G.S.College of Commerce & Economics, Nagpur, was founded by SM, Wardha in 1945. It is the first commerce college of Nagpur city and second of RTMNU and is known for its high academic standards, value-based education and ethical practices. Spread over a sprawling, eco-friendly campus in the heart of the city, it offers a wide range of programs from class XI, XII (Junior college/HSVC) to UG/PG/Ph.D; inclusive of 4 UG programs like B. Com, B. Com (Computer Applications), B. Com (Business Administration), B. Com (Finance & Accounts) and 2 PG programs of M.com and MBA. Apart from these core academic programs, it has designed around 23 different value-added short-term courses for imparting various skills to the students. For the overall holistic development and grooming of students, a number of platforms are provided to them inclusive of ECA, Sports, NCC, NSS, Commerce and Language study circle. Skill based grooming programs like GS-SUN, CPBFI train the students for internship and employment opportunities.

- Teaching Hours:** The college conducts its programmes in two shifts as per the following details:
 - Senior college** (all UG and PG programmes): 8:20 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
 - Junior college** (FY/SYJC & M.C.V.C): 8:20 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
- Office Hours:** The College office works from 10:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. However, changes may be made in these timings according to the needs of college and notifications from Government authorities. The College office functions on every Saturday.
- College Uniform:** To promote a feeling of oneness among students and for disciplinary reasons, the college has prescribed a uniform for its students of both Junior and Senior wings as described below:
Blue T-shirt with College Logo (Sr. College) and Grey T-Shirt with College Logo (Jr. College) / Black Jeans / Black Trouser ; Black Shoes & White Socks (For Both Boys & Girls). Leggings / Skintight / 3/4th / Sleeveless are not allowed.

General Rules / Norms For Admissions: Senior College (Grant-in-aid & No-Grant)

(A) Intake/Quotas/ Reservations etc.

The College has been accorded the status of "Hindi Linguistic Minority Institute" by the Government of Maharashtra.

As such, 50% seats of all grant-in-aid programmes viz. B.Com. (A & BR), B.Com (Mgt.), M. Com. (A & BR), and 51% seats of all no-grant programmes viz., B.Com. (Computer Applications), B.Com. (Business Administration) & B. Com. (Finance & Accountancy) are reserved for students from Hindi speaking communities as listed in the Eighth Schedule for Languages subject to the condition of domicile in Maharashtra State and on production of an affidavit on a Rs. 100/- stamp paper that they belong to the Hindi Speaking Communities as listed in the Eighth Schedule for languages in the Constitution of India. Students from other linguistic/religious minority can also apply against minority quota subject to vacancies in the Hindi minority quota. The rest of the seats are filled from among the candidates from non-Hindi speaking students with due reservation for various categories viz. SC/ST/VJNT/OBC-SBC / EWS etc. strictly on merit basis.

- Senior College Student (UG/PG) have to fill the prescribed Registration/Application Form for admission in online mode. The form will be available on the college website. Student should not use any unnumbered or photocopied form.
- Information furnished in the admission form must be true. Admission is liable to be cancelled if any information is found to be false and/or incorrect.

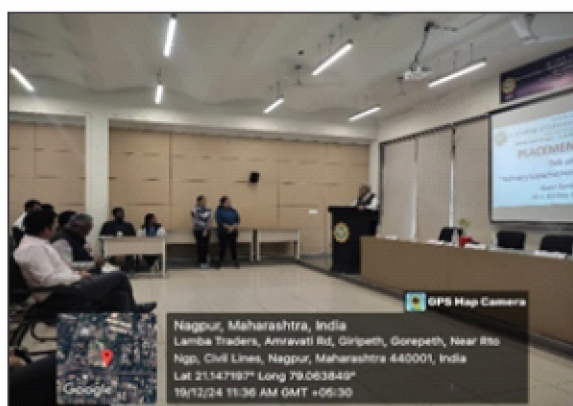
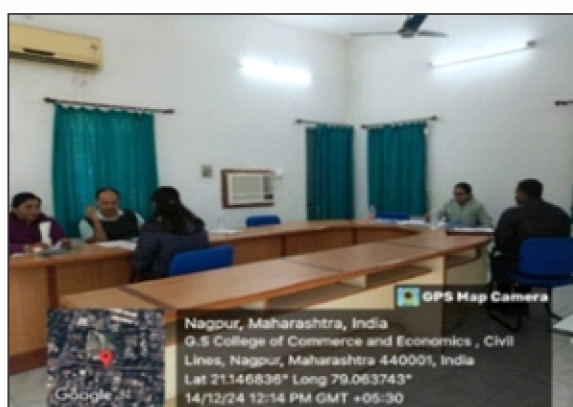
Career Guidance and Placement

