्र रिपोर्ट के अनुसार, नागपुर को 2019 से 2034 तक 8.49% की औसत वृद्धि के साथ दुनिया का पांचवां सबसे तेजी से बढ़ने वाला शहर होने का अनुमान है। इसे महाराष्ट्र के स्मार्ट शहरों में से एक के रूप में प्रस्तावित किया गया है और यह स्मार्ट सिटी परियोजना निष्पादन में भारत के शीर्ष उस शहरों में से एक है।



केंद्रीय शहरी विकास मंत्रालय द्वारा दी गई 900 विकासशील स्मार्ट शहरों की नवीनतम रैंकिंग में, नागपुर महाराष्ट्र राज्य में पहले और भारत में दूसरे स्थान पर रहा। "ऑरेंज सिटी" के रूप में जाना जाने वाला, नागपुर अधिकाधिक तौर पर महाराष्ट्र राज्य का सबसे हरा-भरा, सबसे सुरक्षित और सबसे तकनीकी रूप से विकसित शहर बन गया है। नागपुर महाराष्ट्र राज्य विधानसभा के वार्षिक शीतकालीन सत्र की सीट है। यह महाराष्ट्र के विदर्भ क्षेत्र का एक प्रमुख वाणिज्यिक और राजनीतिक केंद्र है। इसके अलावा, शहर दलित बौद्ध आंदोलन और हिंदू संगठन आरएसएस के मुख्यालय के लिए एक महत्वपूर्ण स्थान होने के कारण अद्वितीय महत्व प्राप्त करता है। नागपुर को दीक्षाभूमि के लिए भी जाना जाता है, जिसे ए श्रेणी के पर्यटन और तीर्थ स्थल के रूप में वर्गीकृत किया गया है, जो दुनिया के सभी बौद्ध स्तूपों में सबसे बड़ा खोखला स्तूप है। बंबई उच्च न्यायालय की क्षेत्रीय शाखा भी शहर के भीतर स्थित है।

एबीपी न्यूज - इप्सोस के एक सर्वेक्षण के अनुसार, नागपुर को 2013 में भारत में सबसे अच्छे शहर के रूप में पहचाना गया था, रहने की क्षमता, हरियाली, सार्वजनिक परिवहन और स्वास्थ्य देखभाल सूचकांकों में शीर्ष पर शहर का 20 वां घोषित किया गया था। स्वच्छ सर्वेक्षण 2016 के अनुसार भारत का सबसे स्वच्छ शहर और पश्चिमी क्षेत्र में शीर्ष स्थान। इसे स्वच्छ सर्वेक्षण 2017 में नवाचार और सर्वोत्तम अभ्यास के लिए सर्वश्रेष्ठ शहर के रूप में सम्मानित किया गया। इसे स्वच्छ भारत मिशन के तहत जनवरी 2017 में भी खुले में शौच मुक्त घोषित किया गया था। यह भारत में महिलाओं के लिए सबसे सुरक्षित शहरों में से एक है। यह शहर भारत के 999 शहरों में ईज ऑफ लिविंग इंडेक्स 2020 में 24 वें स्थान पर है। वर्ष 2017 के लिए प्रतिस्पर्धात्मकता संस्थान द्वारा इसे देश में 7 वां सबसे प्रतिस्पर्धी शहर का दर्जा दिया गया था।

यह नागपुर संतरे के लिए प्रसिद्ध है और कभी-कभी इस क्षेत्र के बड़े हिस्से में संतरे की खेती का एक प्रमुख व्यापार केंद्र होने के कारण इसे ऑरेंज सिटी के रूप में जाना जाता है। इसे टाइगर कैपिटल ऑफ इंडिया या टाइगर गेटवे ऑफ इंडिया भी कहा जाता है क्योंकि शहर में और उसके आसपास कई टाइगर रिजर्व स्थित हैं और राष्ट्रीय बाघ संरक्षण प्राधिकरण के क्षेत्रीय कार्यालय की मेजबानी भी करता है।

बढ़ती हुई महँगाई तथा कम विकास दर

महँगाई आज बढ़ रही है पर ये कौन सी नई बात है ये बात तो हर व्यक्ति सदियों से बोल रहे है पर उस समय विकास की दर भी बढ़ रही थी, परंतु भारत आज ऐसी परिस्थिति में फँस रहा है जहाँ महँगाई जितनी तेजी से बढ़ रही है उस तेजी से विकास नहीं हो रहा है।



किसी भी समस्या को हल करने के लिए हमें उस समस्या की शुरुआत कहाँ से हुई है वह जानना जरूरी है। जब भारत में कोरोना काल की शुरुआत हुई तो सरकार ने लोगों के पास पैसे पहुँचाना शुरू किया जिस से के लोगों को जीवन व्यापन के लिए पैसे प्राप्त हो जो उस समय उन परिस्थिति के लिए सही थी। साथ ही साथ RBI ने ऋण की ब्याज दर भी कम कर दी जिस से कि अर्थव्यवस्था में भी साख की मात्रा बढ़े और विकास दर सामान्य बनी रहे उस समय यह नीतियाँ सही थी।

जब कोरोना काल का अंत हुआ और अर्थव्यवस्था में साख की मात्रा अधिक थी। जिससे सरकार तथा RBI को यह लग रहा था कि विकास दर बहुत तेजी से बढ़ेगी परंतु भारत तथा संपूर्ण विश्व में विपरीत हुआ विकास की दर उस प्रतिशत में नहीं बढ़ी जिस अनुपात में अर्थव्यवस्था में साख थी तथा साख अधिक रहने का प्रभाव यह हुआ कि महँगाई बढ़ने लगी। सरकार के लिए यह समस्या दो धारी तलवार की तरह हो गई है। जिस में वह यदि अर्थव्यवस्था में साख बढ़ाते है तो महँगाई भी बढ़ेगी और विकास दर भी बढ़ेगी। और यदि साख कम करेंगे तो विकास दर तथा महँगाई दोनों ही कम हो जाएगी।

इस परिस्थिति में RBI द्वारा उचित कदम उठाए जा रहे हैं। जैसे कि ऋण पर ब्याज दर बढ़ाई जा रही है जैसे के सितंबर में ब्याज दर को 5.40% रखा गया था उसे दिसम्बर में बढ़ाकर 6.15% किया गया है और महँगाई प्रतिशत अक्टूबर में 7.41% था तथा अभी जो आँकड़े आए है उन के अनुसार यह प्रतिशत 6.77% पर आ गया है।

बड़े-बड़े अर्थशास्त्री यह कहते है कि किसी भी अर्थव्यवस्था में महँगाई प्रतिशत 6% से अधिक नहीं रहना चाहिए। क्योंकि इससे अर्थव्यवस्था में समस्या उत्पन्न होती है।

रामटेक का साहित्यक इतिहास

रामटेक महाराष्ट्र की शीतकालीन राजधानी नागपुर से करीब ४८ किलोमीटर दूर और ऊँची पहाड़ियों पर स्थित है। रामटेक को 'सिंदूरगिरि' भी कहते हैं। इसके पूर्व की ओर 'सुरनदी' या 'सूर्यनदी' बहती है। इस स्थान पर प्रभु राम का अद्भुत मंदिर है। साथ ही यहां पर महर्षि अगस्त्य का आश्रम भी है, जहां वनवास के दौरान राम, सीता और लक्ष्मण ४ मास तक रुके थे। ऐसा माना जाता है कि सीता ने अपने वनवास की पहली रसोई भी रामटेक यानी अगस्त्य मुनि के आश्रम में ही बनाई थी, जहां श्रीराम ने पत्नी सीता और भाई लक्ष्मण के साथ सभी ऋषि-मुनियों को भोजन कराया था।



वर्तमान मंदिर का निर्माण रघुजी भोंसले ने करवाया था, जो १८ वीं शताब्दी में नागपुर के मराठा शासक थे। उन्होंने छिंदवाड़ा में देवगढ़ किले पर जीत के बाद करवाया था। मंदिर के रास्ते में एक स्थान का वर्णन मिलता है, जिसे रामगिरि कहा जाता है। इसी स्थापन पर कवि कालिदास ने अपनी सबसे चर्चित रचना मेघदूत लिखी थी। ऐसा कहा जाता है कि प्राचीन काल का रामगिरि ही आज का रामटेक है। त्रेता युग में यहां केवल एक पहाड़ हुआ करता था।

रामटेक में श्रीराम से ऋषि अगस्त्य मिले थे। इन्होंने ही भगवान राम को शास्त्रों का ज्ञान और साथ ही ब्रम्हास्त्र भी दिया था। इस ब्रम्हास्त्र की मदद से ही भगवान राम रावण का वध कर पाए थे। कहा जाता है कि ऋषि अगस्त्य ने रावण के अत्याचारों के बारे में भी भगवान राम को इसी जगह पर बताया था। रामटेक भौगोलिक रूप से 21-4°N 79-33°E पर स्थित है। इसकी औसत उंचाई ३४५ मीटर (११३१ फीट) है। खिंदुसी झील रामटेक के महत्वपूर्ण पर्यटक आकर्षणों में से एक है।