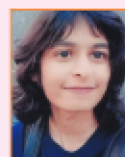

Important College Committees / Cells / Study Circles

The college has set up various college committees for the conduct of all curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities. Similarly, there are also committees to offer guidance/counseling to our students, or to redress their grievances. The committees are headed by teacher-conveners/coordinators. Students are advised to contact the conveners for participating in activities, or for any other queries related to their studentship and other problems.

- **Anti-Ragging/ Caste Discrimination / Grievance Redressal Cell:** As per the directives of the Supreme Court of India and the UGC, Ragging and Sexual Harassment are to be treated as crimes and thus punishable after prosecution. Students are advised to report any incidents of ragging or harassment or Caste Discrimination without any inhibition or fear to the Committee in person or on phone. **There is also a All-India Helpline (1-800-180-5522) for reporting crimes related to Ragging.**
- **Students Representative Council (SRC):** Every year, and as per the instructions and guidelines given by RTM Nagpur University, the college constitutes the SRC consisting of the class /activity representatives. These members elect from amongst themselves a College Representative to the University's Students Council. The SRC is responsible for the conduct of all extra-curricular activities like debate/ elocution/essay/cultural and other competitions and the annual festival 'Umang'.
- **Girls Guidance and Counselling / Internal Complaints Committee:** This committee is constituted to solve the girl students' academic and personal problems through proper counselling. The committee also organizes special interaction sessions by lady doctors, professionals/entrepreneurs etc. for counseling the girls on health and hygiene or proper careers. There is also separate Internal Complaints Committee to deal with the sexual harassment issues.
There is also a Police Helpline (1091) for reporting cases of Sexual Harassment.
- **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):** Our college has always been quality conscious and has, after its first accreditation in 2003, set up an IQAC. The IQAC has for its members the representatives of our management and academicians who plan for an all-round development of the college.
- **College Examinations/Internal Assessment Committee:** The college puts premium on the continuous internal assessment of our students. This committee plans and organizes all internal examinations and viva-voce. Students are advised to watch out for examination schedules/notices as issued by the Committee. The college has also set up a separate Autonomy Examination mechanism.
- **Career Guidance and Placement Cell:** This Cell guides the students for choosing the right career and also gives information about the employment opportunities in business and industry. It organizes seminars and Guest lectures to apprise students of emerging professional trends and events, job profiles, leadership roles, entrepreneurship, market needs and risks, national socio-economic policies etc. It also organizes sessions for soft skills and campus interviews. In the past, our students have got placements in reputed companies like J.P. Morgan Chase, Progeon Infosys, Birla Group, Mahindra Finance, Ambuja Cement, TCS, L&T, KEC, Muthoot Finance, Wipro, Concentrix etc.
- **Student Mentorship Scheme:** This scheme is intended to establish a close rapport between students and teachers who act as mentors for a batch of select students from their entry to exit from the college.
- **Student Feedback/ Parent-Teacher Meet Committee:** The college has got a very active feedback mechanism. The feedback collected from all stakeholders is used for formulating academic and administrative policies. We also conduct Parent-Teacher Meets to get feedback from parents and for sharing with them their wards' progress.
- **College Magazine Committee:** The college publishes every year an in-house magazine "Rashtradhan". It is meant to be a documentation of our students' creative talents as well as the reflection of their thoughts and views on various economic, social, and political issues in the country. Students are expected to contribute to the magazine with their original write-ups instead of resorting to plagiarized material which will be rejected.
- **Shiksha Mandal Guidance Bureau:** In order to apprise our students of the new and latest developments in different fields of Commerce, Economy, Banking, Insurance, Finance etc, Shiksha Mandal has set up a Guidance Bureau. The Bureau also guides students about the opportunities, potential, and latest information, knowledge and techniques pertaining to various subjects beyond those covered by syllabus.
- **Student Welfare / Counselling Cell:** The College offers various welfare schemes in the form of scholarships and aids. Students willing to avail these schemes should contact the Professor-in-charge/Mentors for details. Students are also advised to approach the Cell for solving their problems through professional counselling. The Cell also ensures that provisions contained in UGC (Promotion of Equity in Higher Education Institutes) Regulations, 2012 are observed in spirit and letter by all the stakeholders of the college.