जनगणना २०११ द्वारा जारी रिपोर्ट के अनुसार रामटेक नगर परिषद की जनसंख्या २२,३१० है, जिसमें से ११,३२१ पुरुष हैं जबकि १०,९८९ महिलाएं हैं। ०-६ वर्ष की आयु वाले बच्चों की जनसंख्या २१९३ है। रामटेक नगर परिषद में महिला लिंग अनुपात ९२९ के राज्य औसत के मुकाबले ९७१ है। इसके अलावा रामटेक में बाल लिंग अनुपात ८९४ के महाराष्ट्र राज्य के औसत की तुलना में लगभग ९०२ है। रामटेक शहर की साक्षरता दर राज्य के औसत ८२.३४% से ८९.५३% अधिक है। रामटेक में, पुरुष साक्षरता लगभग ९४.०६% है जबकि महिला साक्षरता दर ८४.८९% है।

इसकी विशेषताओं की बात करें तो यह मन्दिर सिर्फ पत्थरों से बना है, जो एक दूसरे के ऊपर रखे हुए हैं। सैंकड़ों वर्ष पुराना यह मंदिर जस का तस है, स्थानीय लोग इसके पीछे भगवान राम की कृपा बताते हैं। मंदिर के प्रांगण में एक तालाब भी है, जिसका जल स्तर कभी भी कम या ज्यादा नहीं होता है, ऐसा माना जाता है कि जब भी बिजली चमकती है तो मंदिर के शिखर पर ज्योति प्रकाशित होती है, जिसमें भगवान राम का अक्स दिखाई देता है। इस तरह उपरोक्त विवेचन से स्पष्ट है कि रामटेक भौगोलिक, धार्मिक, ऐतिहासिक, साहित्यक और पर्यटन की दृष्टि से महत्वपूर्ण है।

मारबत – प्रतिरोध का एक ऐसा अनोखा पर्व है जो पूरी दुनिया में केवल नागपूर में मनाया जाता है।

नागपूर का 'मारबत' नामक पर्व में भ्रष्टाचार, झुठ, बेईमानी, शराबखोरी, अश्लीलता जैसी बुराईयों के पुतले जलाये जाते हैं, यह एक ऐसा पर्व है जो ब्रिटिश शासन का साथ देने वाले गद्दारों के खिलाफ विरोध प्रकट करने के लिए



और आजादी के दीवाने की याद में मनाया जाता है। आश्चर्य हो रहा होगा आपको जानकर कि क्या ऐसा भी कोई त्यौहार हो सकता है जिसका आधार धार्मिक न हो ?

इसके लिए हमें पिछली की पिछली सदी में जाना होगा। यह सन १८८१ की बात है, जब देश में अंग्रेजों के खिलाफ वातावरण बन रहा था, लेकिन देश का कुछ राजा रजवाड़े अंग्रेजों का साथ दे रहे थे और जरा सी लालच में उन्हें खुद पर शासन करने के लिए आमंत्रित कर रहे थे। उन्हीं में थी नागपुर की तत्कालीन शासक बका बाई भोसले, जिसने तात्या टोपे के विद्रोह के आग्रह को ठुकरा दिया और अपने सिपहसालारों और दरबारियों को लेकर अंग्रेजों के साथ हो गयी, फलस्वरूप नागपुर अंग्रेजों के अधीन हो गया लेकिन नागपुर की स्वतंत्रता प्रिय जनता से यह बर्दाश्त नहीं हुआ और उन्होंने अगले ही दिन अपने आक्रोश और विरोध को व्यक्त करने के लिए रानी का एक प्रतीकात्मक पुतला बनाया उसका जुलूस निकाला और उसे जला दिया।

यह जनता गरीब जरूर थी, पिछड़ी जाति की थी, दलित, शोषित, थी लेकिन स्वाभिमानि थी, देशभक्त थी, फिर तो यह हर साल की परंपरा बन गयी और सावन मास समाप्त होते ही सावन की अमावस्या या पोला पर्व के अगले दिन यह उत्सव के रूप में मनाया जाने लगा।

देश स्वतंत्र हुआ, अंग्रेज चले गये लेकिन यह परम्परा नहीं समाप्त हुई। अब भी देश में गद्दार तो थे ही साथ ही जनता के तमाम दुखों के रूप में आजादी के स्वप्न का मोहभंग भी था।

इसे धार्मिक रूप देने के लिए बाद में इसमें पूतना की कहानी भी जोड़ दी गयी। जिसका संहार कृष्णा ने किया था, यद्यपि यहाँ उसे पूतना मौसी कहा गया। जो इस बात का प्रतीक है यहाँ राक्षस, नाग, असुर आदि जाती होती थी।

हे मारबत, तू अपने साथ झुठ, धोखाघड़ी बेईमानी बुराई की भावना लेकर चली जा, हमारे सारे दुःख पीड़ा कष्ट, बेबसी, आंसु और जीने की बदतर स्थितियाँ लेकर चली जा।

नागपुर का नामकरण

नागपुर भारत के महाराष्ट्र राज्य का तीसरा सबसे बड़ा शहर है। यह महाराष्ट्र और भारत का एक प्रमुख नगर है और भारत के मध्य में स्थित है। नागपुर को महाराष्ट्र की उपराजधानी होने का दर्जा प्राप्त है।



नागपुर की स्थापना १७०२ में गोंड राजा (बख्त बुलंद शाह) ने किया था। नागपुर भारत का १३ वां व विश्व का ११४ वां सबसे बड़ा शहर है। यह नगर संतरो के लिये काफी मशहूर है। इसलिए लोग इसे संतरों की नगरी भी कहते हैं। नागपुर भारत देश का दूसरे नंबर का ग्रीनेस्टशहर (हरित शहर) माना जाता है।

नागपुर का नाम नाग नदी से रखा गया है। यह नदी नागपुर के पुराने हिस्से से गुजरती है। नागपुर में नाग सांप बहुत पाया जाता था। इस कारण से नागपुर का नाम नागपुर रखा गया।

यह शहर १९६० तक मध्य भारत राज्य की राजधानी थी। १९६० के बाद यहाँ की मराठी आबादी को देखते हुए इसे महाराष्ट्र के जिले के रूप में शामिल कर लिया गया। १८९० वर्ग किलोमीटर के क्षेत्र में फैले इस जिले में १३ तहसील और १९६९ गांव शामिल हैं।

नागपुर धार्मिक दृष्टिकोण से भी भारत का सबसे महत्वपूर्ण शहर है। यहाँ डॉ. भीमराव आंबेडकर ने १४ अक्टूबर १९५६ को सामूहिक रूप से बौद्धधर्म को अपनाया था। यह स्थल नागपुर में दीक्षाभूमि के नाम से जाना जाता है।

नागपुर का पुराना नाम नारंगपुर था। जब गोड़ राजा ने नागपुर को नाग नदी के तट पर विकसित किया तब यह नागपुर के नाम से जाना गया।

नागपुर में प्रसिद्ध स्थल अंबाझरी झील, बालाजी मंदिर, पोद्दारेश्वर राम मंदिर, दीक्षाभूमि, अदासा, रामटेक, खेकरानाला, मरकड, नगरधन, नवेगांव बांध, सेवाग्राम, सीताबर्डी किला आदि मशहूर स्थान हैं।

नागपुर में लगभग १०० से भी अधिक अभियांत्रिकी (इंजीनियरिंग) महाविद्यालय हैं। नागपुर विश्वविद्यालय महाराष्ट्र का एक बहुत बड़ा विश्वविद्यालय है।

नागपुर और भी स्थानों के लिए प्रसिद्ध है।

सीताबर्डी किला : नागपूर की आन

स्थापना

सीताबर्डी किला जो नागपूर महाराष्ट्र के ऊंची पहाड़ी पर स्थित है, मुधोल जी (दों भोसलें) अप्पा साहेब भोसले ने इस किले को बनाया था।



ब्रिटीश ईस्ट इंडिया कंपनी के खिलाफ तीसरे मुगलों मराठा युद्ध में लड़ाई करने से पूर्व इस किले का निर्माण किया गया था। अभी सीताबर्डी नागपुर का एक महत्वपूर्ण वाणिज्यिक केंद्र बन चुका है।

सीताबर्डी किले का इतिहास

सीताबर्डी के लड़ाई में जो ब्रिटीश सेना मारी गयी, उसे किले के कब्र में दफनाया गया। १८५७ के भारतीय विद्रोह में हारने के बाद टिपू सुल्तान का पोता नवाब कादर अली और उसके आठ सहकारी को सीताबर्डी किले पर फांसी दे दी गयी। जहाँ फांसी दी गयी वहाँ पर एक मस्जिद बनाई गयी। कब्र और मस्जिद की व्यवस्था भारतीय सेना द्वारा कि जाती है जो मरनेवालों की वीरता का प्रतीक है।

महात्मा गांधी :-

महात्मा गांधी को १० अप्रैल से १५ मई १९२३ तक इस किले पर बंदी बनाया था। इंग्लैंड के राजा जॉर्ज ड और रानी मॅरी ने इस किले पर से नागपुर के लोगों से भेट दी थी। इस घटना को याद रखने के लिए किले पर एक स्तंभ बनवाया गया।

सुंदरता :-

सीताबर्डी का पूरा मैदान पेड़ों से रहित और पत्थरों से भरा है इन दो पहाड़ी जो उंचाई में छोटी है। उत्तरी दिशा में और इसे छोटी टेकड़ी कहते हैं जो बड़ी टेकड़ी को बंदूक की श्रृंखला में आती है इसलिए उस मैदान को सुरक्षित करना आवश्यक है, शहर का उपनगर छोटी टेकड़ी के नजदीक है।

यह किला अभी भारतीय सेना के ११८ वी पैदल सेना बटालियन ग्रेनेडिपर्स का घर है यह किला साल में तीन बार १ मई (महाराष्ट्र दिवस), १५ अगस्त और २६ जनवरी को जनता के लिए खोला जाता है।

हिन्दी के विकास की समीक्षा करने के लक्ष्य से "विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन" आयोजित करने का विचार ४० साल पहले किया गया। इस विचार को मूर्त रूप देते हुए १०-१२ जनवरी १९७५ को पहला हिन्दी विश्व सम्मेलन नागपुर में आयोजित किया गया।

राष्ट्र भाषा प्रचार समिति, वर्धा के सहयोग से संपन्न इस प्रथम विश्व सम्मेलन के आयोजन को तत्कालीन प्रधानमंत्री इंदिरा गांधी का प्रोत्साहन सराहनीय है। इसी सम्मेलन के साथ 'विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन' की श्रृंखला शुरू है।

अगले ही वर्ष दूसरे विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन का आयोजन स्थल मॉरिशस की राजधानी पोर्ट लुई को बनाया गया। जहाँ २८-३० अगस्त १९७६ को विश्वभर के हिन्दी प्रेमी और साहित्यकार एकत्र हुए। सात वर्ष के बाद पुनः भारत तीसरा 'विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन' आयोजित किया गया। २८-३० अगस्त १९८३ को नई दिल्ली में संपन्न इस सम्मेलन का उद्घाटन स्वयं प्रधानमंत्री इंदिरा गाँधी ने किया।

पहला 'विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन' राष्ट्रभाषा प्रचार समिती वर्धा के सहयोग से नागपूर में संपन्न हुआ जिसमें प्रसिद्ध समाजसेवी एवं स्वतंत्रता सेनानी विनोबा भावे ने अपना विशेष संदेश भेजा। प्रारंभ में 'विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन' हर चार वर्ष में आयोजित किया जाता था। लेकिन अब यह अन्तराल घटाकर तीन वर्षों में आयोजित किया जाता है।

प्रथम सम्मेलन में सम्मेलन से संबंधित राष्ट्रीय आयोजन समिती के उपराष्ट्रपति श्री. बी. डी. जत्ती थे। पहले विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलन का बोधवाक्य था – वसुधैव कुटुंबकम्। इस सम्मेलन में ३० देशों के कुल १२२ प्रतिनिधियों ने भाग लिया। सम्मेलन में हिन्दी भाषा के लिए पारित किए गये विचार थे।

- १) संयुक्त राष्ट्र संधि में हिन्दी को अधिकारिक भाषा के रूप में स्थान दिया जाए।
- २) वर्धा में विश्व हिंदी विद्यापीठ की स्थापना हो।
- ३) विश्व हिन्दी सम्मेलनों को स्थायित्व प्रदान करने के लिए अत्यंत विचारपूर्वक योजना निर्माण की जाए।

१९७३ में पहली बार विश्व हिंदी सम्मेलन यात्रा प्रस्ताव लाया गया था। विश्व हिंदी सम्मेलन हिंदी भाषा का सबसे बड़ा इंटरनेशनल कार्यक्रम है, जिसमें दुनियाभर के हिंदी प्रेमी शोधकर्ता, साहित्यकार, भाषा विज्ञानी, विषय विशेषज्ञ और पत्रकार इस आयोजन में शामिल होते हैं।

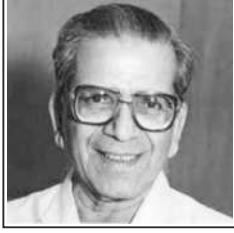

मराठी लेखक, अर्थतज्ज्ञ व साहित्य समीक्षक, मराठी साहित्यात कथा या साहित्यप्रकारातील त्यांच्या योगदानामुळे त्यांना 'नवकथेचे अध्वर्यू' असे संबोधले जाते. कथेचे नवे वळण विकसित करण्याचे श्रेय गंगाधर गाळगीळ यांचेकडे जाते. संज्ञा प्रवाही लेखन स्वप्नाचा प्रयोग लेखनात केला.

४ ऑगस्ट १९२३ - २०२३ (शताब्दी वर्ष)



नागपूर विद्यापीठाची स्थापना ४ ऑगस्ट १९२३ रोजी झाली. सर फ्रँक स्लाय हे त्या वेळेचे कुलपती होते. या विद्यापीठाचे संस्थापक कुलगुरु सर बिपिनकृष्ण बोस हे होते. त्या वेळेस फक्त ६ महाविद्यालये, ९१७ विद्यार्थी व फक्त ४ विद्याशाखा या पुंजीवर हे विद्यापीठ सुरु झाले. प्रदीर्घ कालावधीनंतर २००५ साली विद्यापीठाचे नाव बदलण्यात आले.

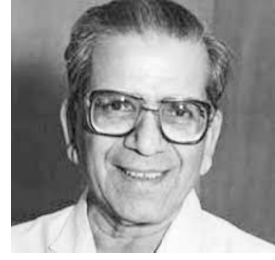

नवकथेचा अष्टावधानी मानदंड

- गंगाधर गोपाळ गाडगीळ



साहित्यिक गंगाधर गोपाळ गाडगीळ यांचे जन्मशताब्दी वर्ष गेल्या २५ ऑगस्ट २०२२ पासून सुरु झाले.

कोणत्याही मानसशास्त्रज्ञापेक्षा साहित्यिकाला मानवी मनाची अधिक चांगली जाण असते असे जे म्हटले जाते. त्याचे प्रत्यंतर गाडगीळांच्या कथेतून उत्तमपणे येते. गाडगीळांनी एका मुलाखतीत असे म्हटले आहे की, त्यांना चतुरस्र माणसे (लेखक) आवडतात. गाडगीळांच्या साहित्य-सृष्टीकडे नजर टाकल्यास सहजच लक्षात येते की ज्या चतुरस्रपणाची अपेक्षा ते लेखकांकडून करतात, तो त्यांनी स्वतःच्या लेखनातून समर्थपणे सिध्द केला आहे.

गाडगीळांनी विविध प्रकारची विपुल साहित्यनिर्मिती केली असली तरी ते प्रामुख्याने ओळखले जातात ते मराठी नवकथेच्या निर्मात्यांपैकी एक म्हणूनच. मराठी कथेला खऱ्या अर्थाने 'नवं' केले ते गाडगीळांनीच. फडके-खांडेकरांच्या कथेच्या तुलनेतच नव्हे, तर गोखले, माडगूळकर, भावे या गाडगीळांच्या समकालीन नवकथाकारांच्या तुलनेतही गाडगीळांच्या कथा एकदम नव्या, निराळ्या वाटतात.

मराठी लघुकथेला नवकथेने कथानकाच्या चौकटीतून मुक्त केले. हेतूपूर्वकथेतून मुक्त होऊन मराठी कथा केवळ कुतूहलातून जीवनचित्रण करू लागली. व्यक्तीच्या मनातील भावना, विचार यांचे वर्णन करण्याऐवजी मराठी कथा खऱ्या अर्थाने मानवी मनाचे विश्लेषण करू लागली. त्याद्वारे तिने कथानक आणि व्यक्तिचित्रण ही दोनच परिमाणे असणाऱ्या मराठी कथेला बहुपरिणामात्मक संपन्नता प्राप्त करून दिली. ही आणि यासारखी मराठी नवकथेच्या संदर्भात केली जाणारी विधाने खरे म्हणजे गाडगीळांच्याच कथेची वैशिष्ट्ये दाखविणारी आहेत. म्हणूनच मराठी नवकथा असे म्हटल्याबरोबर चटकन गाडगीळांचीच कथा सार्थपणे आपल्या नजरेसमोर येते. लहानपणापासून गाडगीळांना वाचनाची आवड होती. त्यातूनच पुढे कॉलेजमध्ये असताना त्यांनी आपल्या लेखनाला सुरुवात केली. 'प्रिया आणि मांजर' ही त्यांची पहिली कथा जून इ.स. १९४१ मध्ये 'वाङ्मयशोभा' या मासिकात प्रकाशित झाली. पुढे बरीच प्रसिध्दी मिळालेली 'बाई शाळा सोडून जातात' ही त्यांची कथा त्याच मासिकात १९४४ मध्ये प्रसिध्द झाली. काही कालावधीनंतर 'मानसचित्रे' हा त्यांचा पहिला कथासंग्रह १९४६ साली प्रकाशित झाला.

यानंतर ठराविक काळाने त्यांचे लेखन प्रकाशित होत राहिले. विशेषतः कडू आणि गोड, नव्या वाटा, भिरभिरे, संसार, उध्वस्त विश्व, कबुतरे, खरं सांगाथचं म्हणजे, तलावातले चांदणे, वर्षा, ओले उन्हे हे त्यांचे उल्लेखनीय कथासंग्रह आहेत.