Place of Higher Learning and Research

The College is a recognized 'Place of Higher Learning and Research' affiliated to RTM Nagpur University offering Ph.D. program in the faculty of commerce in subjects of Business Economics, Commerce and Management. The aspiring Ph.D. scholars avail the following facilities:

- A well-equipped Library with over 50,000 books and facilities of N-List, J-Gate and Knimbus providing access to over 1,00,000 e-books and e-journals.
- A Network Resource Centre (NRC)/ SPSS Software.
- Research Methodology workshops, Guest lectures etc.
- Three Research Scholars have been awarded Ph.D. while few are pursuing.

Interested students who wish to enroll for Ph.D. Course should contact the 'Place of Higher Learning & Research' for further details.

GS-Skill Upgradation Network (GS-SUN)

The College has introduced from the session 2013-14, a special skill-building programme for students of Senior College called as the 'GS Skill Upgradation Network - GS- SUN'. The training programme has the following objectives:

- To provide students with practical training by exposing them to the Business/Industry through a network of Alumni.
- To enable students to get a first-hand feel of Job complexities in the competitive world outside.
- To groom students to acquire Communication and ICT skills. The Programme is implemented in the following phases:

A) Pre-internship grooming: Since students selected for internships will have to spend minimum of 1 year with professionals/corporate, they must be given a pre-internship training to acquire those skills which are the prerequisite qualifications for a good internship programme. We therefore conduct a six-month Grooming Programme at the UG level for all Part I students. This involves training to acquire communication skills and proficiency in ICT, computerized accounting, e-filing of all tax returns, and a 7-days workshop for the internship, etc. This training will help students learn more once they are in actual internships. Students selected for this programme have to deposit Rs. 3000/- towards registration and caution money. Caution money of Rs. 2000/- is refunded to them only after the successful completion of their internship terms.

B) Practical training/internship: Those students who successfully complete the Grooming Programme are shortlisted for an internship. The duration of practical training/internship is spread over 1 and a half years i.e. two sessions of Part-II and Part-III. The timings for internship terms will be from 1.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. Students may also be offered stipends from their respective firms/offices.

C) Placements: All those student-internees who successfully complete their internship terms may be absorbed by their respective employers. The college also recommends the names of deserving candidates to reputed companies for placements during campus recruitment.

Department of Management Sciences and Research (DMSR)

Under the aegis of Shiksha Mandal, Wardha the college started a two-year (four-semester) MBA (Autonomous) programme in the year 1987 on self-financing basis affiliated to the RTM Nagpur University, Department of Technical Education, Government of Maharashtra, and AICTE.

In tune with the vision of a skilled India, the department with its competent infrastructure and experienced faculties aims at providing structured skill qualification programme aligned with existing and emerging job roles in industry and other sectors.

The department through its placement drives regularly place students in top companies across India.

JUNIOR COLLEGE & MCVC: SYLLABI/FEE STRUCTURES/ OTHER INFORMATION

(A) Intake/Quotas/ Reservations

The college runs a full-fledged Junior College (FYJC and SYJC) in Commerce in English, Hindi and Marathi Medium, from 1975 and also a wing for H. Sc. (Vocational)/MCVC in English medium. The college enjoys a phenomenal track record in terms of results and merit positions. We also offer to our students wide range of extra-curricular activities including NSS and NCC.

The College has been accorded the status of "Hindi Linguistic Minority Institute" by the Government of Maharashtra. As per the provisions, a Linguistic Minority Institute has to reserve 50% seats in all Grant-in-aid sections for students belonging to the Hindi Minority Communities as listed in the Eighth Schedule for Languages subject to the condition of domicile in the State of Maharashtra and on production of an affidavit on a Rs. 100/- stamp paper that they belong to the Hindi Speaking Communities as listed in the Eighth Schedule for Languages. The rest of the seats will be filled from among the candidates from non-Hindi speaking students with due reservation for various categories viz. SC/ST/VJNT/OBC-SBC strictly on merit basis.

DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

- Each student must report to the college in the prescribed uniform and wear without fail the identity card. A student without Uniform and Identity Card will not be allowed inside the premises.
- Students must remain present in their respective classes at the prescribed timings.
- It is mandatory for all students to have minimum 75% attendance in every subject in order to be eligible for appearing in the College Final Examinations. In case a student has to remain absent for long period for whatever reasons, the student or their parent/guardian must intimate the college in writing and seek permission for the intended absence. Fine will be imposed on students not fulfilling the minimum 75% attendance criteria.
- All students of both Junior and Senior College are required to appear for all unit tests/ terminal examinations, viva-voce, and also submit, whenever required, home assignments, projects etc. for their internal assessment.
- It is mandatory for students to complete their coursework including unit tests/terminal examination/home assignments/projects etc. The students failing to comply with the above shall lose their internal assessment marks.
- Students are to note that Internal Assessment marks are given on the basis of attendance, performance in test examinations, home assignments, viva-voce, discipline and participation/ performance in the college activities.
- All students must participate in extra-curricular activities like NCC or NSS or Sports or other events organized by the College/University from time to time. Students get incentive marks/credits for their participation in such activities.
- It is mandatory for students to appear for the Physical Efficiency Test and Medical Check-up/Test conducted by the college/University. Those who fail to appear in these tests will have to pay fine of Rs.100/- for each test.
- Elections for sending a representative to the University Students Council shall be held as per the provisions and directives from RTM Nagpur University.
- Only those activities/ events/ programmes which are approved by the College/University will be organized.
- Students are expected to maintain a quiet and congenial atmosphere in the college. Any student disturbing the atmosphere shall be liable for strict disciplinary action.
- When teaching work is going on, loitering in corridors, individually or in groups, is strictly prohibited. In case of off periods, students are advised to spend time in the Library/ Reading Room.
- Students shall not bring or invite their friends to college. Such visitors may be prosecuted for trespassing.
- Students shall not use mobile phones while in classrooms/ college library/and offices. While on campus, students must keep their phones on silent mode. Any student found using the smart phone or talking on phone in classroom/library/lab/corridors will have to pay the fine of Rs. 500/-.
- Students found to be indulging in activities which are not in the interest of the college and which are detrimental to the smooth functioning of the college shall be appropriately punished.
- Every student shall make proper use of college buildings, furniture, equipment, electricity/water and other facilities. Any student found guilty of causing damage or disfigurement to the college property, or found guilty of sticking posters on walls, or writing unwarranted things on the blackboards, will be straightway expelled, and the cost of damage to property will be recovered from him. Other general losses and damage to the college property shall be assessed at the end of the session and recovered from students of all classes collectively.
- All important notices, instructions etc. are put up on the College Notice Boards/ College website. Students should make a habit of visiting the Notice Boards/website regularly for important instructions and announcements.
- No student shall approach the Print or Electronic media for matters pertaining to the college without prior approval of the Principal. Any breach of this rule will lead to disciplinary action against the concerned student.
- A student suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall not attend college. He/she will report only after declared medically fit, and on production of Medical Fitness Certificate by a Registered Physician.
- Students should inform the college authorities in writing about any change in permanent or local address, or phone number.
- Consumption of alcohol, smoking, chewing tobacco, or consuming tobacco related products on campus is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in the same will be fined and, if necessary, expelled from the college.
- **Ragging or similar such act causing physical or mental agony to fellow students will be treated as a criminal offence and students found to be indulging in the same will be liable for prosecution.**
- **Sexual Harassment in any form will not be tolerated and those involved shall be liable for prosecution.**
- **Students also shall not engage in any act of discrimination against fellow students on the basis of caste, gender, creed, colour, race, religion, place of birth, political conviction, language, and disability.**
(No cases of Ragging or Sexual Harassment or Discrimination etc. have been reported during the last academic session.)

The above rules are subject to change, modification, addition, omission, or alteration as and when the authorities deem it fit and proper. The decision of the Principal in this regard will be final and binding on all students.