गाडगीळींच्या कथेतून तरुण, वृद्ध, स्त्री, पुरुष या साऱ्यांचे कसल्याही साऱ्यात न बसणारे मनोव्यापार सजीवपणे साकार होतात. गाडगीळांच्या साहित्यसृष्टीचे असे विहंगमावलोकन केल्यावर आपल्या मनावर ठसा उमटतो तो त्यांच्या अष्टावधानी व्यक्तिमत्त्वाचा. जीवनाविषयीचे उदंड आणि अभंग कुतूहल, साहित्य-कलेविषयी प्रगल्भ व निष्ठावान अभिरुची, वादकुशल विचारशक्ती इत्यादी गुणांनी युक्त अशा गाडगीळांच्या अष्टावधानी व्यक्तिमत्त्वाचा आनंददायी प्रत्यय त्यांच्या लेखनातून ठायी ठायी येतो. म्हणूनच मराठी साहित्याची श्रीमंती सर्व अंगांनी वाढविणाऱ्या गाडगीळांना अष्टावधानी लेखक असे म्हणणे यथार्थ ठरते. असे अष्टावधानी लेखक मराठी साहित्यसृष्टीत होऊन गेले हे तिचे भाग्यच होय. अशा अष्टावधानी लेखकाच्या जन्मशताब्दीच्या निमित्ताने त्यांना अभिवादन करून नव्या-जुन्या वाचकांनी गाडगीळांचे लेखन यानिमित्ताने पुन्हा एकदा बारकाईने वाचावे असे आवाहन करणे यासमयी उचित ठरेल.

गाडगीळांच्या जीवनाभवांच्या स्वीकारातील या मर्यादेमुळेच ते कादंबरीलेखनाकडे फारसे वळलेले दिसत नाहीत. 'लिलीचे फूल' या त्यांच्या कादंबरीत हे स्पष्टपणे लक्षात येते. त्यांच्या कथालेखनाची उपर्युक्त वैशिष्ट्ये या कादंबरीत ठळकपणे दिसून येतात. 'दुर्दम्य' या लोकमान्य टिळकांच्या जीवनावरील कादंबरी मधून टिळकांच्या विकसनशील, बहुपरिणामात्मक व्यक्तिमत्त्वाचे जिवंत चित्रण करणे, टिळकांचा काळ सामर्थ्याने उभा करण्याचा सुजाण प्रयत्न करणे, त्यांच्या समकालीन व्यक्तींची चित्रे समर्थपणे व्यक्त करणे... या वैशिष्ट्यांमुळे ही कादंबरी वाचनीय झाली आहे. 'गोपुरांच्या प्रदेशात' आणि 'सातासमुद्रापलीकडे' ही गाडगीळांची दोन प्रवासवर्णने त्यांच्या वेगळेपणामुळे मराठीतील प्रचलित प्रवासवर्णनपर लेखनापेक्षा वेगळी व वैशिष्ट्यपूर्ण झाली आहे. बंडू-स्नेहलता यांच्या गोष्टींमधून त्यांनी उत्तम विनोद निर्मिती केली आहे. उपहास, उपरोध, अतिशयोक्ती, विक्षिप्ततेचे दर्शन ही विनोदनिर्मितीची अवजारे त्यांनी येथे यशस्वीपणे वापरली आहेत. साहित्याचे मानदंड गाडगीळ दाखवू शकले ते या मूल्यदृष्टीमुळेच. 'खडक आणि पाणी' यासारखा महत्त्वाचा समीक्षालेखसंग्रह त्यामुळेच निर्माण होऊ शकला. जुनी मूल्यकल्पना नाकारून नवी मूल्यकल्पना उभी करणे आणि प्रत्यक्ष समीक्षेतून तिचे यशस्वी उपयोजन करून दाखवणे असे द्विविध कार्य गाडगीळांच्या समीक्षेने केले आहे. म्हणूनच ते मर्दकरोत्तर काळातील एक श्रेष्ठ समीक्षक म्हणून ओळखले जातात.

ऐतिहासिक दीक्षाभूमीचे महत्व

डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांनी नागपूर येथे १४ ऑक्टोबर १९५६ रोजी विजयादशमीच्या दिवशी आयोजित धर्मांतर सोहळ्यात लाखो जनसमुदायासोबत बौद्ध धर्माची दीक्षा घेतली होती. त्यानंतर देशभरातील बौद्ध धर्मांतर सोहळा दिवस हा 'धम्मचक्र प्रवर्तन दिन' म्हणून साजरा



करतात. आज नागपूर मध्ये ऐतिहासिक दीक्षाभूमी वर भारतातील सर्वात मोठा स्तूप उभा असून तो स्तूप देशातील सर्व बौद्धांचे उर्जास्थान बनले आहे.

धर्मांतर सोहळ्याला ६५ वर्षांचा काळ लोटला तरी दिवसेंदिवस ऐतिहासिक दीक्षाभूमीचे महत्व वाढताना दिसतेय. त्यामुळे नव्या पिढीला ऐतिहासिक दीक्षाभूमीचा इतिहास माहिती असणे आवश्यक वाटते. दीक्षाभूमीच्या इतिहासाची माहिती खालील प्रमाणे.

दीक्षाभूमीवर पहिला बुद्ध स्तंभ :-

दीक्षाभूमीवर पहिला बुद्धस्तंभ १३ एप्रिल १९५७ ला एका रात्रीतून बाबू हरिदासजी आवले यांच्या नेतृत्वात तयार करण्यात आला. बुद्ध स्तंभ हा मेंढे गुरुजी यांनी एका रात्रीतून बांधला. स्तंभावरील बुद्धमूर्ती भीमराव गाजघाटे रा. पाचपावली, नागपूर यांनी तयार केली. (प्रल्हाद मेंढे गुरुजी, रा. कर्नलबाग, पत्र १२ जून १९९६) सोबतच अनेक कार्यकर्त्यांनी बुद्ध स्तंभ उभारण्यास आवले बाबूस सहकार्य केले होते.

बुद्ध स्तंभास धोका पोहचू नये म्हणून एक रखवालदार आणि स्तंभाशेजारी एक लहानसे पत्र्याचे शेड उभारण्याचे ठरविले होते. त्यासाठी मेंढे गुरुजी यांनी सामानही आणले होते. परंतु प्रत्यक्ष कामाला सुरुवात करण्याच्या आदल्या दिवशीच सीताबर्डी पोलीस ठाण्यातील अधिकाऱ्याने सर्व साहित्य बेकायदेशीर समजून उचलून नेण्याचा प्रयत्न केला. नागपूरच्या नझूल तहसीलदाराने लँड रेव्हिन्यू अँक्ट मध्यप्रदेश सेक्शन २२९ च्या आधारे स्मारक समितीच्या बुद्ध महासभेच्या आणि शेडयुल्ड कास्ट फेडरेशनच्या प्रमुख पुढाऱ्यांवर खटला भरला.

स्मारक समितीचे कार्यवाह आर.आर. पाटील यांनी कोर्टात दीक्षाभूमीवरील स्तंभ कुणी बांधला हे माहिती नसल्याचे सांगितले. कर्मवीर आवले बाबूंनी दीक्षाभूमी वरील स्तंभ बांधल्याचे कोर्टात कबूल केले. या केसचा नंबर १२४-१-५२ ए ऑफ ५७-५८ होता. यावरून दीक्षाभूमीवरील स्तंभ उभारण्यात वर नमूद केलेल्या व्यक्तींचे बहुमूल्य सहकार्य लाभले होते. केवळ एकट्या व्यक्तीचे ते कार्य नव्हते.



दीक्षाभूमी जागेचा इतिहास :- धम्मदीक्षेपूर्वी ही जागा वैक्सिन इन्स्टिट्यूटने गुरांना चारण्यासाठी राखून ठेवली होती. या जागेचे क्षेत्रफळ १४ एकर असून पडीत असलेली ही जागा त्यावेळी खाचखळगे, दगडधोंडे, लहान-मोठी झाडेझुडपे व गवतांचे रान होती. ही जागा दीक्षा समारंभासाठी मिळविण्यासाठी २८ सप्टेंबर १९५६ रोजी रीतसर अर्ज करण्यात आला आणि २८ सप्टेंबर १९५६ रोजी इन्स्टिट्यूटने 'ना हरकत पत्र' दिले. त्यात ही अट होती की २८ सप्टेंबर १९५६ ते ११ ऑक्टोबर १९५६ पर्यंत या जागेत गुरे चरण्यास येत राहतील व १५ ऑक्टोबर १९५६ नंतर ही जागा गुरांच्या चरण्यासाठीच पुन्हा उपयोगात आणली जाईल.

दीक्षाभूमी हे भारतीय बौद्धांचे विशेषतः आंबेडकरवादी बौद्ध धर्मीयांचे एक महत्वाचे केंद्र आहे. हे स्थळ महाराष्ट्राची उपराजधानी असलेल्या नागपूर शहरात आहे. या ठिकाणी डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांनी १४ ऑक्टोबर इ.स. १९५६ रोजी बौद्ध धम्माची दीक्षा घेतली आणि आपल्या अनुयायांनाही नवयान बौद्ध धम्माची दीक्षा दिली होती.

१) त्यामुळे या भूमीला दीक्षाभूमी म्हटले गेले. काही कालावधी नंतर येथे एक भव्य स्तूप उभारला गेला. दीक्षाभूमीच्या या भव्य बौद्ध स्तूपाप्रमाणे आकारामुळे याला 'धम्मचक्र स्तूप' असेही म्हटले जाते.

दीक्षाभूमीला वर्षभर बौद्ध अनुयायी व पर्यटक भेट देत असतात. मात्र अशोक विजयादशमी किंवा १४ ऑक्टोबर रोजी यांच्या संखेत लक्षणीय वाढ होऊन लक्षावधी लोक येथे आलेले असतात.

२) भारतातील व विदेशातील, मुख्यत्वे जपान, थायलंड आणि श्रीलंका येथील अनेक अनुयायी व प्रसिध्द व्यक्ती या स्थळास भेट देत असतात. महाराष्ट्र शासनाच्या पर्यटन विभागाने दीक्षाभूमीला 'अ' वर्ग पर्यटन स्थळ म्हणून घोषित केले आहे.

डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर स्मारक समितीचे अध्यक्ष व भारतीय बौद्ध भिक्खू सुरई यांनी म्हटले आहे की, दीक्षाभूमी ही जागतिक भूमी आहे. तिचे पावित्र्य जगात आहे. बाबासाहेबांच्या स्वप्नातील धम्म संस्कार केंद्र तयार करण्याच्या दिशेने प्रयत्न केले जातात. भारताचे राष्ट्रपती रामनाथ कोविंद यांनी दीक्षाभूमीला 'मानवतेचे प्रेरणास्थान' म्हटले आहे.



डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांनी पवित्र दीक्षाभूमीवर समता तसेच सामाजिक क्रांतीची मुहूर्तमेढ रोवली आणि त्यामुळेच संपूर्ण समाज प्रगतीपथावर अग्रेसर होऊ शकला. ही दीक्षाभूमी अवघ्या विश्वासाठी, त्याग, शांती आणि मानवतेची प्रेरणा देणारी आहे. येथे येऊन मी धन्य झालो आहे, अशा शब्दांत भारताचे राष्ट्रपती रामनाथ कोविंद यांनी दीक्षाभूमीला भेट दिल्यानंतर त्याबद्दल कृतज्ञता व्यक्त केलेली आहे.

रचना :-

दीक्षाभूमी हा एक मोठा स्तूप आहे. दीक्षाभूमीचा विस्तार मोठा आहे, कलेचा एक उत्तम नमुना आपल्याला पहायला मिळतो. दीक्षाभूमीच्या बांधकामासाठी ५००० लोकांनी अहोरात्र परिश्रम घेतले आहेत. दीक्षाभूमीच्या बांधकामासाठी घौलपूर इथून आणलेल्या मार्बल आणि ग्रेनाईटचा वापर केलेला आहे. दीक्षाभूमी डोम हा १२० फूट उंचीचा आहे.

इतिहास :-

सम्राट अशोकांनी इसवी सन पूर्व तिसऱ्या कलिंग युद्धानंतर बौद्ध धम्माची दीक्षा घेतली आणि इतिहासात हा दिवस अशोक विजयादशमी म्हणून गणला गेला. विसाव्या शतकात १४ ऑक्टोबर १९५६ रोजी याच अशोक विजयादशमीच्या दिवशी बोधिसत्व डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकरांनी येथे बौद्ध धम्माची दीक्षा घेतली व आपल्या ५,००,००० अनुयायांना दीक्षा दिली, दुसऱ्या दिवशी १५ ऑक्टोबर रोजी बाबासाहेबांनी सोहळ्याला उशिरा आलेल्या उर्वरित ३,००,००० अनुयायांना धम्म दीक्षा दिली. बाबासाहेबांनी आपल्या या अनुयायांना धम्मदीक्षेपूर्वी स्वतःच्या बाविस प्रतिज्ञा दिल्या. एकाच वेळी व शांततामय मार्गांनी घडून आलेले बौद्ध धर्मांतर जगाच्या इतिहासातील सर्वात मोठे सामूहिक धर्मांतर आहे. बाबासाहेबांनी दीक्षा घेतल्यानंतर या स्थानाला महत्त्व प्राप्त झाले. एक प्रमुख बौद्ध क्षेत्र म्हणूनही या स्थानाची ओळख बनली. दरवर्षी येथे बरेच लोक बाबासाहेबांना अभिवादन करण्यासाठी येऊ लागले. इथे एक भव्य स्तूप निर्माण केला गेला. बावीस प्रतिज्ञांचा स्तंभही उभारला गेला. येथे बोधिवृक्ष लावला गेला व बौद्ध भिक्खू भिक्खूणींच्या निवासासाठी बाजूला एक विहार बांधला गेला.

धम्मचक्र प्रवर्तन दिन :-

दीक्षाभूमी येथे दरवर्षी १४ ऑक्टोबर हा दिवस भारतीय बौद्ध अनुयायी धम्मचक्र प्रवर्तन दिन म्हणून उत्साहाने साजरा करतात. त्यावेळी येथे १५ ते २० लाख बौद्ध जमा होतात आणि बाबासाहेबांना आणि गौतम बुद्धांना अभिवादन करतात. भारतातील विशेषतः महाराष्ट्रातील मुख्य राजकीय नेते सणात सहभागी होतात. जर्मनी, थायलंड, जपान, म्यानमार, श्रीलंका इत्यादी देशांतील बौद्ध उपासक, भिक्खूही उपस्थित राहतात.

नागपूर स्थित अजब बंगल्याचे महत्व

देशातल्या मध्यभागी असलेल्या नागपूर शहराच्या मध्यवर्ती ठिकाणी ब्रिटीशांच्या काळातील एक देखणी वास्तू आहे. 'अजब बंगल्यात' या ऐतिहासिक वास्तूत गजब दुनिया दडलेली आहे.



नागपुरात अजब बंगला नावाचे एक मध्यवर्ती संग्रहालय आहे. पण तो बंगला नेहमीच बंद असतो. असाच समज नागपुरकरांचा होता. त्यामुळे या बंगल्यात काय दडलेले आहे. याची जाणीव लोकांना नव्हती. 'मटा क्लब क्लब' ने 'हेरीटेज वॉक' या उपक्रमांतर्गत अजब बंगल्याची सफर सदस्यांना घडवून आणली आणि हा ऐतिहासिक ठेवा त्यांच्या समोर खुला केला.

'बापरे ! इतक छान संग्रहालय नागपुरात आहे आणि आम्हांला माहीतच नव्हते' अशी प्रतिक्रिया सदस्यांनी यावेळी व्यक्त केली. ब्रिटीशांच्या काळात "ॲन्टेक्वेरियन सोसायटी ऑफ सेंट्रल प्रॉव्हिन्सेस" या संस्थेच्या गरजेनुसार नागपूर येथे संग्रहालय व ग्रंथालय स्थापन करण्यात आले होते. संग्रालयाची इमारत बांधून त्याला 'सेंट्रल म्युझियम' नागपूर असे नाव देण्यात आले व ७ मे १८६३ मध्ये हे संग्रहालय सुरू झाले.

मध्य भारतातील सर्वात जुने व अग्रणी संग्रहालय असलेल्या या १५० वर्षे जुन्या संग्रहालयात भूगर्भ व प्रागैतिहासिक, प्राणी, (स्टफ), पक्षी, सरपटणारे प्राणी, आर्ट अँड क्राफ्ट, पाषाणशिल्प, शस्त्र, पुरातत्व, आदिवासी कला व संस्कृती इत्यादी दालनांचा समावेश आहे. वाकात्क काळातील विष्णू प्रतिमा, मध्ययुगीन काळातील तेराव्या शतकालीन ग्रॅनाइट लकशीश, बाराव्या शतकालीन ब्रम्हामूर्ती तसेच, मुगलकालीन, राजपुतकालीन शस्त्रे, कौंडण्यपूर, माहुरझरी व पवनी येथील उत्खननात सापडलेली वस्तु दख्खन, जयपूरी, उदयपूर, बिकानेर, पहाडी, मराठी शैलीतील पेंटिंग इथे बघायला मिळतात. इ.स. पहिल्या शतकातील पवनीच्या उत्खननात सापडलेले शिलालेखावरील पदवी प्रमाणपत्र, तसेच लंडनची रानी 'व्हिक्टोरीयाची' तरुण आणि वृद्धावस्थेतील भव्य मूर्ती, फ्रान्स फिरून आलेले हत्ती या संग्रहालयाचे प्रमुख आकर्षण आहेत.

अजब बंगल्यातील कलाकार सुचिंद्र मंडपे यांनी संग्रहालयातील वस्तुची माहिती दिली आहे. डॉ. एम.वाय. कठाणे हे संग्रालयाचे अभिरक्षक आहेत.

'अजब बंगला' कायमच बंद असतो, असा नागपूरकरांचा समज आहे. पण, केवळ दर सोमवारीच अजब बंगला बंद असतो. इतर दिवशी सकाळी १० ते सायंकाळी ५ वाजेपर्यंत हे संग्रहालय सर्वांसाठी खुले असते. याशिवाय २६ जानेवारी, होळी, धुलीवंदन, १ मे, १५ ऑगस्ट, दसरा व दिवाळी, या सणाना संग्रालय बंद असते.

सिताबर्डी किल्याचे ऐतिहासिक महत्व

सिताबर्डी किल्ला मध्य नागपूर, महाराष्ट्र येथे एका टेकडीवर आहे. सिताबर्डी किल्ला गोंड राजा बुलंद शाह याने सन १७०२ मध्ये बांधला होता. सिताबर्डी किल्ला राजगोंड राजाने बांधला. त्यानंतर तिसऱ्या अँग्लो-मराठा युद्ध दरम्यान ब्रिटीश ईस्ट इंडिया कंपनीविरुद्ध लढण्यापूर्वी हा किल्ला मराठा यांच्याकडे होता.



टेकडीच्या आजू-बाजू चा परिसर, ज्याला आता सिताबर्डी म्हणून ओळखले जाते, हे नागपूरचे महत्वाचे व्यावसायिक केंद्र आहे.

सिताबर्डी किल्ला कधी सुरू असतो ?

१) २६ जानेवारी २) १ मे (महाराष्ट्र दिवस) ३) १५ ऑगस्ट

सिताबर्डी किल्ला, नागपुरातील, एक प्रमुख पर्यटन आकर्षण, दोन टेकड्यांवर वसलेला आहे. ते म्हणजे "बडी टेकरी" शब्दशः अर्थ "मोठी टेकडी" आणि "छोटी टेकरी" म्हणजे मराठीत "लहान टेकडी" असे होय. या किल्ल्याच्या परिसरात इसवी सन १८१७ मध्ये नागपूरकर भोसले आणि इंग्रज यांच्या मध्ये लढाई झाली होती. सिताबर्डीचा किल्ला आर्मीच्या ताब्यात असल्यामुळे तो फक्त २६ जानेवारी, १ मे आणि १५ ऑगस्ट याच दिवशी सुरू असतो.

परंपरेनुसार सीताबर्डीला हे नाव दोन यदुवंशी भावांकडून मिळाले. शितलप्रसाद आणि बद्रीप्रसाद गवळी ज्यांनी १७ व्या शतकात या भागावर राज्य केले.

हे ठिकाण "शितलबद्री" म्हणून ओळखले जाऊ लागले, जे ब्रिटीश राजवटीत "सिताबर्डी" बनले आणि नंतर त्याचे सध्याचे रूप "सिताबर्डी" धारण केले. शितलाप्रसाद आणि बद्रीप्रसाद हे दोन यदुवंशीय गवळी राजे राज्य करत होते. त्यांच्या नावावरून या किल्ल्याला शितलाबद्री असे नाव पडले होते. ब्रिटीशांनी त्या नावाचा अपभ्रंश-शिताबुल्डी असा केला, तसे स्थानिक नाव सिताबर्डी असे पडले.

पहाण्याची ठिकाणे :-

किल्ला ११८ इंग्रॅट्री बटालियनच्या अखत्यारीत असल्याने किल्ल्याचे अनेक भाग पाहाता येत नाहीत. किल्ला मोठी टेकडी आणि लहान टेकडी या दोन टेकड्यांवर पसरलेला आहे. किल्ल्याच्या प्रवेशद्वारातून आत शिरल्यावर टेकडीवर जाणारा अरुंद रस्ता दगड फोडून बनवलेला आहे. या रस्त्याने आपण किल्ल्यावर पोहोचतो. या ठिकाणी ब्रिटीश काळात बांधलेल्या

काही इमारती आहेत. पुढे गेल्यावर डाव्या हाताला एक स्तंभ उभारलेला आहे. किंग जॉर्ज आणि राणी मेरी नागपूरात आले होते त्यांची आठवण म्हणून हा स्तंभ उभारण्यात आला होता. स्तंभ पाहून पायवाटेने पुढे गेल्यावर आपण दुसऱ्या प्रवेशद्वारापाशी पोहोचतो. टिपू सुलतानचा नातू नवाब कादर अली आणि त्याच्या ८ साथिदारांना इंग्रजांनी या किल्ल्यात फाशी दिली होती. त्यांच्या स्मृति प्रित्यर्थ हा दर्गा उभारण्यात आला होता. या दर्गा समोरील इमारतीत महात्मा गांधीना तुरुंगात ठेवण्यात आले होते. अशा प्रकारे सिताबर्डी पहाण्याची ठिकाणे ऐतिहासिक आहेत.

स्वातंत्र्याचा जाज्वल्य इतिहास सांगणारा 'सीताबर्डी किल्ला'

ब्रिटिश-मराठ्यांच्या युद्धाचे प्रतीक असलेला शहरातील सीताबर्डी किल्ला सध्या भारतीय लष्कराच्या ताब्यात असून पर्यटकांच्या दृष्टीने तो आकर्षणाचे केंद्र ठरला आहे. मात्र सुरक्षिततेच्या कारणाने तो केवळ राष्ट्रीय सणाच्या दिवशीच उघडण्यात येतो.

एकेकाळी ओसाड आणि दगडांच्या टेकड्यांचा हा परिसर यदुवंशीयामुळे प्रकाश झोतात आला. येथे लहान टेकडी आणि मोठी टेकडी होती. या टेकड्यांना दोन यदुवंशी बंधू शीतलाप्रसाद आणि बद्रीप्रसाद गवळी यांच्या नावावरून सिताबर्डी असे नाव पडल्याचे सांगण्यात येते. भारताला स्वातंत्र्य मिळेपर्यंत या किल्ल्यावर ब्रिटिश लष्करी छावणीचा 'युनियन जॅक' फडकत होता. देश सोडल्यानंतर त्यांनी हा किल्ला लष्कराकडे सोपवला.

१७०० एकरवर वसलेला सिताबर्डी किल्ला इंग्रज विरुद्ध भोसले यांच्यातील युद्धाचे प्रतीक आहे. सिताबर्डीवर नागपूरचे राज्यकर्ते आप्पासाहेब ऊर्फ मुधोजी द्वितीय यांनी ईस्ट इंडिया कंपनीविरोधात लढा दिला. आप्पासाहेब भोसले आणि ब्रिटिशांमध्ये नोव्हेंबर १८१७ मध्ये लढाई झाली. ब्रिटिशांनी या दोन टेकड्यांचे किल्ल्यांमध्ये रूपांतर केले. या किल्ल्याचे बांधकाम काळ्या दगडाने केले आहे. येथे तोफखाना व दारूगोळा ठेवला जात असे. किल्ल्यावर अरब सेनेने हल्ला चढवल्याची नोंद आहे. मोठी टेकडी 'किल्ला', म्हणून ओळखली जाते तर लहान टेकडीवर गणपतीचे मंदिर आहे.

नागपूर शहरातील महिलांचा स्वातंत्र्यसंग्रामातील सहभाग

भारताच्या स्वातंत्र्य संग्रामामध्ये पुरुषांबरोबर महिलांनीही महत्वपूर्ण कामगिरी बजावलेली आहे. तुरुंगवासाची पर्वा न करता धडाडीने कार्य करित राहिल्या, काही महिलांनी जोखीम पत्करून हिंसक कारवायांना हातभार लावला. भूमिगतांना महिलांनी केलेली मदत स्वातंत्र्य प्राप्तीच्या दृष्टीने मोलाची ठरली. स्वातंत्र्य लढ्यातील सहभागी महिलांनी नागपूरच्या इतिहासातच नव्हे, तर देशाच्या स्वातंत्र्य संग्रामाच्या इतिहासातही आपले नाव अमर केले आहे.

स्त्री उत्थानाची लाट पश्चिम महाराष्ट्राकडून विदर्भात आली, तशी ती नागपुरलाही येऊन पोहोचली. ख्रिश्चन मिशनरींच्या शाळा नागपूर येथे सुरू झाल्या. परंतु मिशनरी शाळेत गेलेल्या मुलींना बाटविण्यात येईल अशी भीती त्या काळातील समाज सुधारकांना वाटली आणि त्यांनी सन १८७८ मध्ये भिडे कन्या शाळा, १९१४ मध्ये सुळे महिला विद्यालय व सन १९१६ मध्ये हिंदू मुलींची शाळा सुरू केली.

शहरातील काही शिक्षित महिलांनी १९११ साली लेडीज क्लब, १९२० साली भगिनी मंडळ, १९२१ मध्ये सरस्वती मंदीर व याचवर्षी मातृसेवा संघाचीही स्थापना केली. महिलांनी स्थापन केलेल्या या संस्था महिलांत झालेल्या प्रबोधनाचे प्रतीक होत्या. या महिला संस्थाद्वारे स्त्रियांच्या समस्यांवर अनौपचारिक चर्चा होऊ लागली. महिलांचे प्रश्न कृतीद्वारे सोडविण्याचे प्रयत्न होऊ लागले. त्याबरोबरच महिलांना उद्योग देण्याचेही काम व्हायला लागले. स्त्री शिक्षणाच्या प्रसारामुळे व सामाजिक कार्यात स्त्रियांच्या सहभागामुळे नागपूरच्या स्त्रियाही परंपरेच्या चौकटीतून बाहेर डोकावू लागल्या, नवे विचार आत्मसात करू लागल्या. नागपूरच्याही राजकीय क्षेत्रात स्त्रिया रस घेऊ लागल्या असे त्याकाळी लक्षात आले.

सन १८९१ च्या नागपूर येथील काँग्रेस अधिवेशनाच्या वेळी मवाळ असलेल्या काँग्रेस प्रतिनिधींमध्ये लोकमान्य टिळकांच्या जहाल विचारांचे तरुण सहभागी होऊ लागले. त्यानंतर त्यांचे दौरे विदर्भ विभागात वाढले. नागपूरलाही त्यांच्या अनुयायांची संख्या वाढली. पुरुषांबरोबरच नागपूर येथील महिलांवरही लोकमान्य टिळकांच्या विचारांचा प्रभाव पडू लागला.

सन १९०६ मध्ये लोकमान्य नागपूरला आले असतांना श्रीमती गंगुबाई विनायकराव कप्तान यांना लोकमान्यांना भेटण्याची तीव्र इच्छा उत्पन्न झाली. गंगुबाईचे चिरंजीव रावबहादूर आनंदराव कप्तान हे ब्रिटीश धार्जिणे होते, तर लोकमान्य टिळकांचे कडवे विरोधक, त्यामुळे उघडपणे टिळकांना भेटणे गंगुबाईंना शक्य नव्हते, लोकमान्य बालगंधर्वांचे नाटक बघायला जाणार हे कळताच गंगुबाई नाट्यगृहात गेल्या आणि रंगमंचाच्या मागील भागात त्यांनी लोकमान्यांची भेट घेतली. लोकमान्यांनीही त्यांना नम्रपणे नमस्कार करून आशीर्वाद घेतला.

लोकमान्यांच्या प्रभावामुळे नागपूरातील काही महिला कार्यप्रवृत्त झाल्या. लेडीज क्लब या महिलांच्या संस्थेमार्फत जवळपासच्या खेड्यात सुधारणा कार्य होऊ लागले. पारेख, रमाबाई केदार, श्रीमती मलक, डॉ. करणी, श्रीमती चोळकर या महिला काही संस्थेद्वारे कार्य करित, नरेश आप्पाजी प्रविडांच्या सुविद्य पत्नी मथुराताई या आपल्या पतीच्या देशकार्यात उत्साहाने

भाग घेत. त्यांनी सन १९१५ च्या सुमारास महिला संघ स्थापन केला. कुणाच्या तरी घरी या महिला एकत्र जमत. लोकमान्यांचा फोटो समोर ठेवून केसरीचे सामुदायिक वाचन करीत यात उमाबाई पाठक, उमाबाई परांजपे सक्रीय भाग घेत. उमाबाई परांजपे टिळकांचे आख्यान घेऊन कीर्तन ही करत.

स्त्रीयांनी अनेक कार्यात आपले मोलाचे योगदान दिले आहे. १९२३ चा झेंडा सत्याग्रह, सायमन कमिशन विरोधी निदर्शने, खादी प्रचार, राष्ट्रीय शिक्षण सविनय कायदेभंग लढा, विदेशी मालावर बहिष्कार, मद्यपान बंदी, जंगल सत्याग्रह, १९३२ ची कायदेभंगाची दुसरी मोहिम, भारत छोडो आंदोलनातील महिलांचे कार्य, नागपूर येथील क्रांतीकारी महिलांचे कार्य अशा सर्व ठिकाणी नागपूर आणि महाराष्ट्रातील महिलांनी तसेच भारतातील इतर अनेक राज्यांमधील महिलांनी स्वातंत्र्य संग्रामाच्या मोहिमेला हातभार लावलेला आहे.

सविनय कायदेभंग लढा सुरू करायचा असे ठरवून महात्मा गांधी मार्च १९२९ मध्ये दांडी यात्रेला निघाले. त्यावेळी महिलांनी आम्ही या लढ्यात काय काम करावे असे विचारले असता त्यांनी मद्यपान विरोध आणि विदेशी मालावर बहिष्कार ही दोन कामे महिलांवर सोपविली. देश सेविकासंघाच्या सेविका घरोघरी जाऊन स्वदेशीचे प्रचारकार्य करू लागल्या. गांधीजींनी काम करण्याची परवानगी देताच महिला फार मोठ्या संख्येने राष्ट्रीय कार्य करण्यासाठी घराच्या बाहेर पडल्या आणि सविनय कायदेभंगाच्या लढ्यात उतरल्या. म. गांधींनी मिठाचा सत्याग्रह करण्याकरिता दांडी यात्रेला निघण्याचा आपला निर्णय जाहीर करताच नागपूरला प्रांतिक काँग्रेस कमिटीने युद्ध समित्यांची निवड केली आणि त्यांच्याकडून युद्धाची नांदी केली. २१ एप्रिलला दुर्गाताई जोशींनी दहिहंड्याला मिठाचा सत्याग्रह केला. त्यावेळी नागपूर येथील डॉ. ना.भा. खरे व त्यांच्या पत्नी इंदिराबाई खरे आणि मुलगी कृष्णाबाई नाशिकला असल्यामुळे त्यांनी नाशिकलाच जाहीर सभेत मीठ विकून कायदेभंग केला.

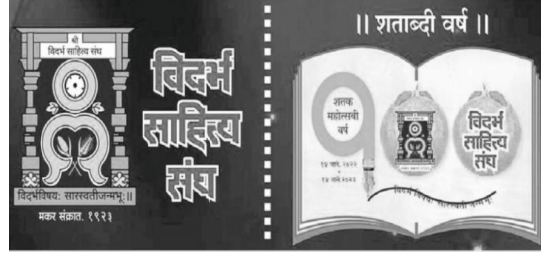
विदर्भ विभागाला समुद्र किनारा नसल्यामुळे या भागात मिठाच्या सत्याग्रहाला जोर येणे शक्य नव्हते. म्हणून युद्ध मंडळाने सरकारने जप्त केलेल्या वाड्मयाचा प्रचार करण्याचे ठरविले. बॅ. अभ्यंकरांनी 'भारत में अंग्रेजी राज' या पंडित सुंदरलाल यांच्या जप्त केलेल्या पुस्तकातील उतारा जाहीर सभेत वाचून दाखविला. या सभामध्ये महिला उपस्थित असत. १९३० च्या सुमारास नागपूर भागात सुशिक्षित महिलांचा सहभाग ह्या लढ्यात सारखा वाढतच होता. अनुसयाबाई काळे यांनी मोठ्या महिला गटाची आखणी केली. शाळा, कॉलेजवर बहिष्कार घालणे, दारूला विरोध न करणे ही कामे सतत चालू होती.

एकंदरीत स्वातंत्र्य लढ्यातील नागपूरकर महिलांच्या सहभागाचा विचार केल्यास त्या पुरुषांच्या खांद्याला खांदा लावून लढल्या. त्यांनी लढ्यात स्वतःला पूर्णतः झोकून दिले. म्हणून स्वातंत्र्योत्तर काळात आत्मविश्वासाने एक-एक क्षेत्र पादाक्रांत करणे महिलांना शक्य होत आहे.

विदर्भाचे भूषण असलेली, महत्वाचे सांस्कृतिक केंद्र बनलेली व अनेक प्रकारच्या अष्टकलांची जोपासना करणारी विदर्भ साहित्य संघ ही संस्था १९२३ मध्ये अमरावती येथे स्थापन करण्यात आली. ही संस्था स्थापन करण्याचे सर्वस्वी श्रेय अमरावतीचे कविभूषण प्रा. बळवंत गणेश



खापर्डे यांनाच द्यावे लागते. इ.स. १९२२ च्या मे महिन्यात पुण्याला एक कवि संमेलन भरले होते. त्या संमेलनाला खापर्डे सुद्धा गेले होते. त्या कविसंमेलनाचा खापर्डे यांच्या मनावर एवढा जबरदस्त परिणाम झाला की त्यांनी तेथेच ठरवून टाकले की असे वाङ्मयाचे आनंदी महोत्सव वन्हाडातही घ्यायचेच. हा दिव्य आनंद मिळविण्याकरिता आपणाला पुण्यात जावे लागले होते. पुण्यात ते जाऊ शकले पण, इच्छा असूनही वन्हाडचे लोक या आनंदाला पारखेच राहत होते. ही खंत त्यांच्या मनाला सतत होत होती. त्यांनी तेथेच निश्चय करून टाकला की अडचणींवर मात करून असे वाङ्महोत्सव वन्हाडांत घ्यायचेच.

त्यांनी स्थापन केलेली ही संस्था महावृक्षाप्रमाणे पसरणार आहे. त्यांना आधीच माहित होते म्हणून ते म्हणतात. हा महावृक्ष ज्यांना वाढविता येईल, ते पुढे वाढवितील पण आज त्या महावृक्षांची बीजे पेरून ठेवणे हे पहिले व जास्त महत्वाचे काम आहे, आणि ते आता केले पाहिजे. असे खापर्डे यांना वाटले व त्यांनी विदर्भ साहित्य संघाची स्थापना केली. विदर्भात ज्या उपयुक्त आणि इतर बाबींत अनेक चळवळी झाल्या आहेत, त्यांना मूक चालना प्रत्यक्ष किंवा अप्रत्यक्षपणे विदर्भ-साहित्य संघाच्या कार्यामुळेच मिळाली. संस्थेची उद्देश्यव्याप्ती ठरली, प्रदेशव्याप्ती ठरली आता फक्त नांव ठरायचे राहिले होते. उद्देश आणि प्रदेश ह्यांचा चटकन स्पष्टपणे पूर्ण बोध होईल असेच नाव सर्वात उत्तम, असेच शेवटी खापर्डे यांना वाटले व प्रदेशास्तव विदर्भ व उद्देशास्तव 'साहित्य' हे दोन शब्द त्यांनी प्रथम कायम केले. ऐतिहासिकतेच्या, प्राचीनतेच्या, पवित्रतेच्या व सूचकतेच्या दृष्टीने सर्वात उत्तम म्हणून संघ हा शब्द घेतला व "विदर्भ साहित्य संघ" ही संस्था उदयास आली.

मार्च १९५० मध्ये तिचे मुख्य कार्यालय नागपूरला हलवण्यात आले. आजही ते नागपूर येथेच आहे. शहरातील संस्थेचे सभागृह झाशी राणी चौकात, सिताबर्डी येथे आहे, ही संस्था दरवर्षी 'विदर्भ साहित्य संमेलन' भरवते.



विदर्भ साहित्य संघाचे 'युगवाणी' या नावाचे एक साहित्य विषयाला वाहिलेले त्रैमासिक आहे. विदर्भ साहित्य संघाच्या गोंदिया शाखेमध्ये 'भवभूती रंगमंदिर' नावाचे नाट्यगृह आहे. विदर्भ साहित्य संघाच्या खामगाव शाखेत १९५८ मध्ये 'कोल्हटकर स्मारक मंदिर' उभारण्यात आले आहे.

विदर्भ साहित्य संघाच्या खामगाव शाखेत १९५८ मध्ये 'कोल्हटकर स्मारक मंदिर' उभारण्यात आले आहे.

विदर्भ साहित्य संघाचे मुखपत्र म्हणून जन्माला आलेले 'युगवाणी' आज सत्यात्तर वर्षांच्या वाटचालीनंतरही नव्या वाटा धुंडाळण्याची उमेद बाळगून आहे. त्याबद्दल अभिनंदनच करावे लागेल. विदर्भात नियतकालिके जन्माला आली आणि संपली पण 'युगवाणी' आपला दर्जा आणि सातत्य सांभाळून आहे.

मराठी भाषा आणि मराठी साहित्य यांची अभिवृद्धी करणे. साहित्य मूल्यांची जपणूक करणे, प्रांतीयता व जातीयता यापासून अलिप्त राहणे ही उद्दिष्ट्ये समोर ठेवून १९४६ साली संपादक वा.ना. देशपांडे यांनी युगवाणीचा प्रथमांक काढला तोच मुळी संस्मरणीय आहे. 'गुप्त सरस्वती' या सदरात आलेले आगरकरांचे पत्र, कविवर्य बींची 'पिकले पान' ही कविता ही त्या अंकाचे भूषण होती. प्रांतीयतेच्या सीमा उल्लंघून काव्यक्षेत्रातील फार मोठी आणि विख्यात अशी मैफिल 'युगवाणी' ने घडवून आणली आहे. संपूर्ण १९४७ सालचे अंकच त्या दृष्टीने पाहण्यासारखे आहेत. काव्याच्या सदरात बिलासपूरचे ना.बा. शास्त्री, मुंबईचे पु. शि. रेंगे, परभणीचे बी. रघुनाथ, सागरचे दा. ल. अलोणी, धारचे अनंत आठल्ये, औरंगाबादचे वा. रा. कांत, नाशिकचे द्वारकानाथ चित्रे, इंदोरचे रा.अ. काळे ह्या साऱ्यांची हजेरी लक्षणीय आहे.

नवनव्या अभ्यासकांचा शोध आणि त्यांच्याही लेखनाला युगवाणीत मिळणारे स्थान लक्षणीय आहे. राम ढोके, इमुंमती शेवडे, श.बा. शास्त्री, ना.रा. शेंडे, वामन चोरघडे, योगेंद्र मेश्राम, मनोहर तल्हार, डॉ. विश्वेश्वर सावदेकर अशी कथालेखकांची नावे युगवाणीच्या आरंभापासून दिसतात. हीच युगवाणीच्या निरालस साहित्य प्रेमाची आणि उज्ज्वल वाङ् मयोपासनेची फलश्रुती ठरेल.

विदर्भ साहित्य संघाला १४ जानेवारी २०२३ ला १०० वर्ष पूर्ण झाले. यानिमित्त वर्षभर विविध साहित्यिक कार्यक्रमांचे आयोजन करण्यात आले.

It works in the direction of boosting students' interest in finance on campus and also helps to indulge students through competitions, workshops, and professional opportunities from the corporate world. Details of the Activities Conducted:

The main aim of setting up a commerce lab is to facilitate students an environment for

making experiments of theories and economics laws. To create such environment, the lab has conducted following activities during the academic session 2021-2022:

In alignment with the sustainable development goals, zero waste, clean and green environment, Shivam and Nitya from M.Com. department presented an idea of recycling of glass waste into sand, thus solving the problem of non-recyclable glass waste which takes millions of years to decompose. With this unique idea their model has been shortlisted to represent RTM Nagpur University at State Level.

At the State Level they have secured 3rd Rank in Commerce, Management and Law Category in PG Level at 15th Avishkar: Maharashtra State Inter-University Research Convention.

b) **Live Screening of Union Finance Budget 2023:** Live session of Union Finance Budget 2023 is screened during the online session to the students, and they are asked to prepare a short video about their interpretations about the Finance Budget 2023.

About 50 students and various faculty members attended the event.

c) **Session on Budget Analysis:** Post Budget Session was organized by the members of The Economics Society for the students and faculties.

In the beginning of the event, Principal, Dr. S. S. Kathaley addressed the gathering. Then, the members of Economic Society made a brief presentation on highlights of Union Budget 2022. The short quiz on Union Budget 2022 was also conducted for the audience during the session.

In the end, the role play activity was conducted for the students. During this event,

students are assigned the role of finance minister and they are asked to express their opinion on the Union Budget as finance ministers.

About 60 students participated in the event.

d) Commerce Crossword Competition: Members of The Economics Society have organized a Crossword Competition on the theme of various terms in Economics.

43 Students from various departments and courses participated in the Competition.

3) Arbitrageurs - The Investor's Club:

a) Investor's Awareness Programme: Investor's Club has organized an Investor's Awareness Programme in collaboration with National Stock Exchange for the students of various departments in an online mode on Google Meet platform for celebrating the occasion of World Investor Week 2022.

During the session CA Mitanshu Sethiya from National Stock Exchange interacted with students. He has explained various concepts such as savings and investments, mutual funds, stock markets, SCORES – a grievance redressal mechanism by SEBI etc. He has discussed various case studies from the real world to explain these concepts. At the end of the session, he also answered queries from students.

About 90 students participated during the session.

b) Informative Session on TRADE-A-THON: National Stock Exchange, Mumbai organizes TRADE-A-THON – A Nation wide Live Stock Trading competition at National level every year. In this competition, all the students and traders are invited across India for trading for whole week.

During the session, Prof. Akash S. Jain explained the motive and the format of the competition. Shivam Rohankar, President, Investor's Club and Pratham Banode, Secretary, Investors' Club has presented a brief presentation on the format and the mode of the competition. They have also addressed various queries from the students.

77 students participated in the session.

c) Inter-Class TRADE-A-THON organized by Investors' Club: The investors' club has organized an Inter-class TRADE-A-THON – A Live virtual trading competition for the students of various departments.

The competition was conducted on a mobile application for which a training session was conducted for participants before the competition.

During the competition, students are required to take virtual trades in live stock market from the virtual money allotted to each team in default by the mobile application. The team generating the highest profit would be declared as winner at the end of the trading session.

About 200 students participated in this competition.

d) Training of N-SMART Simulator: A webinar of Shri. Abhishek Dubey, Financial Coach & Trainer from NSE Ltd. for training of NSMART portal was organized in collaboration with National Stock Exchange (NSE) Academy for training the students for using the NSMART Simulator for participating in TRADE-A-THON - National Live Stock Trading Contest.

During the session Mr. Dubey explained how to use the NSMART Simulator for taking trades during the competition, how to settle the trades and the rules for taking trades in various segments during the competition.

23 students have attended the session and learned how to use NSMART Simulator for the TRADE-A-THON – A Nation wide Live Stock Trading Competition which was organized by National Stock Exchange, Mumbai on pan India level.

e) TRADE-A-THON by National Stock Exchange, Mumbai: The investors club has encouraged students to participate in “TRADE-A-THON” A National Live Stock Trading Contest organized by National Stock Exchange.

1 of them has been awarded as top trader from west zone and 4 students have been selected in top 100 contestants.

4) Triviatrrix – The Quiz Club:

a) Quiz on Securities Market Awareness: Some of the members of the investors and quiz club have participated in a Quiz on Securities Markets Awareness organized by Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) Investors Protection Fund.

3 students participated in the quiz.

Report on English Proficiency Course - 2022-2023

The English Proficiency Course was started in the session 2006-2007 and the syllabus drafted by the in-house members of the department with the following objectives:

1. To improve the listening, speaking, reading, writing skills of the students
2. As a supplement to the existing subject knowledge and to develop interest not as a subject but as a language
3. To focus on the speaking and listening skills
4. To enhance the language skills and make students employable

The current batch had 38 students registered and the certificate course is in collaboration with the RTM Nagpur University's Jeewan Shikshan Abhiyan.

It gives me immense pleasure to present the annual report of Certificate Course of GST for the academic year 2022-2023.

As per the letter received from Government of Maharashtra, Rashtriya Uchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) we started Certificate Course of GST for the final year students of our college from the session 2021-2022. The objective was to bridge the gap between demand and supply of skilled manpower to handle routine compliance work under GST.

The certificate course is offered as per model curriculum provided by the Government of Maharashtra, Rashtriya Uchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). The curriculum required 100 hours (53 hours of theory and 47 hours of practical) to complete it. All theory classes were conducted by the teachers of our college whereas practical classes were conducted by Shri Vaibhav Shukla, Tax Consultant.

The college received 60 applications from the students for enrollment but due to time constraints only 35 students finally enrolled and paid fees.
